The Utility is further subject to all Rules and Regulations of the Commission even though not contained herein.

REVISIONS

Doe Valley Utilities, Inc.

These Rules and Regulations may be revised, amended, supplemented or otherwise changed from time to time subject to approval of the Public Service Commission, and shall have the same force as the present Rules and Regulations.

SERVICE AREA

The Utility furnishes water service to Doe Valley Subdivision loacated at Doe Valley near Brandenburg, Kentucky in Meade County, Kentucky.

AVAILABILITY

Water service is available to any domestic, commercial or industrial consumer withing the Utility's area.

WATER FAILURE:

The Utility is responsible for water fairure only when in control of the Utility's employees. No consumer is paid damages for equipment unless such damages are specifically found to be caused by an act of negligence on the part of the Utility or its employees.

PROTECTION BY CONSUMER

Consumer shall protect the equipment of the Utility on his premises and shall not interfere with Utility's property or permit interference except by duly authorized the SERVICE COMMISSION of the Utility.

LINE RELOCIATIONS

When necessary to move or relocate facilities, the cost will be paid by party or parties requesting such relocation.

BILLING, COLLECTION, PENALTIES

Bills for water service furnished by the water system will be mailed no later than the 5th day of each month and will be due and payable within 10 days. A 10% late payment penalty charge will be applicable after the due date of any account.

DEPOSITS

The Utility may require a deposit of \$30.00 (not to exceed 2/12 of the estimated annual bill). Interest will accrue on the deposit at the rate of 6% and will be refunded on an annual basis, unless the customer's bill is delinquent on the anniversary date of the deposit.

DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVCIE BY UTILITY

Doe Valley Utilities. Inc.

The Utility may refuse or discontinue service to an applicant or customer, after proper notices, for failure ot comply with its rules and regulations or state and municipal rules and regulations, when a customer or applicant refuses or neglects to provide reasonable access to the premises, for fraudulent or illegal use of service, or for nonpayment of bills. If discontinuance is for non-payment for bills, the customer shall be given at least five (5) days written notice, separate from the original bill, and cut-off shall be effected not less than twenty (20) days after the mailing date of the original bill unless, prior to discontinuance, a residential customer presents to the utility a written certificate, signed by a physician, registered nurse, or public health officer, that such dicontinuance will aggravate an existing illness or infirmity on the affected premises in which case discontinuance may not be effected until the affected resident can make other living arrangements or until not less than ten (10) days elapse from the date of the Utility's notification. When a dangerous condition is found to exist on the customer's or applicant's premises, the service shall be cut off without notice or refused.

There will be a \$15.00 charge to reconnect the service.

WATER SHORTAGE RESPONSE PLAN

DOE VALLEY UTILITIES WATER DISTRICT

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Plan is to provide for the declaration of official phases of water supply shortages and the implementation of voluntary and mandatory water conservation measures throughout the DOE VALLEY UTILITIES WATER DISTRICT in the event a shortage is declared.

Section 2. Definitions. These terms are applicable only for this Plan unless specifically noted.

- (a) "Customer" shall mean any person or entity using water for any purpose from the DOE VALLEY UTILITIES WATER DISTRICT water distribution system and for which either a regular charge is made or, in the case of bulk sales, a cash charge is made at the site of delivery.
- (b) "Raw Water Supplies" shall mean all water potentially available to persons in the DOE VALLEY UTILITIES WATER DISTRICT
- "Treated Water" shall mean water that has b introduced by the DOE VALLEY UTILITIES WATER DISTRICT (c) been into its water distribution system, including water offered for sale. Uses of treated water are classified as follows:

"Advisory" shall mean that conditions exist which indicate the potential for serious raw or treated water supply shortages.

"Alert" shall mean the raw or treated water supplies are consistently below seasonal averages, and if they continue to decline, may not be adequate to meet normal needs.

"Emergency" shall mean that raw or treated water supplies are below the level necessary to meet normal needs and that serious shortages exist in the area.

(h) "Rationing" shall mean that procedures must be established to provide for the equitable distribution of critically-limited raw or treated water supplies, in order to balance demand and limited available supplies, and to assure that sufficient water is available to preserve public health and safety.

