Meters

17. METER TESTS

All new meters shall be checked for accuracy before installation. The Cooperative will, at its own expense, make periodic tests and inspections of its meters in order to maintain a high standard of accuracy and to conform with the regulations of the Public Service Commission. The Cooperative will make additional tests of meters at the request of the member upon payment of a fee of \$2.00 (two dollars) paid in advance. When the test made at the member's request shows that the meter is accurate, within 2% slow or fast, no adjustment will be made to the member's bill and the fee paid will be forfeited to help cover cost of requested test. When the test shows the meter to be in excess of 2% fast an adjustment shall be made to the member's bill by recalculating the monthly bills. Refunds will be made in accordance with Public Service Commission's Rules and Regulations, (Electric, 807 KAR 2:050, Section 15 (5)) and the cost of testing the meter found to be inaccurate shall be borne by the cooperative. The \$2.00 fee paid by the member shall be refunded. (T)

18. FAILURE OF METER TO REGISTER

In the event a member's meter should fail to register, the member shall be billed from the date of such failure at the average consumption of the member based on the three-month period immediately preceding the failure.

19. DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE BY COOPERATIVE

The cooperative may refuse to connect or discontinue service to a member for the violation of any of its rules and regulations. The cooperative may discontinue service to a member for the theft of current or the appearance of a current-theft device on the premises of the member. The discontinuance of service by the cooperative for any cause stated in this rule does not release the member of his obligation of all bills due.

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20. THREE PHASE SERVICE

Consumers are required to negotiate a contract for all three-phase service except as otherwise provided herein. Term of contract is determined by amount of investment required. (T)

be required. In the event the person occupying the premises is a renter a \$5.00 prepayment will be required in addition to the membership fee.

- (d) In cases of mobile home trailers, the consumer will in all cases pay a \$5.00 membership fee. If consumer does not own property, a \$5.00 prepayment in addition to the \$5.00 membership fee is required. No connect fee is charged if it is a new connect.

Mobile home owners have the option of being supplied a standard 50 amp. plug-in type service for \$30.00 or a 100 amp. plug-in type service for \$50.00, including material and labor. This is being done in order to facilitate mobile home owners in a quick hook-up, but this will not be done until the \$30 or \$50 is paid. Inspection is required on all wiring done by applicant or his electrician.

- (e) Signs - in cases of sign lighting, if it is an established firm, no deposit of any nature will be required except membership fee.

Only one membership shall be required for each service. The membership fee or consumer prepayment shall be refunded if all financial obligations are paid, or shall be applied against any unpaid bills of the member at the time service is discontinued. This will automatically terminate the membership.

10. RIGHT OF ACCESS

The cooperative's identified employee shall have access to member's premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of reading meter, testing, repairing, removing, or exchanging any and all equipment belonging to the cooperative.

11. NOTICE OF TROUBLE

Consumer shall give immediate notice at the office of the cooperative of any interruptions, or irregularities, or unsatisfactory service, and of any defects known to consumer. Cooperative may at any time it deems necessary, suspend supply of electrical energy to any consumer or consumers for the purpose of making repairs, changes, or improvements upon any part of its system. Cooperative shall make reasonable notice of such discontinuance to consumer.

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18. FAILURE OF METER TO REGISTER

In the event a member's meter should fail to register, the member shall be billed from the date of such failure at the average consumption of the member based on the three-month period immediately preceding the failure.

19. DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE BY COOPERATIVE

The cooperative may refuse to connect or discontinue service to a member for the violation of any of its rules and regulations. The cooperative may discontinue service to a member for the theft of current or the appearance of a current-theft device on the premises of the member. The discontinuance of service by the cooperative for any cause stated in this rule does not release the member of his obligation of all bills due.

20. THREE PHASE SERVICE

Consumers are required to negotiate a contract for all three-phase service except as otherwise provided herein. Term of contract is determined by amount of investment required and usually ranges from one to five years.

Consumers classified as Commercial and Industrial receiving three-phase service are billed on rates provided in LP schedules as filed with the Public Service Commission

Consumers classified as Farm and Home receiving three-phase service are billed on Farm and Home rate. However, the consumer will sign a contract providing necessary surety that they will purchase an annual amount of electricity equal to three percent per month of investment incurred in extending this service, this guaranteed usage of power to extend for a period of three years, after which the cooperative's regular monthly minimum will apply. The member's present annual consumption may be applied against this requirement provided all consumption is measured through one meter. It should be noted that members using motors of less than 7½ h.p. for chores are encouraged to use single-phase service because the cooperative's lines are adequate and the board feels in the long run the member would be better off.

Consumers classified as Schools, Churches and Public Buildings receiving three-phase service are billed on Schools, Churches and Public Buildings rate.

21. PRIMARY METERING

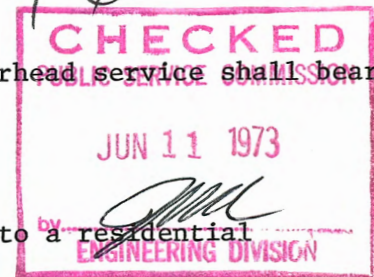
At any time the cooperative finds it more desirable, it may at its own option and expense install primary metering equipment. The consumer will own and operate all facilities past the metering point.

