SUBJECT: CHARGES FOR SPECIAL SERVICES.
The following charges for special services shall be made:

1. Service Reconnection Charge: A charge of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be made for all service reconnections made during normal office hours, except that there shall be no connection charges made for service on the original installation of facilities. If service is reconnected other than during normal office hours, the charge shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00). The reconnection charge shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) if the serviceman does not have to visit the premises to turn on or to read the meter.

2. Meter Reading Recheck Charge: A charge of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be made for a trip to recheck a meter reading when a customer requests the meter to be rechecked for a correct reading and the meter was not misread, however if the meter has been misread then there will be no charge and the customer's account will be adjusted accordingly.

3. Meter Test Request: Upon written request and payment of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), a customer may have his meter tested provided the request by the customer is not more frequent than once each twelve (12) months. If such test shows the meter to be more than two percent (2%) fast, a refund of the twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) charge shall be made to the customer and their bill adjusted accordingly.

4. PSC Meter Test Complaint: Any customer of the Company may request a meter test by written application to the Commission. After first obtaining a test from the utility in accordance with 807 KAR 5:006, Section 18(2).

5. Service Investigation Charge: A charge of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per trip shall be made for service investigation during normal office hours, if the interruption of service is not caused by a failure of the Company's facilities. The charge for investigation after normal office hours will be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per trip. Any repair and maintenance of facilities beyond the Company's delivery point is the responsibility of the customer.

6. There is a returned check fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00).

II. Service Application.

- A. Any bona fide occupant of a single family dwelling; or to each residential unit in an auto court, duplex, or multiple dwelling building; or person holding property having reasonable accessibility to the source of and who is in need of having water supplied to his place of occupancy or property may be a customer of the company by signing such agreements for the purchase of water as may be provided and required by the company. Extension of service will be made in accordance 807 KAR 5:066, Section 11.
 - a. A plumbing permit issued by the State Dept. of Health must be presented upon request for new meter service. This permit may be obtained at the Health Department at 500 Bourne Avenue Somerset, Kentucky on Monday, Wednesday, or Friday between the hours of 8:30 AM and 9:30 AM.
- B. The Company may reject any application, when the applicant is delinquent in payment of bills incurred for service previously supplied at any location.
- C. Violation of any of the provisions of these rules, by-laws or any other regulation of the Company, when in accordance with 807 KAR 5:006 Section 14, the Company may remove the meter and discontinue service. Where the meter is thereafter reinstalled, the member shall first pay to the Company a reconnection charge. The Company may require of any or from any applicant a deposit of an amount equal to 2/12 of the average annual bill for the category of service for which the applicant requests service.
- D. The individual in whose name the water contract is prepared shall be responsible for payment of all bills incurred in connection with the service rendered.
- E. Any customer desiring service discontinued or changed from one address to another shall give the utility a minimum of three working (3) days' notice in writing or by telephone in accordance with 807 KAR 5:006 Section 12(1), provided such notice does not violate contractual obligations. Upon request that service be reconnected at any premises subsequent to the initial installation or connection to its service lines, the utility may charge the applicant a service charge.

III. Initial or Minimum Charges.

- A. The flat minimum monthly rate, as set up in the water rate schedule for the company, will be payable irrespective of whether any water is used by the member during any month.
- B. A reconnection charge may be made by the company each time reconnection is necessary; however, the monthly rate cannot be charged during the period of discontinuance.
- C. A Tap fee shall be made for each new meter installation where a 5/8 or 3/4 inch meter is used. However the meter must be set on the customer's property or 50' away from the main which ever is closest.
- D. Water furnished for a given lot, farmstead or residence shall be used for that lot, farmstead or residence only. Each customer's service must be separately metered at a single delivery and metering point. All commercial use, including storerooms and stalls for business purposes shall be metered separately from any residential use, and vice versa.
- E. In addition to the collection of regular rates, the Company may collect from the customer a proportionate share of any privilege, sales, or use tax or impositions, based on gross revenue received by the Company.

IV. Company's Responsibility

- A. The Company will install, maintain and operate a main distribution pipeline or lines from the source of water supply, and service lines from the main distribution line or lines to the property line of each customer of the Company at which points, designated as delivery points, meters to be purchased, installed, owned and maintained by the Company, shall be placed. The meter will be placed (in accordance with 807 KAR 5:066 Section 12). The cost of the service line or lines from the main distribution line or lines of the Company to the property line of each customer shall be paid by the Company, however the Company may collect an amount approved by the Board of Commissioners, and Public Service Commission in accordance with 807 KAR 5:006 Section 8. The Company will also purchase and install a cut-off valve in each service line from its main distribution line or lines, such cut-off valve to be owned and maintained by the Company and to be installed on same portion of the service line owned by the Company. The Company shall have the sole and exclusive right to use of such cut-off valve to turn service on and off. The Company may also install a valve on the Customer's side of the meter, however maintenance and installation cost of this valve will be the responsibility of the Customer, this valve shall be the responsibility of the customer to turn-off and turn-on their water service.

