RULES AND REGULATIONS

ARTICLE I

ADMINISTRATIVE AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

.01 Commission's Rules and Regulations.

All services rendered by the Utility shall be in accordance with the Kentucky Public Service Commission and the acts, rules, regulations and forms which have been adopted by the Public Service Commission and all amendments thereto and modifications thereof which may be made by the Commission.

.02 Company's Rules and Regulations.

In addition to the rules and regulations prescribed by the Commission, all electric service rendered shall be in accordance with the following rules and regulations adopted by the Utility, provided the same do not conflict with those of the Public Service Commission.

.03 Filing of Rates, Rules and Regulations.

A copy of all schedules of rates, rules and regulations under which electrical service is rendered is on file for the public's benefit and review with the Public Service Commission and in the various offices of the Utility at Berea College Administration Building and in the office of the Business Vice President.

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.04 Application for Service.

All applications for service shall be made on the Berea College Electric Utility Department's standard application or contract form, which shall be signed by ~~the customer, or his~~

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The security deposit may be refunded to an active residential customer who has a perfect payment record for the previous twelve month period. A perfect payment record shall be defined as a customer who has not been delinquent with payment during the most recent twelve month period. If a deposit is held longer than 18 months, the deposit will be recalculated at the customer's request based on the customer's actual usage. If the deposit on account differs from the recalculated amount by more than \$10.00 for a residential customer or 10% for a non-residential customer, the Utility may collect any underpayment and shall refund any overpayment by check or credit to the customer's bill. No refund will be made if the customer's bill is delinquent at the time of the recalculation.

In Determining whether a deposit will be required or waived, the following criteria will be considered:

- (a) Previous payment history with the Utility. If the customer has no previous history with the Utility, statements from other utilities, banks, ect. may be presented by the customer as evidence of good credit.
- (b) Whether the customer has an established income or line of credit.
- (c) Length of time the customer has resided or been located in the area.
- (d) Whether the customer owns property in the area.
- (e) Whether the customer has filed bankruptcy proceedings within the last seven years.

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.05 Security Deposits

The Utility may require from all customers or applicants, as a guaranty or surety, a cash deposit . The deposit amount will be equal to two-twelfths (2/12ths) of the estimated annual bill of such customer or applicant. Deposits will not be required for customers quallying for service reconnection pursuant to 807 KAR 5:006, Section 15, Wintor Hardship Reconnection. Service may be refused or discontinued for failure to pay the requested deposit. The required deposit may be waived upon a customer's showing of satisfactory credit or payment history. A customer's deposit, less any unpaid amounts for services rendered, shall be returned upon the discontinuance of service.

Where the monthly bills are in excess of the deposit, or where the customer has delinquent bill(s), the Utility may require the deposit to be increased; but such deposit shall not exceed the amount of two-twelfths (2/12ths) of the maximum estimated annual consumption of such customer or applicant. If a deposit has been waived or returned and the customer fails to maintain a satisfactory payment record, a deposit may then be required.

Interest, as prescribed by KRS 278.460 will be paid on deposits. Interest will be calculated on October 31 for all customers with deposits on file. The interest will be applied as a credit to the customer's bill that is rendered during November. Upon request for customer's discontinuance of service, interest will be calculated for the time period since the previous October 31 or from the date on the original security deposit receipt depending on which date is the most recent.

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No deposit shall be required of any receiver or trustee operating a business requiring utility service under an order of any court.

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**RULES AND REGULATIONS**

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.06 Resell of Service

Except in the cases where the customer has a special contract with the Utility, no customer shall resale any service purchased from the Utility.

.07 Uniform Service

The Utility will endeavor to supply service continuously and without interruption; however, the Utility shall not be responsible in damages or otherwise for any interruption in the supply when such failure is without willful fault or neglect on its part.

.08 Monthly Bills

Bills for service will be rendered monthly on the billing from attached hereto as Article I, Exhibit A unless otherwise specified. The term "month" for billing purposes shall mean the period between any two consecutive readings of the meter by the Utility, such readings to be taken as near as practicable every thirty (30) days.

Bills are due and payable within a period not exceeding ten (10) days. Failure to receive a bill does not exempt a customer from these rules and regulations.

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When the Utility is unable to read a meter after a reasonable effort or where the meter fails to operate, the customer will be billed on an estimated basis at the average of the three immediate preceding months, or similar months of utilization and the billing adjusted as necessary when the meter is read.

.09 Termination of Service for Non-Payment

Service shall be subject to discontinuance to any customer for nonpayment of bills, including delayed charges. The Utility shall give the customer at least ten (10) days written notice, but the cut-off date shall not be effected before twenty-seven (27) days after the mailing date of the original bill. If prior to discontinuance of service, there is delivered to the Utility's office or to its employee empowered to discontinue service, payment of the amount in arrears, including delayed charges, then discontinuance of service shall not be made, or where a written certificate is filed, signed by a physician, registered nurse or public health officer stating that, in the opinion of the person making the certification, discontinuance of service will aggravate an existing illness or infirmity on the affected premises. In such latter event, service shall not be discontinued for thirty (30) days beyond the termination date stated on the customer's written notice for discontinuance of service. Any written notice for discontinuance of service shall advise the customer of his rights, the reason for such discontinuance and the existence of local, state, and federal programs that provide financial assistance on utility bills.