Section 3. Applicability. The provisions of this Plan shall apply to all retail and wholesale customers of the <u>DOE</u> <u>VALLEY UTILITIES WATER DISTRICT</u> When implemented, this Plan becomes DV UT WATER DISTRICT Water Shortage Response Regulation.

Section 4. Entitlements. Entitlements shall be established for each customer by adjusting the base entitlement to reflect any C known change in usage pattern.

Section 5. Determination of Water Shortage. Water supply and usage shall be monitored on a continuous basis. Unrestricted demand shall be projected from past records and adjusted for changes such as new developments and weather conditions on a regular basis. (Note: A sample calculation page is attached as Appendix A to assist in determining overall water levels. It is important that accurate water measurements be used.) Water shortages generally occur for two reasons, a reduction in available supplies or a system failure. Each of these has a distinct influence on the nature and duration of the conservation program implemented. Official declaration of a water shortage stage and implementation of the measures necessary to curtail water use shall be approved by the <u>DOE VALLEY UTILITIES</u>. WATER DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS

Section 6. Term of Water Shortage Declaration. Any water shortage declaration shall remain in effect until water supplies of service conditions have returned to normal. A final determination as to terminating a water shortage declaration shall be made by the <u>COMMISSIONERS</u> of <u>D.V.U.W.D.</u> Section 7. Water Shortage Stage, Criteria, Conservation and Curtailment Measures.

- A. Advisory Stage:
 - (1) <u>Criteria</u>: A water advisory shall be declared when the amount of treated water or raw water available for treatment is projected to be up to 20% below demand, or there are periods of low water pressure in one or more areas of the distribution system due to system failure or inadequacies or the State Division of Water issues a Water Shortage Watch which includes the areas from which the <u>DOE VALLEY</u> <u>UTILITIES WATER DISTRICT</u> draws water. (Note: Additional conditions may be added based on local conditions.)

Section 8. Enforcement of Water Restriction. Any person who violates the provisions of this Plan, who fails to carry out the duties and responsibilities imposed by this Plan, or who impedes or interferes with any action undertaken or ordered pursuant to this Plan shall be subject to the following:

- (a) If the utility official charged with implementation and enforcement of this Plan learns of any violation of any water use restriction imposed, a written notice of the violation shall be affixed to the property where the violation occurred and mailed to the customer of record. Said notice shall describe the violation and order that it be corrected, cured, or abated immediately or within 48 hours.
- The notice will inform the customer of his or her right (b) to appeal by requesting a hearing before the utility's designee. If a hearing is requested by the customer, he or she shall be given full opportunity to be heard

before termination. The governing body shall make findings of fact and decide whether service should costinue or terminate.

- (c) Any customer whose water service is terminated for violating provisions of this water curtailment plan shall be subject to the approved reconnection fee prior to reconnection of service.
- (d) The excess usage charge billing provisions of this Plan shall not be put in effect if a county or city ordinance containing penalty provisions is in effect to assist enforcement of this Plan.

Section 9. Request for Exception.

(a) Exception to water use restrictions: If compliance with any curtailment measure authorized herein would cause a customer to bear extraordinary hardship, that individual or entity may apply to the <u>DOE VALLEY UTILITIES</u> <u>WATER DISTRICT</u> for an exception. For these purposes, "extraordinary hardship" shall be defined as a condition which may threaten health and safety, or cause property or economic losses, each of which must be shown to be substantially more severe than the sacrifices borne by other users. If extraordinary hardship is found to exist, then an exception shall be granted and a written waiver issued to the customer. If an appeal is made, water service shall be continued until a decision is announced. Any person aggrieved by the decision may file a complaint with the Public Service Commission.

(b) Exception to curtailment surcharge: Exceptions to excess use charges shall not be considered or granted.

Section 10. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Plan is declared invalid by the courts, the remainder of the Plan and its 6/50/2004 applicability to other persons and circumstances shall not be affected by that declaration.

Section 11. Effective Date. This Plan shall take effect immediately upon approval by the Public Service Commission.