B. Each customer shall be entitled to not to exceed one (1) service line from the Company's water system unless otherwise approved by the Board of Directors and provided that the customer shall be required to pay the prevalent tap fee for each service line. No new service line or change in an existing service line may be made which will interfere with an existing service line or the delivery of water therein. Each service line shall connect with the company's water system at the nearest available place to the place of desired use by the customer if the Company's water system shall be of sufficient capacity to permit the delivery of water through a service line at the place without interfering with the delivery of water through a prior service line. If the Company's water system shall be inadequate to permit the delivery of water through a service line installed at such place without interfering with the delivery of water through a prior service line, then such service line shall be installed at such place as may be required to dig or have dug a ditch, to purchase and install, and maintain such portion of the service line or lines from the property line of the customer to his own dwelling; or other place of use on his premises at his own expense, provided that the Company may, if the Board of Directors so elect, purchase the pipe for and install such portion of such service line or lines, the cost of which will, however, be paid by the individual customers.

V. Company's Liability.

- A. The Company reserves the right to refuse service unless the customer's line or piping are installed in such manner as to prevent cross-connections or back-flow.
- B. The Company shall not be liable for damage of any kind whatsoever resulting from water or the use of water on the customer's premises, unless such damage results directly from negligence on the part of the Company. The Company shall not be responsible for any damage done or by resulting from any defects in piping, fixtures, or appliance on the customer's premises. The Company shall not be responsible for negligence of the third persons, or forces beyond the control of the Company resulting in any interruption of service.
- C. Under normal conditions, the customers will be notified of any anticipated interruptions of service in accordance with 807 KAR 5:066 Section 4(2).
- D. Under emergency conditions, the customers may or may not be notified of an interruption of service.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- F. The Company may at any time shut off the water in the mains in case of accident, or for the purpose of making connections, alterations, repairs, changes, or for other reasons, and may restrict the use of water to serve a sufficient supply in its reservoirs for public fire service or other emergencies whenever the public welfare may require it.
- G. The temporary shutting off of water from any premises for any cause, whether non-payment of bills, leaking pipes, fixtures, etc. shall not cancel a contract for water supply service except at the option of the Company or upon notice from the Customer.
- H. The Company shall not in any way or under any circumstances be held liable or responsible to any person or persons for any loss or damage from any excess or deficiency in the pressure, volume, or supply of water, due to any cause whatsoever. The Company will undertake to use reasonable care and diligence in order to prevent and avoid interruptions and fluctuations in the service, but it cannot and does not guarantee that such will not occur.
- I. The Company will make every effort to maintain a pressure on the distribution system that is required by the Public Service Commission, but it does not guarantee to furnish at all times any given quantity for fire uses or for general purposes.
- J. The Company shall not be responsible for accidents or damages to boilers, hot water tanks, etc., resulting from the discontinuance of service, nor by reason of the breaking of any main, water pipe, fixture or appliance whether owned by the Company or Customer, and no person shall be entitled to damages no have any portion of a payment refunded for any interruption of service. The Company will exercise every care in this matter, and in the event of the necessity of turning off water, every reasonable effort to notify the Customer will be made.
- K. The Company shall not be considered in any manner as an insurer of property or persons, or to have undertaken to extinguish fire or to protect any persons or property against loss or damage by fire, or otherwise. The Company agrees to furnish such supply of water as shall then be available and not other or greater, and it shall be free and exempt from any and all claims for damages on account of any injury to property or persons by reason of fire, water, failure to supply water or pressure or for any other cause whatsoever.

VI. Member's Responsibility.

- A. Piping on the premises of the customer must be so installed that the connections are conveniently located with respect to Company lines and mains.
- B. If the Company is called upon to provide additional meters, each place of metering will be considered as a separate and individual account.
- C. The Customer shall provide a place of metering, which is unobstructed and accessible at all reasonable times.
- D. The customer shall furnish and maintain a private cut-off valve on the customer's side of the meter. The Company is to provide a valve on the Company's side of such meter.
- E. The customer's piping and apparatus shall be installed and maintained by the customer at the customer's expense in a safe and efficient manner and in accordance with the Company rules and regulations and in full compliance with sanitary regulations of the State Board of Health.
- F. The Company reserves the right to inspect Customer's service pipe and all connections and fixtures attached thereto shall be subject to the inspection of the company before the water will be turned on, or any time the company has reasonable suspension that a discrepancy exists, and all premises receiving a supply of water and all service pipes, meters, and fixtures, including any and all fixtures within the said premises, shall at all reasonable hours be subject to inspection by any duly authorized employee of the company.
- G. The customer shall guarantee proper protection for the Company's property placed on the customer's premises and shall permit access to it only by authorized representatives of the Company.
- H. The Company may provide reasonable conditions for the provision of service and may discontinue service with appropriate notice having been given to the customer, etc., for failure to comply with those conditions.

VII. Check Valves, Flush Valves And Vacuum Breakers

(a). Customers having boilers or hot water heating systems connected with mains of the company must have a check valve in the supply pipe to the boilers and hot water heating systems, together with a relief valve at some point between the check valve and the heating system. All customers are hereby cautioned against danger of collapse of boilers, since it is sometimes necessary to shut off the supply of water without notice, and for this reason a vacuum valve should be installed in the steam line to prevent collapse in case the water supply is interrupted. The company, however, will not be responsible for accidents or damages resulting from the imperfect action or failure of said valves.