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.10 Fraudulent or Illegal Use of Service

When the Utility has discovered evidence that by fraudulent or illegal means a customer has obtained unauthorized service or has diverted the service for an unauthorized use, or has obtained service without same being properly measured, the service to the customer may be discontinued upon forty-eight (48) hours written notice. The Utility shall not be required to restore the service until the customer has complied with all of the rules of the Utility and regulations of the Commission and the Utility has been reimbursed for the estimated amount of service rendered and the cost to the Utility incurred by reason of the fraudulent use.

.11 Special Charges

- (A) A ten (10%) percent late payment charge will be added if any bill is not paid by the tenth (10th) day after billing date.
- (B) In the event service is discontinued, an additional \$10.00 reconnection charge will be charged to all customers, except for customers qualifying for service reconnection under 807 KAR 5:006, Section 15, Winter Hardship Reconnection.
- (c) A special charge of \$10.00 may be made for any check returned from any financial institution by reason of insufficient funds or otherwise.

.12 Point of Delivery

The point of delivery is the point as designated by the Utility on customer's premises where current is to be delivered to buildings or premises.

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loss or damage resulting from defects in the installation, wiring, equipment or appliances, or from violation of the Utility's rules, or from accidents which may occur upon the customer's premises. Further, if it is required, it shall be the responsibility of the customer to present to the Utility a certificate of inspection evidencing compliance with all state and local ordinances in effect at the time, before such connections are to be made.

.16 Protection of Company's Property.

All meters, service connections and other equipment furnished by the Utility, shall be and remain the property of the Utility. The customer shall provide a space for and exercise proper care to protect the property of the Utility on its premises and in the event of loss or damage arising from the neglect of customer to care for the same, the cost of necessary repairs or replacement shall be paid by customer.

.17 Right of Access.

The Utility's identified employees shall have access to customers premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of reading meters, testing, repairing, removing or exchanging any and all equipment belonging to Utility.

.18 Failure of Meter to Register.

In the event a customers meter should fail to register, the customer shall be billed from the date of such failure at the average consumption of the customer, based on like months.

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.19 Termination of Contract by Customer.

Customers who have fulfilled their contract terms and wish to discontinue service must give at least three (3) days notice, either written or by telephone. Notice to discontinue service prior to expiration of contract term will not relieve customer from any minimum or guaranteed payment under any contract or rate.

.20 Service Charge for Temporary Service.

Customers requiring electric service for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days will be required by the Utility to pay all costs for connection and disconnection incidental to the supplying and removing of the service, and the Utility may estimate the amount of power to be used and charge for that amount, in advance.

.21 Bill Adjusting.

If the testing of any meter shows that the meter is accurate within 2% slow or fast, no adjustment will be made in the customer's bill. In any cases where the test shows the meter to be in excess of 2% slow or fast, an adjustment will be made in the customer's bill in accordance with the Public Service Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:006E, Section 9.

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.22 Energy Emergency Control Program.

Purpose-- To provide a plan for reducing the consumption of electric energy supplied by the Electric Distribution Utility Company (Company) in the event of a severe fuel shortage, such as might result from a general strike in the coal mining or transportation industry.

For the purpose of this program, the following priority levels have been established:

- I. Essential Health and Safety Uses -- as defined in Appendix B
- II. Residential Use
- III. Commercial and Industrial Uses
- IV. Nonessential Uses -- as defined in Appendix C

It is the intent of this Program that the Company's wholesale customers will be treated in a manner consistent with the curtailment procedures applicable to the Company's retail customers. Implementation in the case of wholesale customers will be in accordance with the curtailment provision contained in the service agreement between the parties or the applicable tariff.

Procedures -- In the event of a potential severe fuel shortage, such as one resulting from a general coal strike the following steps will be implemented. These steps will be carried out to the extent not prohibited by contractual commitments or by order of the regulatory authorities having jurisdiction. The "days' operation" referred to below will be furnished by the generation and transmission utility ("The Supplier") which supplies the wholesale power to the company.

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A. To be initiated when the supplier advises that fuel supplies are decreased to 50 days' operation of coal-fired generation and a continued downward trend in coal stocks is anticipated:

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- B. To be initiated when the supplier advises that fuel supplies are decreased to 40 days' operation of coal-fired generation and a continued downward trend in coal stocks is anticipated:
- 1) Discontinue all short - term sales to neighboring utilities.
  - 2) Limit emergency deliveries to neighboring utilities to situations where regular customers of such utilities would otherwise be dropped or where the receiving utility agrees to return like quantities of energy within 14 days.
  - 3) Curtail electric energy consumption by customers on interruptible contracts to a maximum number of hours of use per week as negotiated within the context of the contract provisions.
  - 4) Purchase energy from neighboring systems to the extent practicable.
  - 5) Purchase energy from industrial customers with generation facilities to the extent practicable.
  - 6) Through use of the news media and direct customer contact, appeal to all customers, both retail and wholesale, to voluntarily reduce their use of electric energy as much as possible, and in any case endeavor to reduce the nonessential usage of electricity (Priority Level IV) by at least 25%.
  - 7) Utilize voltage reduction as a means of reducing KWH consumption if this is deemed a feasible and viable measure in the Company's service area.
  - 8) The Company shall advise customers of the nature of the mandatory program to be introduced in Section 9 below through direct contact and mass media, and establish an effective means of answering specific customer inquiries concerning the impact of the mandatory program on his electricity availability.

