SL - 3 STREET LIGHTING SERVICE

RATE PER UNIT

Conditions of Service

1. Street-lighting equipment including lamps, fixtures, time-switch and the necessary street-lighting circuits, transformers and additional guys and fittings will be furnished by the Cooperative.
2. Lamp replacements will be made by the Cooperative. Any lamps replaced by the Cooperative will be charged to the Village at cost as a separate item on the monthly bill for service.
3. The above rates are net, the gross rates being five percent (5%) higher. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within fifteen (15) days from the date of the bill, the gross rates shall apply.
4. Service will be furnished for future additional lamps in accordance with the above charges provided no such lamp required more than 1000 feet to be added to the street-lighting circuit. The average spacing between lamps shall be recomputed to include the additional lamps.

NOTICE TO THE COMMISSION

ADJUSTMENT OF RATES

Before the Kentucky Public Service Commission

APPLICATION

1. The applicant, Farmers Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation of Glasgow, Kentucky, informs the Commission that it is in the business of supplying electric power for consumption in the counties of Barren, Hart, Metcalfe, Adair, Green, Larue, Grayson and Edmonson.
2. The applicant hereby proposes to adjust its rates, effective on electric power delivered after April 1, 1960, billed after May 1, 1960 and collected therefor after June 1, 1960 all in conformity with attached schedule.



3. The applicant's reasons for justifying this rate reduction are based upon the following facts:

- (a) KRS 279 purposes that rural electric cooperative shall promote and encourage the fullest possible use of electric energy in Kentucky by making it available at the lowest possible cost consistent with sound business methods and prudent management.
- (b) The margins and reserves of the applicant have been increasing annually and have by now grown to such magnitude that a retail rate reduction is justified. It is estimated that this rate reduction will amount to approximately \$30,000 annually.
- (c) The "Low-Cost High-Use" theory of the marketing of electric power is sound and enables consumers to reap greater benefits by being able to use more of it at a lower cost per kilowatt hour.
- (d) Because of the increased interest in the use of electric power for home heating and air conditioning this rate reduction is primarily applicable for residential use only. However, rates to small schools, churches and community halls are hereby reduced.
- (e) Also, because of the complexity of having more than one residential rate schedule heretofore, the lowest one has been made lower and will be the only one applicable for residential use in the future..

4. Seven additional copies of this application are filed herewith.
5. Articles of Incorporation of the applicant have heretofore been filed with the Commission many years ago and have not since been amended.
6. The applicant hereby requests the Kentucky Public Service Commission to approve, file and allow to become effective these rate adjustments herein contained, all in accordance with KRS 278.160, 278.180 and 270.190.