VIII. Extensions to Mains and Services.

A. The Company will supply service for temporary purposes, provided that the Company has water available in excess of the Company's regular needs, and provided the Company has available material and equipment necessary to supply said service. Each applicant for such service must pay in advance to the Company the Company's estimate of cost of labor and materials, for installation.

B. The Company will make all connections to its mains and will specify the size, kind and quality of all materials.

C. The corporation cock, curb box, meter box, and the service pipe from the main water line to the meter box will be furnished, installed and maintained by the company, and shall remain under its sole control and jurisdiction.

D. The meter box will be set on a level (as close as possible) with the grade of the ground (at time of installation), and shall be kept accessible at all times by the customer. If for any reason the meter box must be raised due to landscaping, or any other reason not directly caused by the company the cost of such maintenance will be the sole responsibility of the customer.

E. No attachment to the service pipe or any branch therein shall be made between the meter and the water main.

F. An extension of fifty (50) feet or less to the District's distribution main shall be made without charge (other than the prescribed standard connection charge) for a prospective customer who shall apply for and contract to use service for one year or more and who provides for such service.

- G. For each extension the District's distribution main in excess of fifty (50) feet, the District shall require the customer to whose premises such extension is made to deposit with the District the total cost of the excessive footage over fifty (50) feet, based on the average estimated cost per foot of the total extension. Such deposit may be refundable to the customer in certain instances, in accordance with Title 807 KAR 5:066, Section 11 (2) (b).
- H. In estimating the cost of an extension, the estimate shall be based on the diameter of the pipe to be used, provided, however, the estimated cost to the Customer or Customers shall not be based on a pipe diameter in excess of eight (8) inches, unless actual consumption estimated for the proposed Customer or Customer's requires a larger pipe.
- I. No interest will be paid by the Company on the Applicant's payment or on any unrefunded balances. At the expiration of said ten (10) year period, the refund account will be closed, and no further refunds will be made.
- J. Provisions of these rules shall not operate to reduce the refund amount below that applicable to fifty (50) feet of main per new Customer per calendar year. A prospective Customer is one who will connect to such main extension after the date the water is turned into the main; provided further, that there is delivered to the Company a written guarantee by a financially responsible person or firm that such prospective Customer will take water service.
- K. Extensions made under this rule shall be and remain the property of the Company, even in the absence of any written agreement to the contrary.
- L. The Company reserves the right to further extend its water mains to any point beyond the terminus of each water main extension made under this rule. The applicant or Applicant's agent paying for an extension shall not be entitled to any refund for the attaching of Customers to any further extension or branch mains so installed.
- M. All plumbing work done in connection with pipe and fixtures connected with the Company's mains shall be submitted for inspection by the Company before such underground work is covered up. Whenever the Company determines that a job of plumbing is obviously defective, although not in direct violation of these Rules and Regulations, the Company may insist upon its being corrected before the water will be turned on to the extension.

- N. Before water lines will be laid hereunder in any new subdivision, it is understood and agreed that the road surface shall be brought to the established sub-grade; and the developer or builder of such new subdivision shall furnish the company with a right-of-way agreement suitable in form to the company, unless the street of the new subdivision have been dedicated to be for public use.
- O. The Company shall have the exclusive right to determine the type, location and size of mains to be installed and of the related facilities required to render adequate service.
- P. In determining the length of main extensions or of pipe lines to be installed, the main shall be extended to fully cover the frontage of the property, and if the last lot or a lot immediately adjacent to a corner lot, the terminal point of the extension will be on the last or corner lot.

IX. Access to Premises.

- A. Duly authorized agents of the Company shall have unrestricted access, at all reasonable hours, to the premises of the member for the purpose of installing or removing Company property, inspecting piping, reading or testing meters or for any other purpose in connection with the Company's service and facilities.
- B. Each customer shall grant or convey, or shall cause to be granted or conveyed to the Company a permanent easement and right-of-way across any property owned or controlled by the customer wherever said permanent easement and right-of-way is necessary for the Company water facilities and lines, so as to be able to furnish service to the member.

X. Change of Occupancy.

- A. Not less than three (3) working days notice must be given in person, by telephone or in writing to the Company to discontinue service or to change occupancy in accordance with 807 KAR 5:006 Section 12 (1).
- B. The outgoing party shall be responsible for all water consumed up to the time of departure or the time specified for departure whichever period is longer. However outgoing party is not responsible after giving at least three (3) days notice and having provided unrestricted access to the meter.

XI. Meter Reading - Billing - Collection.

- A. Meters will be read and bills rendered monthly, but the Company reserves the right to vary the dates or length of period covered, temporarily or permanently if necessary or desirable.
- B. Bills for water will be figured in accordance with the Company's published rate schedule and will be based on the amount consumed for the period covered by the meter readings, except where a customer orders turn-off, the minimum bill to such customer for such period shall be equal to the minimum charge for one full month's service.
- C. Charge for service commences when meter is installed, whether connection is made, or whether water is used or not.

