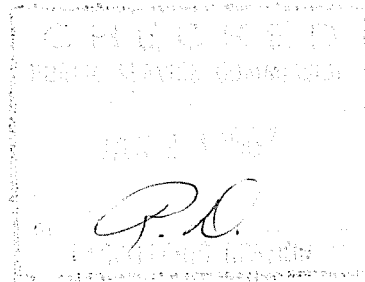
Conditions of Service

1. The consumer shall install and operate in regular use a standard approved storage type of electric water heater and shall have no non-electric household water heating device in use during any part of the year (such as heating coils in a fuel burning range or furnace.)

2. The standard approved type of water heater shall consist of an insulated tank of 30 gallons or more capacity, which has two thermostatically controlled, non-inductive heating elements of 20 watts per gallon of tank capacity in the lower element and 30 watts per gallon of tank capacity in the upper element, rounded off to the nearest commercial sizes of elements. The thermostats shall be so arranged to allow only one element to operate at a time. The lower element shall be placed to heat the whole tank and the upper element to heat only the upper part of the tank. The entire installation shall be subject to the approval of the cooperative including the wiring, tank size, tank insulation and capacity in watts of the heating elements.

3. Provision shall be made in the consumer's water heater wiring installation for an automatic control device which the cooperative may install at its discretion.

Determination of Billing Demand

The billing demand shall be the maximum kilowatt demand established by the consumer for any period of fifteen consecutive minutes during the month for which the bill is rendered, as indicated or recorded by a demand meter and adjusted for power factor as follows:

Power Factor Adjustment

The consumer agrees to maintain unity power factor as nearly as practicable. Demand charges will be adjusted for consumers with 50 KW or more of measured demand to correct for average power factors lower than 90%, and may be so adjusted for other consumers if and when the Seller deems necessary. Such adjustments will be made by increasing the measured demand 1% for each 1% by which the average power factor is less than 90% lagging.

Minimum Monthly Charge

The minimum monthly charge under the above rate shall be \$5.00 where 7 1/2 KVA or less of transformer capacity is required. For consumers requiring more than 7 1/2 KVA of transformer capacity the minimum monthly charge shall be increased by 75¢ for each additional KVA or fraction thereof required. Where it is necessary to extend or re-enforce existing distributed facilities, the minimum monthly charge may be increased to assure adequate compensation for the added facilities. Where the minimum charge is increased in accordance with the terms of this section, additional energy and demand shall be included in accordance with the foregoing rate schedule.

Minimum Annual Charge for Seasonal Service

Consumers requiring service only during certain seasons not exceeding nine months per year may guarantee a minimum annual payment of twelve times the minimum monthly charge determined in accordance with the foregoing section, in which case there shall be no minimum monthly charge.

Temporary Service

Temporary service shall be supplied in accordance with the foregoing rate except that the consumer shall pay in addition to the foregoing charges the total cost of connecting and disconnecting service less the value of materials returned to stock. A deposit, in advance may be required of the full amount of the estimated bill for service, including the cost of connection and disconnection.

Service at Primary Voltage

If service is furnished at primary distribution voltage, a discount of ten percent (10%) shall apply to the demand and energy charges, and if the minimum charge is based on transformer capacity, a discount of 10% shall also apply to the minimum charge. However, service may be metered at secondary voltage and adjusted to primary metering by adding the estimated transformer losses to the metered kilowatt-hours and kilowatt demand. This section applies only to consumers who own and maintain all electric lines and facilities on the load side of the primary meter.

Terms of Payment

The above charges are net, the gross being 5% higher on the first \$25.00 and 2% on the remainder of the bill. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within ten (10) days from the date of the bill, the gross charges shall apply.



**RULES AND REGULATIONS**

**LARGE POWER RATE (LP-R)**

Conditions of Service

(1) Motors having a rated capacity in excess of ten horsepower (10 H.P.) must be three-phase.

(2) Both power and lighting shall be billed at the foregoing rate.

(3) All wiring, pole lines, and other electrical equipment beyond the metering point, shall be considered the distribution system of the consumer and shall be furnished and maintained by the consumer.

(4) If service is furnished at Sellers primary line voltage, a discount of five percent (5%) shall apply to the demand and energy charges, and if the minimum charge is based on transformer capacity, a discount of 5% shall also apply to the minimum charge. However, the Seller shall have the option of metering at secondary voltage and adding the estimated transformer losses to the metered kilowatt - hours and kilowatt demand.

Terms of Payment

The above rates are net and payable within 15 days from the date of the bill.

For service from dusk to midnight, a discount of 10% of the Base Rate shall be allowed.

Additional Charges:

The above charges apply to lamps mounted on brackets on existing poles of the Cooperative and where no additional poles are required for street lighting circuits. A charge of \$2.00 per year will be added to the total charge as determined above for each additional pole required.

Minimum Charge:

The above rates are net, the gross rates being five percent (5%) higher. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within fifteen (15) days from the date of the bill, the gross rates shall apply.

Special Rules:

1. Street-lighting equipment including lamps, fixtures, time switch and the necessary street-lighting circuits, transformers, and additional guys and fittings will be furnished by the Cooperative.

2. Lamp replacements will be made by the Cooperative. Any lamps replaced by the Cooperative will be charged to the Village at cost as a separate item on the monthly bill for service.

3. Service will be furnished for future additional lamps in accordance with the above charges provided no such lamp requires more than 1000 feet to be added to the street-lighting circuit. The average spacing between lamps shall be recomputed to include the additional lamps.
