Should it be the desire of the developer to develop the subdivision by sections, it is recognized that the utility would be required to make expenditures (heavier conductor, and in instances three-phase lines) in advance of their immediate requirements to serve the other portions of the subdivision at a future date, or until the developer desires to complete the undeveloped area, under these conditions, the utility would charge an amount not to exceed .31 1/2 cents per foot for three phase primary lines, and .21 1/2 cents per foot for single phase primary lines installed initially. This amount will be paid by the developer in advance of construction, and is not refundable.

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