- D. Reading from different meters will not be combined for billing, irrespective of the fact that said meters may be from the same or different premises, or the same or different customers, or for the same or different services.
- E. Bills are due when rendered and delinquent after ten (10) days; if not paid in twenty (20) days of the original bill date, service may be discontinued by the Company.
- F. Delinquent notices will be mailed to the customer ten (10) days after the regular monthly bill date, and if payment is not made within twenty (20) days after due date, of the original bill service will be discontinued.
- G. Failure to receive bills or notices shall not prevent such bills from becoming delinquent nor relieve the customer from the responsibility of payment.

XII. Suspension of Service.

- A. When services are discontinued, for any reason, the Company may proceed to collect any balance due in the usual manner by law for the collection of debts.
- B. Service discontinued for non-payment of bills will be restored only after bills are paid in full, and a service charge paid for each meter reconnected.
- C. The Company reserves the right to discontinue service without notice where evidence is found that the customer has obtained service through fraudulent or illegal means, or where a dangerous condition is found on the customer's or applicant's premises. All other discontinuances of service shall require a notice by the Company to the customer of ten (10) days or the amount of time required by 807 KAR 5:006, Section 14, whichever is shorter. The Company must reconnect service within 24 hours once the cause for discontinuance has been corrected. Customer will always be notified within 24 hours as to reason for disconnect.

XIII. Renewal of Water Service after Discontinuance

- a. When water service to a premises has been terminated for any reason other than temporary vacancy, it will be renewed only after the conditions, circumstances or practices which caused the water service to be discontinued are corrected to the satisfaction of the Company, and upon payment of all charges due and payable by the customer in accordance with the Rates, Rules and Regulations.
- b. No customer whose service has been turned off shall turn on same, or have same done by anyone other than the company or its representatives.
- c. If at the time of such discontinuance of service the customer does not have a deposit with the company, the company may require a cash deposit as a guarantee of the payment of future bills before the water service will be reinstated.

XIV. Complaints - Adjustment.

- A. All Adjustments will be done in Accordance with 807 KAR 5:006 Section 10 (2).
- B. If the customer believes his bill to be in error, he shall present his claim, in person, by telephone or in writing, to the Company's Office before the bill becomes delinquent.
- C. The Company will make special meter readings at the request of the customer for a meter reading fee, provided, however, that if such special reading discloses that the meter was over read, no charge will be made.
- D. Meters will be tested at the request of the customer upon payment to the Company of the actual cost to the Company of making the test provided.
- E. If the seal of the meter is broken by other than the Company's representative or if the meter fails to register correctly or is stopped for any cause, the customer shall pay an amount estimated from the record of his previous bills and/or from other proper data.

XV. Cross-Connections Interconnections:

A. Interconnections, as defined below, and any and all physical connections between the public water supply and any industrial, commercial or other water supply shall be discontinued regardless of whether or not such cross connections and interconnections are controlled by automatic devices, such as check-valves, or by hand operated mechanisms such as gate valves or stock cocks; and no physical connection shall be made or established except between public water supplies which are adequately treated and are under adequate laboratory control.

(a) Interconnection. An interconnection is a plumbing arrangement, other than a cross-connection, by which contamination might be admitted or drawn into the distribution system of the company, or into lines connected therewith, which are used for the conveyance of potable water.

(b) The making, causing or permitting of the installation or existence of and interconnection or cross-connection in violation of these rules shall constitute a violation of the Rules and Regulations of the company, and such prohibited connection shall be removed forthwith in a manner acceptable to the company and to the State Commissioner of Health, or the duly constituted State Health Officer and plumbing inspectors. Failure to do so within two days from and after date of notification by the company may result in discontinuance of water service.

XVI. Meters:

- A. Water will be sold by meter measurement only, and customer's shall pay for such service in accordance with the schedule of rates established therefor.
- B. All meters will be maintained and renewed by and at the expense of the company, but in case of damage to such meters by reason of any act, neglect or omission on the part of the customer, the customer shall pay to the company the cost of its repair on presentation of bill therefore.
- C. After the effective date hereof, each premises shall be supplied through an independent meter setting. In existing installations, however, where two or more premises are supplied through a single meter, the minimum charge set forth in the schedule of rates will be made for each premises supplied.
- D. All meters are accurately tested before installation and are also periodically tested in accordance with Public Service Commission's Regulations. The company may at any time remove any meter for periodic tests or for repairs or replacement and may, at its option and expense, test any meter when the company has reason to believe that it is registering inaccurately.
- E. The company reserves the right to put seals on any water meter, or on its couplings in and for any premises, and may shut off the supply if such seals are found broken or removed.
- F. When the meter has once be placed, any change in location directed by the customer will be done by the company, but at the expense of the customer.
- G. The company reserves the right to determine the kind, size, and placement of the meter(s) that shall be placed on any service pipe, and such meter(s) will be furnished, installed and removed by the company alone, and shall remain it's property.

XVII PUBLIC FLUSH HYDRANTS:

- A. No person, except for the legitimate purpose of extinguishing fires or for other purposes herein provided, shall open any flush hydrant or blowoff without the consent of the COMPANY.

