



SECTION VI - BILLING (Cont'd)

The Company may issue interim bills based on average normal usage instead of determining actual usage by reading the meter. Interim bills may also be used when access to Company's meter cannot be obtained or emergency conditions exist.

Interim bills will be considered payable by the due date and if not then paid will be handled in the same manner as all other bills; provided however, partial payment of at least one-half of the interim bill, in addition to full payment of any unpaid service charges previously billed and other billed items, will avoid the delayed payment charge on the interim bill.

The company will continue monthly meter reading upon a customer's request.

- (I) 25. Charge for Restoring Service for Non-Payment of Bill and Unlawful Use of Service.  
Company may charge and collect in advance the sum of five dollars (\$5.00) for reconnecting a customer's service after service is disconnected because of non-payment of bill when due. In case service is discontinued because of fraudulent use thereof Company may charge and collect the sum of five dollars (\$5.00) and in addition thereto the expenses incurred by Company by reason of such fraudulent use, together with an estimated bill for gas used before the service is reconnected. If both gas and electric services are reconnected at one time the total charge shall be eight dollars (\$8.00).

- (I) 26. Temporary Discontinuance of Service.  
If any residential customer, because of absence or otherwise, shall notify Company in writing to discontinue service, Company will make no minimum charge for any full meter reading period during the period of discontinuance; provided however, that Company may charge and collect the sum of five dollars (\$5.00) prior to reconnecting a service which was discontinued at customer's request within the preceding twelve months.

SECTION VII - DEPOSITS

27. Deposits.  
Company maintains the right at any time to require customer to make a reasonable deposit in advance to secure the prompt payment of bills, as provided by law.

SECTION VIII - APPLICATION

28. Application of Service Regulations and Rate Schedules.  
All Service Agreements at present in effect or that may be entered into in the future are made expressly subject to these Service Regulations and any modifications hereof that may be lawfully made, and subject to all applicable existing Rate Schedules and any lawfully made changes therein, substitutions therefor or additions thereto.

29. Agents Cannot Modify Agreement.  
No agent has the right to amend, modify or alter the application rates, terms, conditions, rules or regulations as filed with the Public Service Commission of Kentucky, or to make any promise or representation not contained in the Company's schedules, supplements thereto and revisions thereof, lawfully filed with said Commission.

SECTION IX - GAS SPACE HEATING REGULATIONS

30. Gas Space Heating Regulations.  
a. The Company shall not be required to supply gas for new or additional space heating equipment installed from and after the effective date hereof unless the consumer present or prospective, makes written application to the Company for such supply at a specific address and receives written approval from the Company therefor. An approval for the use of gas for space heating is not transferable from one premise to another except by written approval from the Company.  
b. If any consumer fails to install gas-fired space heating equipment pursuant to said approval within one year from the date of issuance thereof fails to demonstrate to the Company's satisfaction before the expiration of said period that he intends to avail himself of the use of such gas under such approval with due diligence, the Company may cancel, nullify and void such approval.  
c. The Company need not issue an approval for the utilization of gas for space heating purposes in a commercial or industrial building for new or additional heating equipment having a total rated input capacity in excess of 1,000,000 Btu per hour, unless the applicant shall install standby facilities having a capacity satisfactory to the Company and shall agree in writing with the Company to use such standby facilities and discontinue the use of gas for space heating when and for such periods of time as the Company may request. In the event the use of gas for space heating by such consumer is not promptly discontinued at the request of the Company, the latter, upon discovery thereof, is authorized to discontinue all gas service to such consumer until such time as the gas space heating equipment has been disconnected. Where such action is necessary on the part of the Company it may cancel, nullify and void such approval.  
d. Should any consumer fail to comply with these gas space heating regulations, the Company, upon discovery thereof, and after giving ten days notice to such consumer, is authorized to disconnect his gas service until such time as these regulations are complied with.

MAIN EXTENSION POLICY

(N) TEMPORARY SUSPENSION

This MAIN EXTENSION POLICY has been temporarily suspended by Order of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky dated January 26, 1973 in Case No. 5760. The sale of natural gas is restricted and limited as set forth on Sheet No. 11 of the Company's tariff, P.S.C. Ky. No.2.

