Hazard Gas Company is purchasing natural gas from Kentucky West Virginia Gas Company for distribution in Hazard, Kentucky, under contract dated August 30, 1957, as amended by letter dated September 4, 1963.

The agreements provide for deliveries from gas gathering pipe lines, and at the time the supplemental agreement was executed providing for a new delivery point upon our 4-inch gas gathering pipe line, Hazard Gas Company was informed that Kentucky West Virginia Gas Company must, at some future date, install a gas booster station in the area which would lower pressures in the gas gathering system. At that time discussions were had with Hazard Gas Company and the staff of the Public Service Commission, and these discussions were confirmed in letter to the Commission, copy to the Hazard Gas Company, dated October 3, 1963.

Kentucky West Virginia Gas Company plans to install a booster station in the Hazard area, and it is our estimate that the booster station will be operating by October 1, 1966. Initial compression at the booster station will lower our pipe line pressures in the area, including pressures at the delivery point of Hazard Gas Company, from approximately 250 psig to approximately 90 psig. In the long range future, the gas pressure at this point will be less than 90 psig. The length of time before this will occur depends upon the extent of new gas development in this general area. We will attempt to give you advance information regarding any further pressure reduction.

This letter is being written so that you may have time to give the matter consideration and make any necessary revisions in your distribution system to insure an adequate supply of gas.

If no meter is available a flat charge shall be made for the gas consumed at a rate of \$3.50 per 24 hour day.

Special Conditions:

The contract can be terminated at any time upon thirty days notice by either party of the contract or the duration of the drilling job. Gas shall be computed at a 10 ounce pressure basis above 14.6 pounds atmospheric pressure according to Boyle's law for the measurement of gas at varying pressures, without allowance for temperature and barometric conditions.