XVIII Terms and Conditions of Billing and of Payment:

- A. Bills for water service by meter will be rendered on a monthly basis.
- B. Special Charges shall be payable upon demand.
 - a. A penalty of up to ten percent (10%) will be charged after the due date of the bill in accordance with 807 KAR 5:006 Section 8(3)(h).
- C. All bills for water and service are due and payable at the office of the Company or a designated branch collecting agency when rendered, and are considered delinquent if not paid within ten (10) days thereafter. Failure to pay will render the Customer subject to discontinuance of service and subject to charge for reconnection of service. If any bill for water service is not paid within ten (10) days following the submission thereof, the service may be discontinued in accordance with Rule 11, Suspension of Service.
- D. Customers are responsible for furnishing the Company with their correct addresses. Failure to receive bills will not be considered an excuse for non-payment nor permit an extension of the date when the account would be considered delinquent.
- E. All bills will be sent to the address entered in the application unless the Company is notified in writing by the Customer of any change of address.
- F. The use of water by the same Customer in different premises or localities will not be combined, and each installation shall stand by itself.
- G. If for any reason service is discontinued before the expiration of one (1) month from commencement of service, a bill for at least the minimum charge for one (1) month will be rendered.

XVIV Ownership of Property:

- A. All pipe, fittings, equipment, meters or other appliances between the Company's distribution mains and the curb line of the Customer, and any meter and equipment appurtenant thereto that may be inside the Customer's curb line, shall at all times be and remain the property of the Company and may at any time during reasonable hours be removed by it upon the discontinuance of service.
- B. District Ownership Of Lines and Meters. The District shall own all lines and meters held by or for it, in the absence of a written agreement to the contrary.

XX GENERAL:

- A. No person shall turn the water on or off at any street valve, corporation cock, curb cock or other street connection, or disconnect or remove any meter without the consent of the Company. Penalties provided by law for any such action will be rigidly enforced.
- B. If any loss or damage to the property of the Company or any accident or other injury to persons or property is caused by or results from the negligence or wrongful action of the customer, member of his household, his agent, or employee, as determined by a court of law having jurisdiction over the parties, the cost of the necessary repairs or replacements shall be paid by the customer to the Company, and any liability otherwise resulting shall be that of the customer.
- C. No employee or agent of the Company shall have the right or authority to bind it by any promise, agreement or representation contrary to the letter or intent of these Rules and Regulations.
- D. Any complaint against the service or employees of the Company should be made at the office of the Company in writing or in person, complaints should be made to the Manager of the Company, whose decision may be appealed to the Board of Commissioners of the Company, within ten (10) days; otherwise, the Managers decision will be final.

APPROVAL OF THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS:

All Rules and Regulations of the Company are subject to the approval of the Public Service Commission of the State of Kentucky, or its successor, and if any part thereof should be adjudged to be in violation of any rule or order made by the Commission, then that particular part shall be ineffective but without in any way affecting the other portions thereof.

XXI. Abridgement or Modification of Rules:

- A. No promise, agreement or representation of any employee of the Company shall be binding upon the Company except as it shall have been agreed upon in writing, signed, and accepted by the acknowledged officers of the Company.
- B. Any modification of rates or rules and regulations shall not be made by any agent of the Company unless approved by the Board of Commissioners with a copy of the minutes of the meeting, and motion approval verified.
- C. The word "Company" used herein applies to the Pulaski County Water District #2. the word "customer" used herein applies to the customers of said Company.

PARTIAL PAYMENT PLAN:

The company shall negotiate and accept reasonable partial payment plans at the request of residential customers who have received a termination notice for failure to pay as provided in Section XI, XII except that a utility is not required to negotiate a partial payment plan with a customer who is delinquent under a previous partial payment plan. Partial payment plans shall be mutually agreed upon and subject to the conditions in this Section and in Section XI, XII. Partial payment plans which extend for a period longer than thirty (30) days shall be in writing and shall advise customers that service may be terminated without additional notice if the customer fails to meet the obligations of the plan.

DEPOSITS:

The Company may require a minimum cash deposit of 2/12's of the average or estimated bill or other guaranty to secure payment of bills.

If a new customer does not have a history with the Company then the estimated deposit will be computed as follows:

- (1) Total number of persons in residence times 65 gallon per person per day, times 30 days = Total Gallons
- (2) Total Gallons times the current Company Rates times two (2) (months) will equal the total Deposit.

Service may be refused or discontinued for failure to pay the required deposit. Interest as prescribed by KRS 278.460, will paid annually either by refund or credit to the customers bill, except that no refund or credit will be made if the customers bill, except that no refund or credit will be made if the customer's bill is delinquent on the anniversary date of the deposit.

The deposit may be waived upon a customer's showing of satisfactory credit or payment history, and required deposits will be returned after one (1) year if the customer has established a satisfactory payment record for that period. If a deposit had been waived or returned and the customer fails to maintain a satisfactory payment record, a deposit may then be required. The Company may require a deposit in addition to the initial deposit if the customer's classification of service changes or if there is a substantial change in usage. Upon termination of service, the deposit, any principal amounts, and any interest earned and owing will be credited to the final bill with any remainder refunded to the customer.

In determining whether a deposit will be required or waived, the following criteria will be considered:

- 1. Previous payment history with the Company. If the customer has no previous history with the Company, statements from other utilities, banks, etc. may be presented by the customer as evidence of good credit.
- 2. Whether the customer has an established income or line of credit.
- 3. Length of time the customer has resided or been located in the area.
- 4. Whether the customer owns property in the area.
- 5. Whether another customer with a good payment history is willing to sign as a guarantor for an amount equal to the required deposit.

