Rural and Urban Extension Plans

1. For Residential and Small Commercial Applicants

A. Extensions and services will be constructed when funds, equipment, system capacity and personnel are available, to serve any applicant in above category anywhere within the electric system's service area subject to the following limitations:

1. Transformer and low voltage circuit capacity shall be limited to a maximum of 5 Kva per applicant.
2. Total average monthly revenue guarantee per mile of line required for any project shall not be less than \$18.00.
3. Individual extension mileage shall be limited to an average of 0.25 per mile per applicant.
4. Minimum Monthly Revenue Guarantee per applicant shall be not less than \$1.50 for 36 months or until average monthly revenue for entire system (Ky. and Tenn.) from above class of consumers shall exceed \$60.00 per mile of line in service whichever is later. (See definitions.)
5. All right-of-way shall be donated or furnished by consumer or by the property owners at no cost to Jellico Electric System.
6. Premise to be served must be of such nature as to be considered requiring permanent electric service.

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B. Extensions and services for above class of applicants not qualifying under A above shall be constructed under the following conditions when funds, equipment, system capacity and personnel are available.

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where more than 5 Kva of transformer and low voltage circuit capacity is required per applicant such applicant shall be required to pay a monthly minimum bill above that specified in A above of \$0.50 per Kva of additional capacity required so long as the service is in use.

2. Where the individual extension mileage exceeds 0.25 mi. per applicant, the applicant/(s) shall contribute for construction of the extension as follows:

(a). If mileage does not exceed 0.40 miles per applicant, applicant/(s) may, if they wish, contribute all labor for clearing right-of-way, hole digging, and other work they can do. Such contribution will be accepted by Jellico Electric System as the total contribution required. If applicant/(s) wish to contribute cash, see (b) below.

(b). Where extension mileage exceeds 0.40 miles per applicant, applicant/(s) will be required to contribute the actual cost of the mileage in excess of 0.25 miles per applicant. Such contribution may be in the form of labor at prevailing wage rates for the class of labor supplied. For extensions within the limits of (a) above and applicants wish to contribute cash, the amount will be determined as shown immediately above.

(c). Refunds shall be made to applicants contributing per (a) or (b) above as follows: For each additional customer served from an extension for which a contribution was required under (a) or (b) above, the average miles of line per customer shall be re-determined and excess contribution, if any, refunded in proportion to amount contributed by the various customers involved. Labor contributions under (a) or (b) shall be recorded at the Systems prevailing wage rate for the class of labor furnished.

3. Minimum Average Monthly Revenue Guarantee per mile and per applicant shall be as in A above except as amended by B-1 above.

4. For premise not meeting requirements of A-6 above applicant shall advance estimated amount of labor and trans-

portation for installing and removing service if extension does not exceed 0.25 mi., said amount to be refunded at rate of 20% of annual billing.

11. For Large Commercial and Industrial Applicants

A. Extensions and Services will be constructed to serve such applicants anywhere within the Electric System's Service Area when equipment, personnel and system capacity are available subject to the following conditions:

1. The Applicant will be required to contract for service for a minimum period of one year except in cases of carnivals, road shows and other similar temporary installations which will be required to contract for service for a minimum period of one month.

<p>2. Applicants who contract for service for one or more years shall be required to advance the total estimated cost of providing the service. In such cases the advance will be adjusted to actual costs after completion of construction and will be partially or entirely refunded over the period of the contract subject to the terms of the contract.</p>	
<p>3. Applicants who contract for temporary service will be required to advance the total estimated cost of installing and removing facilities required to provide service plus the estimated cost of the service and any materials or equipment destroyed or damaged in making the installation. Upon termination of the service actual costs will be determined and settled by refund of excess advance or payment of excess costs as required.</p>	
<p>4. Minimum monthly bills for this class of service will be determined by dividing the total estimated cost of the installation by 60 (months) or by application of the appropriate rate minimum-<sup>10-23-67</sup>whichever is greater-except in cases requiring Jellico Electric System to obtain increased supply capacity from TVA under special minimum contract provision in which event applicant will be required to protect Jellico Electric System against loss from such contract provision.</p>	
<p><b>III. Definitions</b></p>	
<p>1. Residential Applicant- One who qualifies for electric service under rate schedule B-1A.</p>	
<p>2. Small Commercial Applicant- One who qualifies for electric service under Rate Schedule BC and whose monthly demand does not exceed 20 Kva.</p>	
<p>3. Large Commercial Applicant- One who qualifies for electric service under Rate Schedule BC and whose monthly demand exceeds 20 Kva.</p>	
<p>4. Monthly Revenue Guarantee- Total of all contract minimum bills for one or more persons on a given extensions or group of extensions.</p>

Definitions - (Continued)

- 5. Individual Extensions-One continuous section of an electric distribution line including branch line and services.
- 6. Extension Mileage-Total length in miles of one continuous section of electric distribution line including branch lines and services.
- 7. Average Monthly Revenue-For entire system from residential and small commercial consumers shall be determined as follows:

$$(\text{Revenue A} \div \text{Revenue B}) \div \text{Miles of line}$$

Revenue A-Total Revenue derived from electric sales to residential consumers in Kentucky and Tennessee during any complete fiscal year following completion of the project or extensions for which the determination is being made.