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C. To be initiated -- in the order indicated below -- when the supplier advises that fuel supplies are decreased to 30 days' operation of coal-fired plants and continued downward trend in coal stocks is anticipated:

- 1) Discontinue emergency deliveries to neighboring utilities unless the receiving utility agrees to return like quantities of energy within 7 days.
- 2) Implement mandatory curtailment of electric service to all customers as indicated below:
  - (a) Priority Level IV - 100%
  - (b) Priority Level III - 25% (based on the "monthly base period use" as defined in Appendix D)
  - (c) Priority Level II - 15%
- 3) The Company shall advise all customers of the mandatory program specified in Section "D" below.

D. To be initiated when the supplier advises that fuel supplies are decreased to 20 days' operation of coal-fired generation and continued downward trend to coal stocks is anticipated:

- 1) Implement mandatory curtailment of electric service to all priority levels (including Priority Level I) at a minimum service level which is not greater than that required for protection of human life and safety, protection of physical plant facilities, and employees' security.
- 2) The Company shall advise all customers of the mandatory program specified in Section "E" below.

E. To be initiated as a measure of last resort when the supplier advises that fuel supplies are decreased to 15 days' operation of coal-fired generation and continued downward trend in coal stocks is anticipated:

- 1) Implement procedures for interruption of selected distribution circuits on a rotational basis, while minimizing -- to the extent practicable -- interruption to Priority Level I.

With regard to mandatory curtailments identified in Section "C", "D", and "E" above, the Company proposes to monitor compliance after the fact, to the extent feasible, as approved by the Commission. A customer exceeding his electric energy allotment would be warned to curtail his usage or face, upon continuing noncompliance and upon one day's written notice, disconnection of electric service for the duration of the energy emergency.

Termination of Energy Emergency -- The Energy Emergency Control Program shall be terminated upon notice to the Commission, when the supplier advises that (a) the fuel stockpile has been increased to at least 20 days supply of normal generating capacity, (b) coal deliveries have been resumed, and (c) there is reasonable assurance that the coal stocks are being restored to adequate levels.

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ESSENTIAL HEALTH AND SAFETY USES

Essential health and safety uses given special consideration in these procedures shall, insofar as the situation permits, include the following types of use and such other uses which the Commission may subsequently identify:

- (a) "Hospitals", which shall be limited to institutions providing medical care to patients.
- (b) "Life Support Equipment", which shall be limited to kidney machines, respirators, and similar equipment used to sustain the life of a person.
- (c) "Police Stations and Government Detention Institutions", which shall be limited to essential uses required for police activities and the operation of facilities used for the detention of persons. These uses shall include essential street, highway and signal-lighting services.
- (d) "Fire Stations", which shall be limited to facilities housing mobile fire-fighting apparatus.
- (e) "Communications Services", which shall be limited to essential uses required for telephone, telegraph, television, radio and newspaper operations.
- (f) "Water and Sewage Services", which shall be limited to essential uses required for the supply of water to a community, flood numbing and sewage disposal.
- (g) "Transportation and Defense-related Services", which shall be limited to essential uses required for the operation of guidance control and navigation of air, rail and mass transit systems, including those uses essential to the national defense and operation of state and local emergency services.

- (h) "Other Energy Source Services", which shall be limited to essential uses required for the production, transportation, transmission and distribution -- for fuel -- of natural or manufactured gas, coal, oil or gasoline.
- (i) "Perishable Food or Medicine", which shall be limited to refrigeration for the storage and preservation of perishable food or medicine, when that use is substantially all of the customer's load.

Although these types of uses will be given special consideration when implementing the manual load-shedding provisions of this procedure, these customers are encouraged to install emergency generation equipment if continuity of service is essential. In case of customers supplied from two utility sources, only one source will be given special consideration. Also, any other customers who, in their opinion, have critical equipment should install emergency generation equipment.

The following and similar types of uses of electric energy and others which the Commission may subsequently identify shall be considered nonessential for all customers:

- (a) Outdoor flood and advertising lighting, except for the minimum level to protect life and property, and a single illuminated sign identifying commercial facilities when operating after dark.
- (b) General interior lighting levels greater than minimum functional levels.
- (c) Show-window and display lighting.
- (d) Parking-lot lighting above minimum functional levels.
- (e) Energy use greater than that necessary to maintain a temperature of not less than 78 degrees during operation of cooling equipment and not more than 65 degrees during operation of heating equipment.
- (f) Elevator and escalator use in excess of the minimum necessary for no-peak hours of use.
- (g) Energy use greater than that which is the minimum required for lighting, heating or cooling of commercial or industrial facilities for maintenance cleaning or business-related activities during no-business hours.