If the deposit on account differs from the recalculated amount by more than \$10.00 for a residential customer or 10 percent for a non-residential customer, the Company may collect any underpayment and shall refund any overpayment by check or credit to the customer's bill. No refund will be made if the customer's bill is delinquent at the time of the recalculation.

Water districts should substitute KRS 74.050 and water associations should substitute KRS 273.392 since these statutes govern the rate of interest to be paid by water districts and associations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

MONITORING OF CUSTOMER USAGE:

At least once annually the Company will monitor the usage of each customer according to the following procedure:

1. The customer's annual usage for the most recent 12 month period will be compared with the annual usage for the 12 months immediately preceding that period.
2. If the annual usage for the two periods are substantially the same or if any difference is known to be attributed to unique circumstances, such as unusual weather conditions, common to all customers, no further review will be done.
3. If the annual usages differ by 15% percent or more and cannot be attributed to a readily identified common cause, the Company will compare the customer's monthly usage records for the 12-month period with the monthly usage for the same 12-months of the preceding year.
4. If the cause for the usage deviation cannot be determined from analysis of the customer's meter reading and billing records, the Company will contact the customer by telephone or in writing to determine whether there have been changes such as different number of household members, of work staff, additional or different appliances, changes in business volume, or known leaks in the customer's service line.
5. Where the deviation is not otherwise explained, the Company will test the customer's meter to determine whether it shows an average error greater than two percent (2%) fast or slow.
6. The Company will notify the customers of the investigation, its finding, and any refunds or back billing in accordance with 807 KAR 5:006, Section 10(4) and (5).

In addition to the annual monitoring, the Company will immediately investigate usage deviations brought to its attention as a result of its on-going meter reading or billing processes or customer inquiry.

* If a membership fee is charged, this application shall serve as a Certificate of Membership. If a deposit is charged, this application shall serve as a Certificate of Deposit.

The applicant hereby agrees to connect to the System. If it is a new connection, it is understood and agreed that at such a time as the connection is constructed, the applicant agrees to connect to the System immediately. If for any reason the connection is not made immediately, the applicant understands that a minimum charge will still be due and payable to the system for the connection. Failure to pay such charges and/or connect with the system will void this contract. Should the applicant desire to connect with the System in the future, all fees and connection charges will be due again IN FULL and any and all amounts previously billed.

The applicant agrees to install and maintain a service line that will meet with the Systems' suggested guidelines. The applicant also agrees that no other residence will be connected to their service line. A separate meter must be installed for each residence. The applicant also agrees not to resell or give away water purchased from this System.

A separate contract may be required for trailer parks/commercial.

Section 1. Purpose: The purpose of this plan is to provide for the declaration of official phases of water supply shortages and the implantation of voluntary and mandatory water conservation measures throughout the District in the event a shortage is declared.

Section 2. Definitions: These terms are applicable only for this plan unless specifically noted.

- (a) "Customer" shall mean any person or entity using water for any purpose from the District, water distribution system and for which either a regular charge is made at the site of delivery.
- (b) "Raw Water Supplies" shall mean all water potentially available to persons in the District.
- (c) "Treated Water" shall mean water that has been introduced by the District, into its water distribution system, including water offered for sale. Uses of treated water are classified as follows:

Essential Water Uses (Class 1):

The following uses of water, listed by site or user type, are essential.

Domestic:

water necessary to sustain human life and the lives of domestic pets, and to maintain minimum standards of hygiene and sanitation.

Health Care Facilities:

patient care and rehabilitation, including related filling and operation of swimming pools.

Water Hauling:

sales of domestic use where not reasonable available elsewhere.

Public Use:

firefighting, health and public protection purposes, if specifically approved by health officials.

Socially or Economically Important Uses (Class 2)

The following uses of water, listed by site or user type, are socially or economically important.

Domestic:

personal, in-home water use including kitchen, bathroom and laundry.

Water Hauling:

non-domestic, when other sources are not reasonably available elsewhere.

Commercial and Civic Use:

commercial car and truck washes,
laundromats
restaurants, clubs and eating places
schools, churches, motels/hotels and similar commercial establishments.

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Outdoor Non-Commercial Watering:

minimal watering of vegetable gardens,

minimal watering of trees where necessary to preserve them

Outdoor Commercial or Public Watering (using conversation methods and when other sources of water are not available or feasible to use):

the maintenance of livestock, except water may not be run or hauled to any open, earthen reservoir such as a pond, pool, or spring,

watering by arboretums and public gardens of national state, regional or community significance where necessary to preserve specimens

watering by commercial nurseries at a minimum level necessary to maintain stock,

watering at a minimum rate necessary to establish or maintain vegetation or landscape plantings required pursuant to law or regulation,

watering of woody plants where necessary to preserve them,

minimal watering of golf course greens,

spraying of crops to control insects or other pests, or to apply growth regulators.

Recreational:

operations of municipal swimming pools and residential pools that serve more than 25 dwellings units.