(N) AVAILABILITY

Available in entire territory to which schedule P.S.C. Ky. No. 2 applies.

(N) APPLICABILITY

Applicable to gas service supplied in accordance with provisions of the appropriate rate currently in effect, from the nearest available distribution main when it is necessary to extend such main.

(N) EXTENSION PLAN

1. Normal Extensions. An extension of one hundred (100) feet or less shall be made by the Company to an existing distribution main without charge for a prospective customer who shall apply for and contract to use service for one year or more and provides guarantee for such service.
2. Other Extensions. When an extension of the Company's main to serve an applicant or group of applicants amounts to more than one hundred (100) feet per customer, the Company will require the total cost of the excessive footage over one hundred (100) feet per customer to be deposited with the Company by the applicant or the applicants, based on the average estimated cost per foot of the total extension.

Each customer receiving service under such extension will be reimbursed under the following plan:

Each year for a period of not less than ten (10) years which, for the purpose of this extension plan shall be the refund period, the Company shall refund to the customer or customers who paid for the excessive footage, the cost of the one hundred (100) feet of the extension in place for each additional customer connected during the year whose service line is directly connected to the extension installed and not to extensions or laterals therefrom, but in no case shall the total amount refunded exceed the amount paid the Company. After the end of the refund period no refund will be required to be made.

3. An applicant desiring an extension to a proposed real estate subdivision may be required to pay the entire cost of the extension. Each year for a period of not less than ten (10) years the Company shall refund to the applicant, who paid for the extension, a sum equivalent to the cost of one hundred (100) feet of the extension installed for each additional customer connected during the year but in no case shall the total amount refunded exceed the amount paid to the Company. After the end of the refund period from the completion of the extension no refund will be required to be made.
4. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prohibit the Company from making extensions under different arrangements provided such arrangements have been approved by the Public Service Commission of Kentucky.
5. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as to prohibit the Company from making, at its expense, greater extensions than herein prescribed, should its judgement so dictate, provided like free extensions are made to other customers under similar conditions.
6. Upon complaint to and investigation by the Public Utility Commission of Kentucky, the Company may be required to construct extensions greater than one hundred (100) feet upon a finding by the Commission that such extension is reasonable.

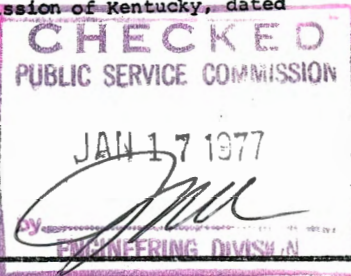

GAS COST ADJUSTMENT

APPLICABLE TO ALL FIRM SALES

A. Change in Rate

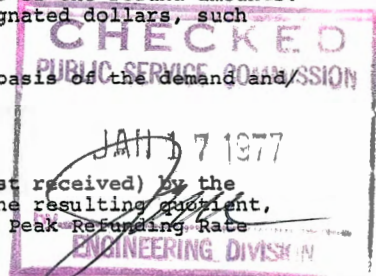
Whenever a change occurs in the rates of a major supplier of the Company, the Company shall submit to the Public Service Commission of Kentucky as soon as practicable an Application setting forth the change in cost of gas per MCF of the Company's gas sales which shall be determined as follows:

- (1) The effect per MCF sales of a change in cost of gas shall be determined by:
  - (a) applying the currently effective tariffs to:
    - (i) the Company's most recent billing demands, applicable to each such respective tariff, and
    - (ii) the average monthly volume of gas purchased, applicable to each such respective tariff, by the Company during the most recently available 12 month period after the deduction of off peak gas sales including unaccounted for gas in proportion to total sales.
  - (b) adding to the cost of gas purchased as determined in (a) above the average monthly cost of propane feed stock used during the most recent 12 month period for which data is available in the production of gas, less the cost of propane feed stock used in the manufacture of gas for sales to interruptible, off peak or otherwise non-firm customers, in order to avert penalties or curtailment of firm customers when gas requirements might exceed allowable daily seasonal or annual volumes taken from its suppliers.
  - (c) reducing the total average monthly cost, as determined in (a) and (b) above, by the average monthly cost of firm gas sold to The Cincinnati Gas & Electric Company under The Union Light, Heat and Power Company's Tariff X-5.
  - (d) dividing the average monthly cost of gas calculated in (a), (b) and (c) above by the average monthly volume of gas sales during the twelve month period after the deduction of off peak sales and sales under other special contracts, comparing the resulting quotient to the pro forma average cost per MCF of firm gas sales as of the effective date of these proposed rates. The difference so derived to the nearest 0.1 cent shall represent the effect of change(s) in gas cost per MCF of sales.
- (2) The rates as stated in the applicable rate sheets shall be decreased or increased, with gas delivered to customers on and after the effective date of a change in tariffs, by application of a Gas Cost Adjustment for the combined decrease or increase in cost of gas as determined in (1) above and approved by the Commission. When meter readings are not available the gas volume for the meter reading period will be prorated by the number of days in the period.

B. Refund Adjustment

When accumulated refunds received by the Company from its gas suppliers are sufficient to indicate that a change in Refunding Rate per MCF will occur, the Company will:

- (1) Summarize the demand, commodity and interest received portions of the refund amounts. Should a refund amount be received by the Company with undesignated dollars, such amount shall be treated as a commodity portion.
- (2) Allocate the interest as between commodity and demand on the basis of the demand and/or commodity portion of dollars received.
- (3) Calculate the Off Peak Refunding Rate per MCF as follows:
  - (a) divide the commodity portion (including allocated interest received) by the total MCF of gas sales for the prior 12 month period. The resulting quotient, rounded to the nearest 0.1 cent, shall represent the Off Peak Refunding Rate per MCF.
  - (b) calculate the total refund for off peak customers by multiplying the Off Peak Refunding Rate per MCF times the total prior 12 month period MCF off-peak sales.

(4) Calculate the Firm Use Refunding Rate per MCF as follows:

- (a) deduct from the total refund dollars received by Company the total refund due the off peak customers as calculated in (3) (b) above to determine the portion of the refund applicable to firm sales. Divide the firm sales portion (including allocated interest received and any amounts carried forward from prior refunds) by the total MCF of gas sales, less sales to off peak and other special contract customers, for the prior 12 month period. The resulting quotient, rounded to the nearest 0.1 cent, shall represent the Firm Use Refunding Rate per MCF.
- (b) reduce the rate as stated in the applicable rate sheets by subtracting the Firm Use Refunding Rate per MCF from the Gas Cost Adjustment per MCF to develop a Net Rate Adjustment per MCF to be applied to firm gas sales until the total net refund determined above, less the amount applicable to interdepartmental sales, has been substantially distributed. The refund amount applicable to interdepartmental sales shall be determined by application of the Firm Use Refunding Rate per MCF to the interdepartmental sales volume for the prior 12-month period.
- (c) amounts not distributed or amounts over distributed under (b) above, due to the impracticability of distributing the exact amount of the total net refund available, shall be carried forward and added to, if under distributed, or subtracted from, if over distributed, future refunds and distributed as provided in (4) (a) and (b) above.
- (d) Company may use its discretion in determining whether to initiate a new effective Refunding Rate or to extend the refund period at current rates where the Refunding Rate determined in (4) (a) above is less than 0.1¢ per MCF or where a short term variation in the Net Rate Adjustment per MCF can be avoided in consideration of a recent or impending change either in the Gas Cost Adjustment or Refunding Rate.

(5) Credit interest as directed by the Commission.

C. Major Supplier Defined

For the purpose of this Gas Cost Adjustment, a major supplier shall include all historic gas sources and that source of non-historic supply from Columbia LNG Corporation, known as the Green Springs Reforming Plant (Synthetic Gas); however, non-historic sources, without further authorization shall be limited to said Synthetic Gas.

D. Base Rate

For the future application of this Gas Cost Adjustment clause the base rate for firm gas is \$1.5002 per MCF.

