RULES AND REGULATIONS

A. GENERAL:

The following rules and regulations, in conjunction with regulations of the Kentucky Public Service Commission, shall constitute the basis for management and operation of the waterworks system in an equitable manner to all members. A member, herein, shall mean a water customer or user who has paid the designated tap-on fee and is in good standing.

B. CONDITIONS FOR SERVICE:

1. Any resident or business within the service area is eligible for membership and water service. Each new member shall execute a Contract for Water Services, and a Membership Certificate shall be executed in his name.
2. A tap-on fee (as set out in the Classification of Service), to cover the cost of the meter setting and the service line from the main to the meter, shall be paid by each member. The meter size shall be determined by the Association.
3. All services shall be metered and each individual member or customer shall have a separate meter with the following exceptions:
 - a. Where more than one dwelling unit is located on a single lot or parcel, one meter may be used to serve a maximum of two dwelling units. The total use registered by the meter each month shall be divided by the number of units being served and each unit shall pay the rate for his pro-rata share as an individual user.
 - b. For an apartment building or a commercial trailer park (three or more dwelling units), where a single meter is used, the total use registered by the meter each month shall be divided by the number of units (whether occupied or not) and each unit shall pay its pro-rata share as an individual user.

c. The Association shall determine the size of the meter necessary to provide adequate service for the above multiple services on the following basis.

<u>Size</u>	<u>Maximum Gallonage</u>	<u>Number of Units</u>
5/8" x 3/4"	20 gpm	1 to 4
3/4"	30 gpm	5 to 6
1"	50 gpm	7 to 13
1 1/2"	100 gpm	14 to 33
2"	160 gpm	34 to 65

4. A deposit of \$25.00 shall be made to the Association for water service to rental property (residents, mobile home or other) to assure payment of the bill.
5. The Association shall not furnish free water to any person or organization for any purpose.
6. No customer shall resell water except under the terms of a special agreement with the Association.
7. The member shall be responsible for all plumbing installed on his property beginning at the outlet side of the meter. This installation shall be in accordance with these rules and regulations and with those of the local Health Department and the Kentucky DNREP.
8. Existing water systems (private wells) shall be physically disconnected from the supply from the Association to prevent cross-connections and/or backflow. No type of interconnection shall be allowed.
9. No connection to the water main of the Association shall be made except by or under the supervision of a duly authorized officer, agent or employee of the Association.
10. Members shall provide a location for the meter setting which is unobstructed, accessible and not subject to damage.

- 11. On request of a member, meters shall be changed or verified for accuracy. If said meter is found to be accurate, within 2 per cent, the member shall pay a \$25.00 meter test charge. If found to be greater than 2 per cent fast or slow, no test charge shall be made and a charge or credit, in compliance with URC regulations for bill adjustment, shall be made.

C. FIRE HYDRANTS:

- 1. Fire hydrants are for use in fighting fires and for emergency only and there shall be no charge to members for such service.
- 2. Nonmembers shall pay \$100 for fire hydrant service for each fire or emergency.
- 3. Only firemen and Association personnel are authorized to use or operate fire hydrants.

D. METER READING, BILLING AND COLLECTION:

- 1. The person(s) in whose name the Membership Certificate is prepared, shall be responsible for payment of all bills and service charges made to his service.
- 2. Water bills (service charges) shall be paid monthly for the water used the previous month. Charges shall be at the current rate as shown in the Classification of Service, to which sales or use taxes shall be added.
- 3. For new services, commencing within 10 days prior to the time for reading meters, the first bill shall not become due until the following month.
- 4. Meters shall be read on the first of each month (billing date) and payment is due by the 10th of the month. A penalty of 10 per cent shall be added to any payment made after the 15th of the month.
- 5. Delinquent notices shall be mailed by the 20th of the month and if payment is not received, service shall be discontinued on the first of the following month with a 48 hour prior written notice.
- 6. If applicable, a \$15.00 fee will be charged to read a meter and/or collect prior to disconnection.

- 7. Failure to receive delinquent notices does not relieve a member from being delinquent and subject to suspension of service.
- 8. A \$25.00 fee shall be charged for reconnection of a member's meter or service.
- 9. There shall be no charge for transferring the membership of a user provided service and monthly billing are uninterrupted.