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.23 Monitoring of Customer Usage

At least once annually the Utility will monitor the usage of each customer according to the following procedure:

- (a) The customer's annual usage for the most recent 12-month period will be compared with the annual usage for the 12 months immediately preceding that period.
- (b) If the annual usage for the two periods are substantially the same or if any difference is known to be attributed to unique circumstances, such as unusual weather conditions, common to all customers, no further review will be done.
- (c) If the annual usages differ by twenty-five (25%) percent or more and cannot be attributed to a readily identified common cause, the Utility will compare the customer's monthly usage records for the 12-month period with the monthly usage for the same months of the preceding year.
- (d) If the cause for the usage deviation cannot be determined from analysis of the customer's meter readings and billing records, the Utility will contact the customer by telephone or in writing to determine whether there have been changes such as different number of household members or work staff, additional or different appliances, or changes in business volume.
- (e) Where the deviation is not other wise explained, the Utility will test the customer's meter to determine whether it shows an average error greater than two (2%) percent fast or slow.

.01 Normal Extension.

- (a) An extension of one thousand (1,000) feet or less shall be made by the Utility from its existing distribution line without charge for a prospective customer who shall apply for and contact to use this service for one year or more and provides guarantee for such service.

.04 Distribution Line Extensions to Mobile Homes.

(a) All extensions of up to 150 feet from the nearest facility shall be made without charge.

(b) Extensions greater than 150 feet from the nearest facility and up to 300 feet shall be made provided the customers shall pay the Utility a "customer advance for construction" of fifty dollars (\$50) in addition to any other charges required by the Utility for all customers. This advance shall be refunded at the end of one (1) year if the service to the mobile home continues for that length of time.

(c) For extensions greater than 300 feet and less than 1,000 feet from the nearest facility, the Utility may charge an advance equal to the reasonable costs incurred by it for that portion of the service beyond 300 feet plus fifty dollars (\$50). Beyond 1,000 feet the extension policies set forth in 807 KAR 5:030E Section 10 apply.

(i) This advance shall be refunded to the customer over a four (4) year period in equal amounts for each year the service is continued.

(ii) If the service is discontinued for a period of sixty (60) days, or should the mobile home be removed and another not take its place within sixty (60) days, or be replaced by a permanent structure, the remainder of the advance shall be forfeited.

.05 Governing the Supplying of Electric Service Underground.

1. General: The Company will, upon applicant's request, install facilities to supply electric service underground, provided the requested underground service is, in Company's judgement, practical, feasible, and in accordance with good operating practice. In addition, the applicant must reimburse the Company an amount equal to the difference in cost between the requested underground and equivalent overhead service facilities. The Company will calculate the cost difference for each installation and that amount shall be due and payable before construction is begun. Upon agreement by both parties, if the applicant should choose to perform all necessary trenching and backfilling, per Company's specifications, which includes installation of conduits under streets and passageways as required, the Company shall credit the applicant's cost in an amount equal to the Company's cost for trenching, backfilling and conduit.

The point of delivery to an individual premise or load shall be at a point on such premise as designated by the Company. The applicant/customer will provide, own, operate and maintain all electric facilities on the load side of the point of delivery with the exception of Company's meter for which suitable provisions shall be made by the applicant/customer in accordance with the Company's General Rules.

2. New Residential Subdivisions: Installations and service shall be provided in accordance with the preceding "General" section and 807 KAR 5:041 (Electric), Section 21, except the Company shall calculate the "average cost differential" per foot for each subdivision rather than file an "estimated average cost differential" annually. The individual services in a new subdivision shall be provided in accordance with Paragraph No. 3; Individual Residential Services.

.06 Relocation of Lines.

The Utility will cooperate with all parties in the construction, improvements, or rehabilitation of public streets and highways. INSPECTIONS

.01 Electric Distribution System Inspection.

Berea College Electric Utility Department has adopted the following procedure for the inspection of its electrical system. A systematic inspection shall be performed in the manner set out below.

By agreement with Kentucky Utilities, they will perform all inspections on our system on facilities with a primary operating voltage of 69 KV or greater.

- (a) At Intervals Not to Exceed Six Months. Underground network transformers and network protectors in vaults located in buildings, or under sidewalks, shall be examined for leaks, condition of case, connections, temperature, and overloading.
- (b) At Intervals Not to Exceed Two Years. Electric lines operating voltages less than 69 KV (including insulators, conductor, and supporting facilities).
- (c) Other Facilities.
  - (i) Utility buildings will be inspected for compliance with safety codes at intervals not greater than one year.
  - (ii) Construction equipment will be inspected for defects wear and operational hazards, at intervals not greater than quarterly.
- (d) On the receipt of a report of a potentially hazardous condition made by a qualified employee or public official or by a customer.
- (e) Appropriate records shall be kept to identify the inspection made, deficiencies found, and action taken for the correction of such deficiencies.

RESIDENTIAL CLASS I BUDGET PLAN

.01 General

The Utility has a budget plan available for the convenience of its residential customers who have been receiving service for a minimum of twelve (12) months. The plan is designed to help equalize payments for service over a period of months, normally July through June for service rendered June through May. On the last month of the budget payment period (June) appropriate adjustments shall be made relative to any difference in the customer's total payments and actual usage billing amounts. Budget bills are due and payable within a period not exceeding ten (10) days. A ten (10%) percent late payment charge will be added if any bill is not paid by the tenth (10) day after billing date. Failure to receive a bill does not exempt a customer from these rules and regulations.

