Special Terms and Conditions:

Service under this schedule is subject to the Special Terms and Conditions set forth on rate Sheets 2 and 3 Code 1-NF and 3-F.

Special Terms and Conditions Relating to the Application of Residential and Farm Rate

Multiple-Family Dwellings:

Residential and Farm rates, Code 1-NF and 3-F are based on service to single family units and are not applicable to multiple-family dwellings served through a single meter. Where premises include two or more residential or dwelling units, the residential rate may be applied only if separate circuits are provided without cost to the Distributor. A residential or dwelling unit shall be defined, for the purpose of applying this interpretation, as the space provided for the occupancy of a single family, including separate living quarters and kitchen. If it is not practical to provide for separate metering of each individual unit, the entire premises will be served under the appropriate commercial rate.

Commercial Use of Portions of Dwellings:

The residential rate is not applicable to the space in the dwelling which is regularly used for commercial purposes, such as offices, beauty shop, studio, tea room, or store, or for other gainful activities. In such cases, if a separate circuit is provided at no cost to the Distributor, for the portion of the dwelling so used, the residential rate will be applied to the balance of the power requirements and the commercial rate will be applied to the portion of the dwelling used for commercial purposes. If a separate circuit is not provided, the entire power requirements of the premises must be billed under the commercial rate. If the premises are used primarily as a private dwelling and space in the dwelling occasionally used for commercial purposes, such as occasional rentals of surplus rooms, dress making, laundering, etc., the residential rate should be applied to the entire power requirements.

Service under this schedule is subject to the Special Terms and Conditions set forth on rate sheet 5 code 2-C and 6-C.

Special Terms and Conditions Relating to the Application of Commercial Rate:

1. The commercial rate 2-C and 6-C is available and shall be applied to all consumers using single-phase service 120/240 Volts, 60 cycle, alternating current, (except those to whom service is available under the residential and farm rate Code 1-WF and 3-F) for lighting and general usage, and power for motors up to and including 5 H.P. or a total connected motor load not in excess of 7½ H.P. Written permission must be obtained from the cooperative for motors rated above 5 H.P.

2. All motors rated above one-half horsepower must be 240 Volt motors. All motor installations, fluorescent, or other gaseous lighting installations must conform with the cooperative's power factor correction rule applicable thereto. (See Power Factor Adjustment paragraph on Sheet 8).

3. Three-phase service will not be made available under commercial rate 2-C. Consumers desiring to contract for three-phase service will be required to make application to the cooperative for such service stating the location desired and shall be billed on the cooperative's applicable power rate subject to the rules and regulations covering such service.

4. Consumers having a total connected power load in excess of 10 KW billing demand shall be billed on the cooperative's appropriate rate 4A-Commercial.

5. Temporary service shall be supplied under this rate except that the consumer shall pay in addition to the foregoing charges the total cost of connecting and disconnecting service less the value of materials returned to stock. A deposit, in advance may be required of the full amount of the estimated bill for service, including the cost of connection and disconnection.

The rate for this service consists of two parts, as follows:

I. Investment Charge

The annual investment charge (for the cost of operation, maintenance, taxes, and depreciation, and for return on investment) shall be 12 percent of the investment in the street-lighting system, determined as set forth below. Such charge shall be adjusted under the circumstances set forth below. This charge will be recomputed on July 1 of each year and one-twelfth of the total annual charge so computed will be billed customer monthly.

Minimum Bill:

Consumers and municipalities receiving service under the above rate will be required to execute contracts for minimum terms of one year. The minimum monthly charge shall be the minimum charge specified in the contract for service.

Method of Determining Distributor's Investment:

The investment in property and equipment used as a basis for the investment charge contained in this schedule shall consist of the cost of such property and equipment, including the full amount shown in the plant account entitled "Street Lighting and Signal System." If any part of the street-lighting system has not been built at the expense of the Distributor, a deduction shall be made from the annual investment charge in the amount of 6 percent of the investment in such part.

Lamp Renewals:

Distributor shall keep a record of the number and type of lamp replacement and customer shall be billed monthly for the replacements during the month at actual cost to Distributor, including appropriate overheads.