22. UNDERGROUND SERVICE - Individual

Consumers desiring underground service from existing overhead service shall bear all cost in excess of normal cost of service.

UNDERGROUND SERVICE - Residential Subdivision

The Company will install underground distribution lines to a residential subdivision under the following conditions:



1. The subdivision being developed must consist of a tract of land which is divided into ten (10) or more lots for the construction of new residential buildings or the land on which is constructed two (2) or more new multiple occupancy building (refer to PSC Electric Rules, Appendix A for definitions of terms).

21. PRIMARY METERING

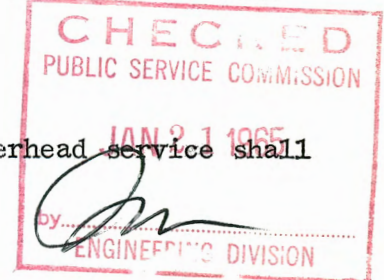
At any time the cooperative finds it more desirable, it may at its own option and expense install primary metering equipment. The consumer will own and operate all facilities past the metering point.

22. UNDERGROUND SERVICE

Consumers desiring underground service from existing overhead service shall bear all cost in excess of normal cost of service.

23. HOUSE WIRING AND INSPECTION

The consumer is charged \$4.00 for wiring inspection for all single and three-phase installations. Inspection fees are due and payable at the cooperative office at the time meter socket is secured. All wiring installations are inspected and approved by the State Electric Inspection Bureau, according to the rules and regulations of the National Board of Fire Underwriters and the

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2. Developer or owner of subdivision (shall) or (may be required) to advance to the Company an amount equal to an "estimated average cost differential," if any, between the average or representative cost of underground distribution systems in residential subdivisions and of equivalent overhead distribution systems within the utility service areas. If the amount deposited exceeds the normal charge for underground extensions, the amount in excess shall be refunded. (Over a ten year period as provided in amended PSC Rule-1-X-3.) 1/20
3. The Company will construct underground distribution facilities in the subdivision adequate to render single phase 120/240 Volt service.
4. Three phase primary mains or feeders required within a subdivision to supply local distribution or to serve individual three phase loads may be overhead unless underground is required by governmental authorities or chosen by applicant, in either of which case the differential cost of underground shall be borne by the applicant.
5. Developer or successor in title shall grant a right-of-way satisfactory to the Company for the installation, operation and maintenance of its underground facilities.
6. For all developments that do not meet the conditions set forth in paragraph 1 above, underground distribution will be installed provided an advance to the Company is made in the amount equal to the difference between the Company's estimated cost of underground facilities and overhead facilities, which it would otherwise provide.
7. Estimated cost differential per foot of conductor for residential service \$.20 .
Estimated cost differential per foot of conductor for primary service (if applicable) \$ 1.73 .

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The consumer is charged \$4.00 for wiring inspection for all single and three-phase installations. Inspection fees are due and payable at the cooperative office at the time meter socket is secured. All wiring installations are inspected and approved by the State Electric Inspection Bureau, according to the rules and regulations of the National Board of Fire Underwriters and the

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Meter cards are mailed to all other consumers on the nineteenth of each month, in order to reach consumers by the twenty-second. Upon failure of consumers to return the meter reading card for two consecutive months the Cooperative shall have its representative read the member's meter and a service charge of \$2.00 will be made for the extra service rendered. The service charge will be made to the member's account and will be due and payable upon notice of said charge. In the event that an error in meter reading should be made then the member shall pay for that month an amount equal to approximately his average bill. The following month his bill shall be computed on the regular schedule prorated for two months, and the amount paid shall be credited.

26. RATES

Billing shall be prepared on basis of rates approved by Board of Directors and Public Service Commission.

27. UNPAID CHECKS FROM CONSUMERS

27. DELINQUENTS

In case a delinquent bill is uncollected, and service disconnected by reason thereof, then payment may be required of all amounts due by such consumer before reconnection.

Classification of Consumers

28. FARM AND HOME CONSUMERS

Each separate house or other living quarters occupied as a distinct household is considered a "Farm and Home" consumer. Consumers classifying under this classification shall be billed under rate schedule "A".

When electricity supplied through a single meter is used for both residential and commercial purposes, classification shall be made according to principal use.

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29. COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL CONSUMERS

Commercial or industrial consumers with either a single or three-phase service, who require a transformer capacity of 50 KVA or less shall be classified as Commercial and Industrial Consumers, and be billed under rate schedule "B-1".

30. LARGE POWER

Commercial or industrial consumers requiring a transformer capacity of more than 50 KVA, either single-phase or three-phase, shall be classified as Large Power and be billed either under rate schedule Commercial "B-2", "LP-1", or "LP-2", whichever is beneficial to consumer.

31. SERVICE TO SCHOOLS, CHURCHES, AND PUBLIC BUILDINGS

Schools, churches, fraternal lodges, and other small non-profit community welfare institutions shall qualify under this classification and be billed under rate schedule "C".