.02 Review

The customer's account shall be reviewed periodically and the monthly payment amount may be adjusted during the budget period because of changes in usage and/or approved rate changes.

.03 Continuance

It is understood that this budget billing plan will continue until the customer notifies the Utility in person or in writing, or by telephone to discontinue the plan or the customer defaults in payment of such plan.

To be accepted as a budget customer, the account balance must be paid in full before the customer is put on budget billing.

The rates authorized the utility are based upon the wholesale cost of electricity to the utility as computed upon rates of its wholesale supplier currently in effect under the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission tariffs for interstate business and /or under wholesale tariffs of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky. For the purpose of this Wholesale Electric Adjustment Clause, such rates shall be considered as the BASE RATE for purchased electricity.

.02 Base Rate Increase.

In the event there is a proposed increase in the BASE RATE the utility shall, within sixty (60) days from the time it receives notice of the proposed change, file with the Public Service Commission the following information:

(1)A copy of the tariff filed by the wholesale supplier to be approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission or wholesale tariff of this Commission affecting the change in the base rate and a statement relative to the effective date of such proposed change.

SECTION 1 - APPLICABILITY AND ENFORCEMENT

1.01 - Applicability.

These regulations are filed in compliance with 807 KAR 5, and shall govern and control the use of any pole or facility owned by Berea by any approved Cable Antenna Television Customer ("CATV") who desires to make attachments to the poles of Berea and who adheres to the terms and conditions of these tariffs. Any entitlement acquired by CATV under these regulations shall not be exclusive and may be subordinated to the rights and privileges of Berea or those acquired by other public utilities or other entities making lawful use of Berea's poles and facilities.

1.02 - Definitions.

As used in this contract, and unless otherwise defined, the following definitions shall apply:

(a) "attachments" - Any addition, appendage, fixture or use of any type or nature whatsoever of the poles, anchors, equipment, easements or facilities of Berea College Electric Utility.

(b) "CATV Customer" - Cable Antenna Television Operators meeting all requirements to operate, to include possessing necessary franchises, and the same shall be considered customers of Berea. C 1/26/2005

(c) "Berea" - Berea College ~~Electric Utility~~, a Department of Berea College, Berea, Kentucky. PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION KENTUCKY

Further, without regard to any negligence by any of the parties to this agreement, Berea shall not be liable to CATV for any loss of profits, revenues or any other indirect or consequential damage or injury to CATV resulting from interruption or partial interruption in the delivery of service from CATV.

Section 2.02 - Bond.

CATV is to furnish to Berea a bond in the penal sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) to guarantee faithful performance by CATV of all the terms and conditions of these Rules and Regulations to include payment of charges, said bond to be executed by CATV and such surety or sureties as may be approved by Berea.

Upon request and review, Berea shall give consideration to reduction of the bond as may be warranted by the proven reliability of the customer.

Section 2.03 - Taxes.

If there shall be imposed by federal, state, other governmental authority or school system any tax, fee or assessment payable by CATV upon the gross revenue or earnings, or upon CATV's franchise or business activities, such additional tax, fee or assessment shall be paid solely by CATV.

Section 2.04 - Force Majure.

To the extent the electric distribution system and operations of Berea is affected, interrupted or prevented by labor disputes, governmental interferences or control, riot, civil disobedience, weather, fire, other casualties or acts of God beyond the control of Berea, the obligations of Berea under these tariffs shall be suspended until the removal of such interference or obstacle.

SECTION 3 - RATES AND PAYMENT

Section 3.01 - Rates.

The charges and rates for each attachment to Berea's poles shall be those as reflected in the rates attached hereto. Composite billing rate based on relative pole population is permitted when a complete updated inventory of CATV attachment is not available. Any substandard unauthorized or unreported attachment by CATV will be billed at a rate two times the amount equal to the rate that would have been due had the installation been made the day after the last previously required inspection pursuant to 807 KAR 5:006, \$22.

Section 3.02 - Payment of Charges.

Charges applicable to attachments shall be billed monthly based on the number of pole attachments, and shall be paid within ten (10) days of billing. A 10% late payment charge will be added if bills are not paid by the 10th day after billing.

SECTION 4 - USE AND STANDARDS

Section 4.01 - Pole Availability.

CATV shall be authorized to attach to the poles of Berea where space is or can be made readily available, but Berea shall be under no obligation to grant use for attachment to any pole which is not reasonably available for that purpose.

Section 4.02 - Standards of Attachments.

(a) CATV shall have the sole responsibility for the design, construction, installation, ownership, safety, operation and maintenance of the attachments. In designing, constructing, installing, operating and maintaining the attachments, CATV shall comply with all the rules, regulations, policies, standards and codes generally recognized in the utility industry as applicable to such operations, including, but not limited to, the National Electric Safety Code, regulations of Berea and the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, all federal, state and local safety codes, statutes, regulations and ordinances now in existence or that may be adopted from time to time.