AVAILABILITY

The Union Light, Heat and Power Company (hereinafter called Company) shall restrict and limit its sales of natural gas effective immediately and continuing until the further Order of the Public Service Commission of Kentucky, in the following manner:

- (a) Company shall not serve the requirements of any new applicants for industrial or commercial gas service and shall deny applications for increased requirements of any existing industrial or commercial customer;
  - (b) Company shall not serve the requirements of any new residential customers, except those who have applied for and are actually ready for the initiation of gas service prior to March 1, 1973;
  - (c) Notwithstanding the foregoing, Company will honor commitments made by it prior to January 26, 1973, for gas service to any residential customer;
  - (d) The Company will continue to accept applications for gas service to all potential customers, holding such applications on file according to date received;
  - (e) The Company, in conjunction with its TEMPORARY AVAILABILITY SHEET, hereby temporarily suspends its MAIN EXTENSION POLICY as stated on Second Revised Sheet No. 6 of P.S.C. Ky. No. 2.
- (N) Applications for re-establishment of gas service to an existing premise or for the transfer of gas service to a new or existing premise shall comply with the following:
- (a) To re-establish gas service to an existing premise, a written application must be made within five (5) years from the date that gas service was discontinued to that premise. Such application shall be subject to the following conditions: (i) gas service must be restored within twenty-four (24) months from the date of Company's written approval of the application; (ii) the volume of gas service shall not exceed the highest annual volume of gas used in the last five (5) years that gas service was rendered to such premise; and (iii) the load profile of gas service must remain the same or similar to that used during the last five (5) years that gas service was rendered to such premise.
  - (b) To transfer gas service from an existing premise, which is using or had used gas service, to another existing premise or a new premise, a written application must be made within five (5) years from the date that gas service was discontinued to that premise. Such application shall be subject to the following conditions: (i) the existing premise and the premise to which the gas service is to be transferred must be owned by the same person; (ii) all gas burning equipment and all visible gas piping related to the gas service transferred, must be removed; (iii) Company approval of such removal, upon a visual inspection, must be obtained; (iv) Company's inspection fee, based upon time consumed in inspection, must be paid; (v) the load profile of the gas service after transfer must be the same or similar to that rendered the former premise; (vi) gas service must be transferred and used within twenty-four (24) months after Company's written approval of the application; and (vii) all costs associated with the transfer of such gas service must be paid by the applicant. Applications for transfer of gas service for process loads may be made by tenants so long as the applicant complies with the above requirements, except condition (i).

If, on the basis of evidence available to it, the Company concludes that a customer has violated one or more of the above or other Company service regulations dealing with unauthorized use of gas service, it will give notice in writing to the customer of the indicated violation(s) at the customer's address or at the location served, and will undertake to arrange a conference to effect a satisfactory resolution. If customer fails or refuses to appear at such a conference under reasonable conditions and within a reasonable time, Company shall suspend all of his gas service until corrective action has been taken. If, pursuant to such conference, one or more violations are found to have occurred, and if, at or after said conference, the customer fails or refuses to correct or discontinue said violation(s), such customer's gas service will be subject to termination upon 15 days further written notice.

A. Change in Rate

Whenever a change occurs in the rates of a major supplier of the Company, the Company shall submit to the Public Service Commission of Kentucky as soon as practicable an Application setting forth the change in the commodity cost of gas per MCF of the Company's gas sales which shall be determined as follows:

- (1) The effect per MCF sales of a change in the commodity cost of gas shall be determined by:
  - (a) applying the currently effective tariffs to the average monthly volume of gas purchased, applicable to each such respective tariff, by the Company during the most recently available 12 month period.
  - (b) reducing the total average monthly commodity cost, as determined in (a) above, by the average monthly commodity cost of gas sold to The Cincinnati Gas & Electric Company under The Union Light, Heat and Power Company's Tariff X-5.
  - (c) dividing the average monthly commodity cost of gas calculated in (a) and (b) above by the average monthly volume of gas sales during the twelve month period.
  - (d) dividing the average monthly cost of propane feed stock used during the most recent twelve month period, for which data is available, in the production of gas for sale to Off Peak Customers by the average monthly volume of off peak sales for such 12 month period.
  - (e) comparing the sum of the average costs calculated in (a), (b), (c) and (d) above, to the average cost of gas sales, calculated as of the effective date of this order and in accordance with paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (d) above. The difference so derived, shall be the Gas Cost Adjustment which represents the effect of change(s) in gas cost per MCF to off peak gas sold.
- (2) The rates as stated in the applicable rate sheets shall be decreased or increased, with gas delivered to customers on and after the effective date of a change in tariffs, by application of a Gas Cost Adjustment for the combined decrease or increase in cost of gas as determined in (1) above and approved by the Commission. When meter readings are not available the gas volume for the meter reading period will be prorated by the number of days in the period.