E. PENALTIES AND TERMINATION OF SERVICE:

- 1. If service is discontinued for nonpayment, it shall not be restored until payment is made in full for the delinquent water bill plus penalties and the reconnection fee.
- 2. Service may be voluntarily disconnected at the request of a member in good standing by at least 3 days prior notice. To have the service restored, the \$25.00 reconnection fee must be paid.
- 3. The Association shall have the right to discontinue service for violations or infractions of any of the rules and regulations herein.
- 4. Additional causes for penalties and/or termination of service are:
 - a. Tampering with a water meter or other measuring device.
 - b. Tampering with a fire hydrant.
 - c. Unauthorized use or sale of water.
 - d. Cross-connections or piping which would cause backflow.
 - e. Unauthorized taps or extension of mains.
 - f. Damage to any Association facilities.
 - g. Willfully falsifying meter readings or records.
 - h. Fraud or abuse.
 - i. Repeated delinquency of payments.

F. EXTENSIONS OF MAINS:

The Association shall pay for up to 50 feet of an extension to the existing distribution system for each customer who will guarantee to contract for water service for a minimum of one year. The guarantee shall consist of a deposit, with the Association, of one year's average water bill which shall be applied to the customer's monthly service charge until used up. This shall only apply for each actual water user and all excess footage shall be paid for by the applicant (individual, group, developer).

The applicant shall deposit, with the Association, the total estimated cost of the extension, which after completion shall be adjusted to the actual cost, and the Association shall pay its share (up to 50 feet) for each actual user where a tap-on fee is paid and a meter is set.

Where an applicant has paid for excessive footage, each year he shall be reimbursed for the cost of 50 feet of main for each additional customer connected during the year whose service line is directly connected to the extension and not to extensions or laterals therefrom. The refund (reimbursement) period shall be for ten years, after which no refund shall be made. In no case shall the total amount refunded exceed the total cost of the extension and no interest shall be included or paid.

1. Extension Cost:

The total cost of the extension shall include engineering, construction, testing, disinfecting, water, and inspection. This total cost of the extension divided by the length of the extension shall establish the cost per foot as a basis for reimbursement.

2. Extension Requirements:

a. Application:

Any person(s) wanting to make an extension to the waterworks system shall contact the Board of Directors for preliminary consideration and for instructions and agreements concerning procedures. The application for an extension shall be made in the name of only one person who shall be responsible for compliance with any conditions and to whom the Association shall make reimbursements. This authorized representative shall be responsible for distribution of the reimbursement to others, if applicable.

b. Easements and Rights-of-Way:

It shall be the responsibility of the applicant to furnish all easements and rights-of-way for construction of the extension on private property. Easements shall be located a minimum of 25 feet from the centerline of the street or road and shall be a minimum of 12 feet in width. Easement agreements shall be made on the Association's standard form.

Permits for highway and road crossings shall be obtained by the Association and the cost (if any) shall be included in the extension cost.

c. Plans and Specifications:

Plans and specifications for the proposed extension shall be prepared by the Association's Engineer and shall comply with the Association's standards in all respects. All extensions shall comply with and be approved by the Kentucky DNREP, Kentucky PSC and other applicable Federal, State and local regulating agencies.

d. Design:

All extensions to the system shall be designed to form an integral part of the over-all distribution system and for fire flows throughout. Except in special cases, the minimum main size shall be 6 inches and the maximum distance between fire hydrants (as measured by road) shall be 1,000 feet. All intersecting lines shall be valved, and loops or grids shall be completed where possible. All deadends shall have a provision for flushing.

e. Inspection:

All extensions or additions shall have resident supervision and inspection of construction by the Association's Engineer or designated representative.

f. Record Plans:

After completion of construction, reproducible record plans for inclusion with the Association's master set shall be prepared by the Association's Engineer.

g. Temporary Extensions:

Extensions of mains smaller than specified for the basic network shall not be permitted for other than temporary service and shall be paid for entirely by the developer.

3. Construction:

Construction of the extension shall be by the Association. Minor or short extensions shall be performed under the Association's Major Maintenance Agreement and larger or major extensions may be let for bids. All materials and work are subject to approval by the Association who shall furnish inspection of any extension.

4. Ownership:

All extensions or additions to the system, regardless of location or financial consideration, shall be the property of the Massac Water Association, Inc., who shall operate and maintain the extension as an integral part of the entire system. All of the Association's rules and regulations shall apply to the extension and the Association shall exercise complete control and authority over the extension and any extensions thereto.

5. Other Arrangements:

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prohibit the Association from making extensions under different arrangements acceptable to the Kentucky Public Service Commission.