(b) At a minimum, the CATV customer shall not make an attachment lower than 20 feet clearance to the ground on any pole or facility of Berea.

Section 4.03 - Notice of Use.

(a) Before CATV shall make use of any pole or facility of Berea, they shall notify Berea of its intention in writing and shall comply with the procedures established by Berea and the Public Service Commission. As a minimum, CATV will submit an Application for Permit on a form furnished by Berea. CATV shall furnish to Berea construction plans and drawings for each pole line, together with necessary maps, indicating specifically the poles of Berea, the number and character of attachments to be placed on such poles, and rearrangements of Berea's fixtures and other equipment necessary for the attachment, relocation or replacement of existing poles, and any additional poles that CATV intends to install.

(b) Berea shall, on the basis of such detailed construction plans and drawings, submit to CATV a cost estimate (including overhead, less salvage value of materials) of all changes that may be required on each such pole. Upon written notice by CATV to Berea, that the cost estimate is approved, Berea shall proceed with the necessary changes covered by the cost estimate. After all such necessary changes are performed, CATV shall have the right to make attachments in accordance with the terms of the application of this Contract. CATV shall, at its sole expense, make attachments in such a manner so as not to interfere with the service rendered by Berea.

(c) Upon completion of all changes, modifications, relocations or replacements as may be necessary, CATV shall forthwith pay to Berea the actual cost of making such changes, modifications, etc. The obligation of CATV hereunder shall not be limited to the amount shown on the estimates above mentioned. (d) Any charges necessary for correction of sub-standard installation made by CATV, shall be billed at a rate equal to twice the charge that would have been imposed if the attachment had been properly authorized.

Section 4.04 - Ownership of Poles.

All poles to which attachments have been made under this tariff shall remain the property of Berea, and any payments made by CATV for changes in pole lines shall not entitle CATV to the ownership of any poles.

Section 4.05 - Easements and Rights-of-Way.

(a) Berea does not warrant nor assure CATV any right-of-way privilege or easement. If CATV shall at any time be prevented from placing or maintaining its attachment on Berea's poles or any appurtenances thereto, no liability on account thereof shall attach to Berea. Each party shall be responsible for obtaining its own easements and rights-of-way.

(b) Any reclearing of existing rights-of-way and any tree trimming necessary for the establishment of pole line attachments shall be performed by and at the cost of CATV.

Section 4.06 - Maintenance and Relocation of Poles and Attachments; Operations.

(a) Whenever right-of-way consideration or public regulations require relocation of a pole or pole facilities, such relocation shall be made by Berea at its sole expense; except that, however, each party shall bear the cost of transferring its own attachments.

(b) When it becomes necessary to replace or relocate an attachment, Berea shall, except in the case of emergencies, give forty-eight (48) hours notice to CATV before the required time for such replacement or relocation. CATV shall, at the time so specified, transfer its attachments to the new or relocated pole or facility. Should CATV fail to transfer its attachments to the new or relocated pole at the time specified in such notice, Berea may elect, but is not required to perform such work, and CATV shall pay Berea the cost thereof. In the event CATV fails to transfer its attachments and Berea does such work, Berea shall not be liable for any loss or damage to CATV's facilities and attachments, nor shall Berea be obligated or liable for any disruption or termination of service to CATV's customers, except as for that which was caused by the negligence of Berea College in performing such work.

Section 4.07 - Existing Attachments.

Any attachments of CATV which may exist or may be hereafter installed which do not conform with the specifications as required these rules and regulations of Berea, the Public Service Commission or any other agency, shall be brought in conformity therewith as soon as practical. Berea, because of the importance of its service, reserves the right to inspect all existing and new installations of CATV either on the poles of Berea or in the vicinity of its lines and appurtenances.

Section 4.08 - Inspection.

(a) Cost of any "make ready" inspection or "walk through" inspection required shall be borne by Berea unless it is shown that substandard installations ~~exist which are not~~ created by the Utility but by the CATV operator, in which event Berea shall charge the CATV operator the cost of correcting, plus contributions towards administrative costs, labor and material costs incurred.

(b) Inspection and/or acceptance of any plan, design, specification or operating characteristic observed or provided shall not be construed as confirming or endorsing the design or as warranting the safety, durability and/or reliability thereof. Berea shall not, by reason of any review, acceptance, inspection or failure to review or inspect, be responsible to CATV or its consumers, nor shall any acceptance or approval be construed as an endorsement of any attachment of CATV.

Section 4.09 - Abandonment of Pole or Facility Use.

(a) If at any time, Berea abandons or terminates use of any pole or facility to which CATV has an attachment, it shall give CATV notice in writing to that effect at least thirty days (30) prior to the date on which it intends to abandon such use. At the expiration of said period, if Berea shall have no attachment or other use of the pole, but CATV shall not have removed its attachments therefrom, such pole shall thereupon become the sole property of CATV, and CATV shall save harmless Berea from all obligation, liability, damages, costs, expenses or charges incurred thereafter; and shall pay Berea for such pole at an amount equal to Berea's replacement cost less depreciation thereof. the necessary protective equipment needed to prevent damage to the system of Berea, injury to the personnel of Berea, or interference with Berea's consumers. Berea shall reserve the right to review CATV's proposed protective system, operating procedures and system characteristics in order to determine whether it significantly and adequately protects the system owned by Berea. If the operation of the attachments of CATV results in undesirable or harmful effects to the system of Berea, or to Berea's consumers, then in such event, Berea may require CATV to discontinue use until the circumstances have been corrected by installing appropriate attachments or otherwise.