Relocation of Lamps:

Distributor shall, at the request of customer, relocate or change existing equipment. Customer shall reimburse Distributor for such changes at actual cost, including appropriate overheads.

Metering:

All energy consumed under this schedule shall be metered excepting installations where, in the opinion of Distributor, metering would be impracticable.

When the consumption is metered, the meters shall be installed in or connected to the lighting circuit and the billing shall include the energy delivered to and consumed in all circuits and equipment used exclusively for street lighting purposes.

Minimum Bill:

The minimum monthly charge under the above rate shall be \$1.25 net where 3 KVA or less of transformer capacity is required. For each customer who requires more than 3 KVA of transformer capacity, the minimum shall be increased 75¢ for each additional KVA or fraction thereof required.

Consumers using all electric heat may guarantee a minimum annual payment of twelve times the required minimum monthly charge determined in this section in which case there shall be no additional minimum monthly charge.

Terms of Payment:

The above rates are net, the gross rates being ten percent (10%) higher. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within ten (10) days from the due date, the gross rates shall apply.

Special Terms and Conditions:

Service under this schedule is subject to the Special Terms and Conditions set forth on rate Sheets 2 and 3 Code 1-NF and 3-F.

Special Terms and Conditions Relating to the Application of Residential and Farm Rate

Multiple-Family Dwellings:

Residential and Farm rates, Code 1-NF and 3-F are based on service to single family units and are not applicable to multiple-family dwellings served through a single meter. Where premises include two or more residential or dwelling units, the residential rate may be applied only if separate circuits are provided without cost to the Distributor. A residential or dwelling unit shall be defined, for the purpose of applying this interpretation, as the space provided for the occupancy of a single family, including separate living quarters and kitchen. If it is not practical to provide for separate metering of each individual unit, the entire premises will be served under the appropriate commercial rate.

Commercial Use of Portions of Dwellings:

The residential rate is not applicable to the space in the dwelling which is regularly used for commercial purposes, such as offices, beauty shop, studio, tea room, or store, or for other gainful activities. In such cases, if a separate circuit is provided at no cost to the Distributor, for the portion of the dwelling so used, the residential rate will be applied to the balance of the power requirements and the commercial rate will be applied to the portion of the dwelling used for commercial purposes. If a separate circuit is not provided, the entire power requirements of the premises must be billed under the commercial rate. If the premises are used primarily as a private dwelling and space in the dwelling occasionally used for commercial purposes, such as occasional rentals of surplus rooms, dress making, laundering, etc., the residential rate should be applied to the entire power requirements.

Domestic Power Use:

A farm on which is located a single dwelling and its appurtenances, including barns, domestic servants quarters, and out-buildings, and which processes only its own products, shall be considered a domestic farm and shall be entitled to the residential rate for all of its power requirements, including motors up to and including rated capacity of 5 H.P. Motors of capacities larger than 5 H.P. shall not be installed except by written permission of the Cooperative. Service to dwellings other than the main buildings such as tenant houses etc., must be separately metered and billed under the residential rate. This interpretation is not applicable to commercial dairies as defined below.

Commercial Farm Use:

1. Farm service shall be metered and billed under the commercial lighting and power rate if other dwellings beside the main dwelling are not separately metered and are served through the same point of delivery, or if products of other farms are processed for sale. The main dwelling and domestic servants quarters may be metered and billed under the residential rate if a separate circuit is provided for all of the other farm uses in cases where products of other farms are processed for sale.

2. If a farm customer's barn, pump house or other outbuildings are located at such distances from his residence as to make it impractical to supply service thereto through his residential meter, the separate meter required to measure service to such remotely located buildings will be considered a separate service contract and billed as a separate customer.

3. All motors rated above $\frac{1}{2}$ H.P. must be 240 Volt motors. All motor installations, fluorescent and other gaseous lighting installations must conform with the cooperative's power factor correction rule applicable thereto.

4. Three-phase service will not be made available under the residential and farm rate Code 1-NF and 3-F.