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Outdoor Commercial or Public Watering:

expanding nursery facilities, placing new irrigated agricultural land in production or planting of landscaping except when required by a site design review process,

use of water for dirt control or compaction,

watering of lawns, parks, golf course fairways, playing fields and other recreation areas.

washing sidewalks, walkways, driveways, parking lots, tennis courts or other hard surfaces areas,

washing down buildings or structures for purpose other than immediate fire protection,

flushing gutters or permitting water to run to accumulate in any gutter or street.

Recreational uses other than those specified in Class 2:

Non-Commercial washing of motor and other vehicles.

Air Conditioning (see also Class 2 purposes)
refilling cooling towers after draining.

(d.) "Base Entitlement" shall mean the monthly usage for a customer during the same month of the preceding calendar year or the average per customer usage for each class of service during the same month of the proceeding year.

(e.) "Curtailed Entitlement" shall mean the monthly usage for a customer after any curtailment percentage has been applied.

(f.) "Curtailment" shall mean the reduction in entitlement by some percentage to meet anticipated water shortages, based upon, but not limited to, type of customers, class of service, type of usage and phase of water shortage.

(g.) Water Shortage Response Phases:

"Advisory" shall mean that conditions exist which indicate the potential for serious raw or treated water supply shortages.

"Alert" shall mean the raw or treated water supplies are consistently below seasonal averages, and if they continue to decline, may not be adequate to meet normal needs.

"Emergency" shall mean that raw or treated water supplies are below the level necessary to meet normal needs and that serious shortages exist in the area.

(h.) "Rationing" shall mean that procedures must be established to provide for the equitable distribution of critically-limited raw or treated water supplies, in order to balance demand and limited available supplies, and to assure that sufficient water is available to preserve public health and safety.

Section 3. Applicability. The provisions of this Plan shall apply to all retail and wholesale customers of the District, when implemented, this Plan becomes the Pulaski County Water District #2 Water Shortage Response Regulation.

Section 4. Entitlement. Entitlement shall be established for each customer by adjusting the base entitlement to reflect any known change in usage pattern.

Section 5. Determination of Water Shortage. Water supply and usage shall be monitored on a continuous basis, Unrestricted demand shall be projected from past records and adjusted for changes such as new developments and weather conditions on a regular basis. Water shortages generally occur for two reasons, a reduction in available supplies or a system failure. Each of these has a distinct influence on the nature and duration of the conservation program implementation. Official declaration of a Water Utility to curtail water use shall be approved by the Board of Directors of the Pulaski County Water District # 2.

Section 6. Term of Water Shortage Declaration. Any water shortage declaration shall remain in effect until water supplies or service conditions have returned to normal. A final determination shall be made to the Board of Directors of the Pulaski County Water District # 2.

Section 7. Water Shortage Stage, Criteria, Conservation and Curtailment Measures.

A. Advisory Stage:

(1.) Criteria: A water advisory shall be declared when the amount of treated water or raw water available for treatment is projected to be up to 10% below demand, or there are periods of low water pressure in one or more areas of the distribution system due to system failure or inadequacies or the State Division of Water issues a Water Shortage Watch which includes the areas from the which the Association draws water.

(1.) **Criteria:** A Water Emergency shall be declared when the amount of treated water available is projected to be up to 40% below demand, or these are periods of no water in one or more areas of the distribution system due to low water supply or raw water supplies below the level necessary to meet normal needs.

(2.) **Conservation and Curtailment Measures:**

- (a.) **Declare Water Shortage Emergency.**
- (b.) **Provide proper notice to all customers and to all local news media.**
- (c.) **Eliminate all water leaks.**
- (d.) **Prohibit all Class 3 uses of water**
- (e.) **Prohibit all Class 2 uses of water except Domestic uses for kitchens, bathrooms, and laundries.**
- (f.) **Curtail Residential entitlement by the same percentage as the projected shortage.**
- (g.) **Curtail all commercial and industrial entitlement (except Health Care Facilities and the maintenance of livestock) by the same percentage as the projected shortage.**
- (h.) **Discontinue the placing of new water services until the water shortage is abated**
- (i.) **Begin billing customers a drought surcharge of \$3.00 per thousand or portion thereof on all water used (both metered and bulk sales). Metered customers will be entitled to 40 Per Cent of Normal Usage per month before applying the surcharge. This will be in addition to the regular charge per thousand.**

D. **Rationing Stage:**

(1.) **Criteria:** Treated water available is greater than 50% below demand or raw supplies are below the level necessary to meet essential needs, and in the opinion of the Board of Directors, mandatory rationing is required to insure adequate water is available to maintain public health and safety.

2. **Conservation and Curtailment Measures:**

- (a) **Declare Water Shortage Rationing.**
- (b) **Provide proper notice to all customers of their individual allotment as well as notifying the general public by local news media.**
- (c) **Eliminate all water leaks.**
- (d) **Prohibit all Class 3 and Class 2 uses of water.**

- (g) Implement service interruptions to portions of system in accordance with approved published schedule. The schedule shall be provided to all local media.
- (h) Discontinue the setting of new water services until the water shortage is abated.
- (i) Close all public loading (bulk sales) stations.
- (j) Institute an excess use charge to be applied to any water use above an individual allotment. The excess use charge shall be applied as follows:

Section 8. Enforcement of Water Restriction.