Section 4.11 - Rights of Others.

Upon notice from Berea to CATV that the use of any pole or facility is forbidden by municipal or other public authority, or by property owners, the use of such pole or facility shall immediately terminate and CATV shall remove its facilities from the pole or poles immediately.

Section 4.12 - Terminations.

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(a) By prior notice, Berea may discontinue or disrupt CATV's attachments because of CATV's failure to comply with and adhere to these tariffs.

(b) Berea may refuse or discontinue service to a CATV under the conditions set out in 807 KAR 5:006, Section 11.

COGENERATION

SECTION 1

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1.01 - Applicability

These regulations are filed in compliance with 807 KAR 5:054, and shall govern and control the purchase of electric power and energy from qualifying facilities.

Section 1.02 - Definitions.

As used in these regulations, and unless otherwise defined, the following definitions shall apply.

- (a) "qualifying facility" or "Q.F." - is defined to include all of Producer's electric generation facilities and all interconnection and safety equipment owned by Producer and used in connection with the electric generation facilities owned by Producer which will produce electric power and energy for sale under this agreement.
- (b) "point of delivery and purchase" - is defined to be the point at which electric power and energy enters Berea Substation 1 or 2, or such other reasonable place as Berea may designate.
- (c) All those terms specifically defined in 807 KAR 5:054 and 18 C.F.R., part 292, when used in these regulations, shall have the same definitions as in the contract.

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Section 1.03 - Commission's Rules and Regulations.

All energy purchases from qualifying facilities shall be in accordance with the Public Service Commission law and the acts, rules, regulations and forms which have or may be adopted by the Public Service Commission, and all amendments thereto and modifications thereof which may be made by the Commission.

Section 1.04 - Berea's Rules and Regulations.

In addition to the rules and regulations prescribed by the Commission, all energy purchased from qualifying facilities shall also be in accordance with the rules and regulations adopted by Berea, provided that the same do not conflict with those of the Public Service Commission.

Section 1.05 - Application, Enforcement and Severability.

These regulations shall apply to all purchased energy transactions from qualifying facilities. The Utility Administrator of Berea, or his designated representative, shall administer and enforce these regulations. If any provision of these regulations or the application to any qualifying facility, supplying utility or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of these regulations or the application of such provisions to such other qualifying facilities or supplying utilities, or other circumstances shall not be effective.

SECTION 2

CONDITIONS OF PURCHASE

Section 2.01 - Purchases.

Subject and Pursuant to the regulations of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and the Public Service Commission, which are incorporated herein by reference, Berea shall purchase energy or capacity or both from qualifying facilities within its service area, who contract with Berea pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Standard Contract attached hereto.

Section 2.02 - Required Notice and Compliance.

Not less than 60 days prior to the proposed required purchases from any qualifying facility, such qualifying facility shall contact Berea advising as to:

(a) their criteria for qualification as a small power production facility and/or cogenerating facility as adopted by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, including title 18 CFR, parts 292.203, et seq., as published in the Federal Register on March 20, 1980, and further as adopted by the Public Service Commission in 807 KAR 5:054, Section 4, et seq;

(b) their compliance with the rules and regulations of Berea as concerns small power production and cogeneration facilities;

(c) their acceptance and execution of a Standard Form Contract in the form and nature of that contract attached to these regulations as Exhibit A; and

(d) the amount of energy or capacity or both to be delivered and sold to Berea, the nature, duration and time of such deliveries all to the end that such electric power and

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energy or capacity can be usefully integrated into Berea's system.

Section 2.03 - Exclusive Right to Purchase.

The qualifying facility shall not sell any generated energy or capacity or either to any other customer, company or person without the prior expressed written consent of Berea.

Section 2.04 - Billing Period.

Berea shall read the meters not less frequent than monthly. Electric power and energy furnished under this contract shall be paid for within thirty (30) days after the meters are read and bills are issued.

Section 2.05 - Rates.

Berea shall pay for the power and energy purchased from Producer upon the terms and conditions contained in the Standard Form Contract and Berea's tariff schedule for small power/cogeneration ("SPC"), which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, subject to any revision in such rate schedule that may from time to time be approved by the Kentucky Public Service Commission.

Section 2.06 - Terminations.

(a) Berea may discontinue purchases from Producer, without prior notice, during any system emergency, and/or at any time the energy from the Q.F. is affecting the stability of Berea's system voltage.

(b) By prior notice, Berea may break the interconnection between the Q.F. and the system of Berea for a

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reasonable period of time for the purpose of necessary inspections, modifications, repairs or other maintenance of the system, the interconnection facility or metering equipment.

(c) Berea reserves the right to terminate purchases when such purchases will result in a substantial cost increase greater than would occur if purchased from Berea's wholesale supplier.†

Section 2.07 - Hold Harmless and Indemnification.