Revenue B-Ditto Revenue A except from sales to small commercial consumers.

Miles of Line-Average total miles of line in service during the fiscal year under consideration as shown by distribution lines mileage reports to TVA.

Applicable:

All territories served.

Availability of Service:

Available for outdoor lighting service for a term of not less than one year for street lighting systems, park lighting, signal systems, athletic field lighting installations (on an off-peak basis), and outdoor lighting for individual customers.

Payment:

The rates set forth below are net, the gross rates being 10 percent higher. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within 10 days from date of bill, the gross rates shall apply.

Service under this schedule is subject to Rules and Regulations of Distributor.

Rates:

PART A--RATES FOR STREET AND PARK LIGHTING, SIGNAL SYSTEMS, AND ATHLETIC FIELD LIGHTING INSTALLATIONS.

Energy Charge\*

First 250 kwh used per month @ .....	3¢ per kwh
Next 750 kwh used per month @ .....	2¢ per kwh
Next 1000 kwh used per month @ .....	1¢ per kwh
Excess over 2,000 kwh used per month @ .....	0.3¢ per kwh

\*For athletic field lighting, the energy charge is subject to Distributor's sur-charge.

Investment Charge:

The annual investment charge shall be 12 per-  
cent of the installed cost to Distributor's electric  
system of the facilities devoted to the lighting ser-  
vice specified in this Part A. The investment charge  
will be recomputed on July 1 of each year, or more  
often if substantial changes are made, and one-twelfth  
of the total annual charge so computed will be billed  
Customer monthly. If any part of the facilities has  
not been provided at the electric system's expense,  
the annual investment charge for such part shall be  
only 6 percent of the installed cost of such part,  
except that if the installed cost of any portion there-  
of is reflected on the books of another municipality  
or agency or department the investment charge for such  
portion will be 2 percent per annum and retirements  
and additions thereto will be made by the electric  
system and charged to such other municipality, agency,  
or department.

Athletic field lighting installations shall  
not be provided, owned, or maintained by or at the ex-  
pense of Distributor's electric system. Only the  
facilities necessary to provide service to such in-  
stallations shall be provided by or at the expense of  
the electric system, and the applicable annual invest-  
ments charge provided for above shall apply to the  
installed cost of such facilities.

Lamp Replacements: Street lighting, park lighting, and  
signal systems only.

Distributor shall keep a record of the number  
and type of lamps and related glassware repaired  
and shall bill Customer monthly for such repairs  
during each month at Distributor's cost of materials,  
including appropriate storeroom expense.

Metering:

When the energy for street, park, and signal lighting service is metered at more than one point, the readings shall be consolidated for billing purposes. When the energy is not metered and also when a meter reading is found to be in error, the energy for billing purposes shall be computed from the rated capacity of the lamps plus 5 percent for losses, multiplied by the number of hours of use.

Off-Peak Period:

Service to athletic field lighting installations shall be limited to an off-peak period determined by Distributor, commencing no earlier than 7 p.m. Customer may be permitted to use up to ten percent (not to exceed 10 kilowatts) of the total installed lighting capacity prior to commencement of the off-peak period, such use to be considered off-peak for billing purposes. In the event Customer fails to restrict service in accordance with these requirements, he shall be billed under the appropriate lighting and power rate.

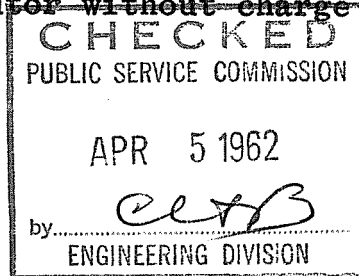

This part is limited to service from standard street lighting fixtures at locations designated by Customer. The fixtures shall be photoelectrically controlled singly or in groups at the option of Distributor. If the number of poles required to be installed to serve the fixture or fixtures from Distributor's nearest available source exceeds the number of fixtures to be installed, a monthly charge of 50 cents per pole shall be made for such excess poles. The foregoing rate is subject to revision on January 1 and July 1 of each year based on changes in costs of providing service under this rate.

Lamp Replacements

Replacements of burned out lamps will be accomplished in accordance with schedules and replacement policies of Distributor ~~without charge~~ to Customer.



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