Any person who violates the provisions of this Plan, who fails to carry out the duties and responsibilities imposed by this Plan or who impedes or interferes with any action undertaken or ordered pursuant to this plan shall be subject to the following:

- (a) If the utility officials charged with implementation and enforcement of this Plan learns of any violation of any water use restriction imposed, a written notice of the violation shall be affixed to the property where the violation occurred and mailed to the customer of record. Said notice shall describe the violation and order that it be corrected, cured, or abated immediately or within 48 hours.

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- (b) The notice will inform the customer of his or her right to appeal by requesting a hearing before the utilities designee written forty eight (48) hours from the time of issuance of written notice. If a hearing is requested by the customer, he or she shall be heard with his or her counsel present at the appeal's own discretion before termination, the governing body shall make findings of fact and decide whether service should continue or terminate.

- (c) Any customer whose water service is terminated for violating provisions of this water curtailment plan shall be subject to the approved reconnection fee prior to reconnection of service.
- (d) The excess usage charge billing provisions of this Plan shall not be put in effect of a county or city ordinance containing penalty provisions is in effect to assist enforcement of this Plan.

Section 9. Request for Exception

- (a) Exception to water use regulations. In compliance with any curtailment measure authorized herein would cause a customer to bear extraordinary hardship that individual or entity may apply to the District for an exception. For these purposes "extraordinary hardship" shall be defined as a condition which may threaten health and safety, or cause property or economic losses, each of which must be shown to be substantially more severe than the sacrifices borne by other users. If extraordinary hardship is found to exist, then an exception shall be granted and a written waiver to the customer. If an appeal is made, water service shall be continued until a decision is announced. Procedures for taking appeal shall be the same as those wherein violations are appealed and shall conform to all time and notice provisions of violations procedures. Any person aggrieved by the decision may file a complaint with the Public Service Commission.
- (b) Exception to curtailment surcharge: Exceptions to excess use charges shall not be considered or granted.

Section 10. Severability

If any provision of this Plan is declared invalid by the courts, the remainder of the Plan and its applicability to other persons and circumstances shall not be affected by that declaration.

Section 11. Effective Date

This Plan shall take effect immediately upon approval by the Public Service Commission.

- (1) All Water Line Extensions to the Water District that has a total cost of less than \$2000.00 must be blue printed, and approved by the Division of Water, all with a total cost of greater than \$2000.00 must be blue printed, signed by a Ky. Certified Engineer and approved by the Division of Water.
- (2) All pipe and materials and other appurtenances are to be approved by the Pulaski #2 Water District or its representatives. The contractor shall provide written specifications on all purchased materials prior to the start of construction and all materials are to be installed per the manufacturer's specifications. The construction work and materials must meet KY Division of Water requirements.
- (3) All water lines to be laid with at least 30" of cover. All rock is to be removed from the trench and backfill. The contractor is responsible for removal and disposal of all waste materials.
- (4) Any disturbed area is to be returned to the original contour, final graded, seeded, and mulched with at least 100 pound to the acre grass seed per the owner's stipulation and at least 500 pound to the acre of 10-10-10 fertilizer. Mulch will be applied at the rate of 1.50 tons per acre...
- (5) All traveled ways (roadways, gravel drives, pavement, etc.) are to be restored to original condition. All road crossings or borings are to be thru metal casing approved by the Water District.
- (6) All valves are to be set with valve casings and caps and a 3'X3'X4", formed, with wire mesh, concrete cap is to be installed around each valve casing at ground level.
- (7) All Tee's and El's (greater than 22 degrees) and end fittings are to be thrust blocked with 2500 psi concrete placed against the line(s) of thrust and against firm, undisturbed earth.

- (8) All water lines are to be pressure tested to at least 50 psi over the normal working pressure for six hours with the method of measuring leakage to be by determination of the amount of water replacement to maintain pressure to be no greater than (5) gallons per inch normal diameter, per 24 hours, per mile of pipe.

- (9) All water lines are to be sterilized and tested for bacterial contamination per the KY Division of Water and Department of Health regulations. All water line equipment at tie-ins during construction are to be cleaned and individually sterilized per the standard practice for water line construction. Care is to be taken, including temporary coverings, to prevent contamination of existing water lines; Also a copy of the Approved Bacteriological Sample is required at the Water Company Office before the Extension may be place in service.
- (10) The Developer is responsible for any required road right-of-way encroachment permits, copy of said to be delivered to the Water District, Developer must also sign an easement for the extension prior to construction beginning.
- (11) The contractor is responsible for notifying the owner and the Water District or its representative of the work schedule at least one day prior to start of work or work period to allow for inspection of the work. The owner, the Water District, and their representatives have the right to access to the site at any time.
- (12) The contractor is responsible for maintaining a safe work site and any areas used for material or equipment storage, including temporary fill of any excavations over-night and roping off dangerous areas as needed.
- (13) Contractor is responsible for any maintenance on this water line extension for the period of one (1) year after the completion date.
- (14) Contractor is responsible for any maintenance on this waterline for 1 year after completion date.

(a) A professional engineer with a Kentucky Certification has certified that the system can provide a minimum fire flow of 250 gallons per minute, and that the system supporting this flow has the capability of providing this flow for a period of not less than two (2) hours plus consumption at the maximum daily rate.





Fire Hydrant Detail








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