Producer shall protect, indemnify and hold harmless Berea, its officers, agents, employees, representatives and contractors against and from all loss, claims, actions or suits, including costs and attorneys fees, for or on account of any injury or death of persons or damage to property caused by Producer or Producer's employees, agents, representatives and contractors in tampering with, repairing, maintaining or operating the O.F. or any facility owned by Berea except where such injury, death or damage was caused or contributed to by the fault of Berea, its employees, agents, representatives or contractors. The obligation to indemnify and hold harmless shall survive the termination of any agreement with respect to any act, occurrence or omission occurring prior to termination, whether or not then known or accrued.

Without regard to any negligence by any of the parties, to this agreement, Berea shall not be liable to Producer for any loss or damage to Producer's electric system or other property or any injury to Producer or Producer's employees, agents, contractors, representatives, licensees or invitees, including, without limitation, damage or injury caused by reclosing of the transmission or distribution system. Further, without regard to any negligence by any of the parties, Berea shall not be liable to Producer for any loss of profits,

revenues or any other indirect or consequential damage or injury to Producer resulting from interruption or partial interruption in the delivery of energy from Producer.

Section 2.08 - Taxes.

If there shall be imposed by federal, state, governmental authority or school system, any tax payable by Producer upon the gross revenue or earnings, or upon Producer's production or sale of electric energy, such additional tax or taxes shall be paid solely by Producer.

Section 2.09 - Nature of Energy.

Electric power and energy purchased shall be alternating current, single- or three-phase 60 hertz. The parties will agree upon the deliverage voltage in capacity prior to the commencement of any interconnection and purchase. The Q.F. shall at all times operate in such manner as to maintain a power factor of not less than 90%.

Section 2.10 - Power of Delivery.

Berea shall take and purchase all of the power and electric energy produced by a qualifying facility that is delivered to Berea at the point of delivery and purchase. The power and energy delivered by Producer and purchased by Berea shall be metered, computed and paid for in accordance with the terms of the contract negotiated between Berea and the qualifying facility. The qualifying facility shall, as a minimum, be responsible for computed line loss from the point of interconnection to the point of delivery and purchase.

SECTION 3

DESIGN, OWNERSHIP AND MAINTENANCE OF FACILITIES

Section 3.01 - Ownership, Design and Maintenance.

Producer shall have the sole responsibility for the design, construction, installation, ownership, safety, operation and maintenance of the Q.F. In designing, constructing, installing, operating and maintaining the Q.F., Producer shall comply with all the rules, regulations, policies, standards and codes generally recognized in the utility industry as applicable to such operations, including, but not limited to, the National Electric Safety Code, regulations of the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, all federal, state and local safety codes, statutes, regulations and ordinances now in existence or that may be adopted from time to time.

Section 3.02 - Interconnection Costs.

Producer shall pay Berea the "additional interconnection cost" as defined in 807 KAR 5:054, Subsection 6(6), as might be incurred by the Q.F. interconnecting with the distribution system of Berea.

Section 3.03 - Metering Equipment.

Producer shall pay for and Berea shall own and maintain the metering equipment Berea determines is necessary based upon the size and other characteristics of the Q.F. to measure the power and energy sold by Producer to Berea. All metering equipment shall accurately determine KWH hours supplied to the point of delivery and purchase as herein defined. Upon termination of any agreement, the meters and metering equipment will be returned to Producer, if requested, on an "as is, where is" basis. Cost of testing and bill adjustment shall be in compliance with 807 KAR 5:006, Subsection 9.

The original and any revision to the plans, specifications and operating characteristics for the Q.F. must be approved by Berea before Producer connects or continues its connection to Berea's system. Prior to energization of the interconnection between the Q.F. and Berea, Berea shall have the right to inspect the Q.F. for any purpose. Inspection and acceptance of any plan, design theory, specification or operating characteristic observed or provided shall not be construed as confirming or endorsing the design, or as warranting the safety, durability and/or reliability of the Q.F. Berea shall not, by reason of any review, acceptance, inspection or failure to review or inspect, be responsible to the Q.F., including, but not limited to, the strength, safety, details of design, adequacy, capacity, nor shall acceptance or approval be construed as an endorsement of any Q.F.

Section 3.05 - Interconnection Easements.

Producer shall be solely responsible for the furnishing and paying for any and all rights-of-way and easements necessary to install, operate, maintain, replace and remove the interconnection facility and the metering equipment. Duly authorized representatives of Berea shall be permitted to enter the premises of Producer at all reasonable times as may be necessary in connection with the proper performance of the terms and conditions of this agreement. Producer shall install, own and maintain the necessary substation equipment at the point of interconnection to the system of Berea.

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protective equipment needed to prevent damage to the system owned by Berea, injury to the personnel of Berea, or interference with Berea's consumers. Berea shall reserve the right to review Producer's proposed protective system, operating procedures and system characteristics in order to determine whether the operation of the Q.F. will have an impact on the system owned by Berea. The following areas shall be included in the review for possible defects: fault protection; voltage regulation and balance; grounding; synchronizing systems; disconnect and isolation systems; flicker; and harmonics.