B. Refund Adjustment

When accumulated refunds received by the Company from its gas suppliers are sufficient to indicate that a change in Refunding Rate per MCF will occur, the Company will:

- (1) Summarize the demand, commodity and interest received portions of the refund amounts. Should a refund amount be received by the Company with undesignated dollars, such amount shall be treated as a commodity portion.
- (2) Allocate the interest as between commodity and demand on the basis of the demand and/or commodity portion of dollars received.
- (3) Calculate the Off Peak Refunding Rate per MCF as follows:
  - (a) divide the commodity portion (including allocated interest received) by the total MCF of gas sales for the prior 12 month period. The resulting quotient, rounded to the nearest 0.1 cent, shall represent the Off-Peak Refunding Rate per MCF.
  - (b) calculate the total refund for off peak customers by multiplying the Off Peak Refunding Rate per MCF times the total prior 12 month period MCF off peak sales.

(4) Calculate the Firm Use Refunding Rate per MCF as follows:

- (a) deduct from the total refund dollars received by Company the total refund due the off peak customers as calculated in (3) (b) above to determine the portion of the refund applicable to firm sales. Divide the firm sales portion (including allocated interest received and any amounts carried forward from prior refunds) by the total MCF of gas sales, less sales to off-peak and other special contract customers, for the prior 12 month period. The resulting quotient, rounded to the nearest 0.1 cent, shall represent the Firm Use Refunding Rate per MCF.
- (b) reduce the rate as stated in the applicable rate sheets by subtracting the Firm Use Refunding Rate per MCF from the Gas Cost Adjustment per MCF to develop a Net Rate Adjustment per MCF to be applied to firm gas sales until the total net refund determined above, less the amount applicable to interdepartmental sales, has been substantially distributed. The refund amount applicable to interdepartmental sales shall be determined by application of the Firm Use Refunding Rate per MCF to the interdepartmental sales volume for the prior 12 month period.
- (c) amounts not distributed or amounts over distributed under (b) above, due to the impracticability of distributing the exact amount of the total net refund available, shall be carried forward and added to, if under distributed, or subtracted from, if over distributed, future refunds and distributed as provided in (4) (a) and (b) above.
- (d) Company may use its discretion in determining whether to initiate a new effective Refunding Rate or to extend the refund period at current rates where the Refunding Rate determined in (4) (a) above is less than 0.1 cent per MCF or where a short term variation in the Net Rate Adjustment per MCF can be avoided in consideration of a recent or impending change either in the Gas Cost Adjustment or Refunding Rate.

(5) Credit interest as directed by the Commission.

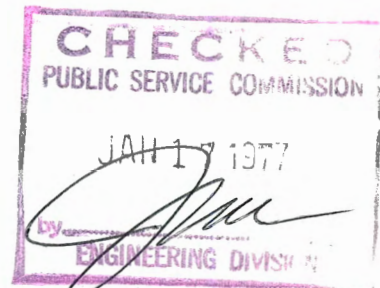
C. Major Supplier Defined

For the purpose of this Gas Cost Adjustment, a major supplier shall include all historic gas sources and that source of non-historic supply from Columbia LNG Corporation, known as the Green Springs Reforming Plant (Synthetic Gas); however, non-historic sources, without further authorization, shall be limited to said Synthetic Gas.

D. Base Rate

For the future application of this Gas Cost Adjustment clause the base rate for off peak gas is \$1.2043 per MCF.
