RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. SCOPE

This schedule of Rules and Regulations is a part of all contracts for receiving electric service from the Cooperative and applies to all service received from the Cooperative whether the service received from the Cooperative is based upon a contract, agreement, signed application, or otherwise. No employee or individual director of the Cooperative is permitted to make an exception to rates or Rules and Regulations. Rates and service information can be obtained from the Cooperative's office.

2. REVISIONS

These Rules and Regulations may be revised, amended, supplemented or otherwise changed from time to time without notice. Such change when effective shall have the same force as the present rules and regulations. The members shall be informed of any changes as soon as possible after adopted by the Board of Directors, and the Energy Regulatory Commission of Kentucky.

3. CONSUMER'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR COOPERATIVE'S PROPERTY

All meters, service connections, and other equipment furnished by the Cooperative shall be, and remain the property of the Cooperative. The member shall exercise proper care to protect the property of the Cooperative on its premises and in the event of loss or damage to the Cooperative's property arising from neglect of member to care for same, the cost of necessary repairs or replacement shall be paid by the member.

4. CONTINUITY OF SERVICE

The Cooperative shall use reasonable diligence to provide a constant and uninterrupted supply of electric power and energy, but if such supply should fail or be interrupted or become defective through act of God, or public enemy, or by accident, strikes, labor troubles, or by

elements, or inability to secure right-of-way or other permits needed, or for any other cause beyond reasonable control of the Cooperative, the Cooperative shall not be liable therefor.

5. RELOCATION OF LINES BY REQUEST OF MEMBERS

The Cooperative's established lines will not be relocated unless the expense for moving and relocating is paid by the member, except in instances where it would be to the advantage of the Cooperative to make such relocation.

6. SERVICES PERFORMED FOR MEMBERS

The Cooperative's personnel is prohibited from making repairs or performing services to the members equipment or property except in cases of emergency or to protect the public or members person or property. When such emergency services are performed, the member shall be charged for such service at the rate of time and material.

7. APPLICATION FOR SERVICE

Each Prospective member desiring electric service will be required to sign the Cooperative's form, "Application for Membership and for Electric Service," before service is supplied by the Cooperative and provide the Cooperative with necessary easements or right-of-way permits.

8. MEMBERSHIP FEE

The membership fee in the Corporation shall be \$ 20.00. The membership fee will be refunded if all bills are paid or applied against any unpaid bills of member at the time service is disconnected, which will automatically terminate the membership.

9. RIGHT OF ACCESS

The Cooperative's identified employees shall have access to members premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of reading meter, testing, repairing, removing, or exchanging any and all equipment

10. MEMBER'S DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE

Any member desiring service discontinued or changed from one location to another shall give the Cooperative three (3) days notice in person or in writing provided such notice does not violate contractual obligations.

11. RECONNECTION CHARGES

The Cooperative will make no charge for connecting service to the member's premises for the initial installation of service. When a member has been disconnected for cause, if and when he is reconnected such member shall pay a service charge of \$16.00.

12. RESALE OF POWER BY MEMBERS

All purchased electric service used on the premises of the member shall be supplied exclusively by the Cooperative, and the member shall not directly or indirectly sell, or otherwise dispose of the electric service or any part thereof.

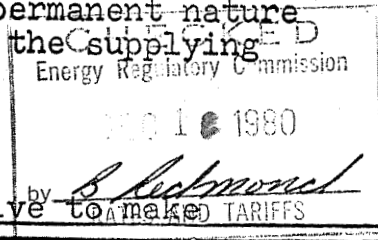

16. SERVICE TO INDIVIDUAL MOBLE HOMES

17. METER TESTS

All new meters shall be checked for accuarcy before installation. All meters in service shall be tested at least once in each seven year period. Any consumer's meter shall be tested upon request, by signing a form requesting that the test be made and enclosing \$8.00 (eight dollar) deposit. After this test has been made and if the meter is found to be not more than (2%) two percent slow or (2%) two percent fast, the Cooperative shall keep the \$8.00 (eight dollar) deposit. If the meter is more than (2%) two percent fast or (2%) two percent slow, the proper adjustment will be made as Per 807 KAR 50:015 Section 9.

18. FAILURE OF METERS TO REGISTER

In the event a member's meter should fail to register, the member shall be billed from the date of such failure at the average consumption of the member based on three (3) month period immediately preceding the failure.

19. DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE BY COOPERATIVE

KAR 50:15 Sect. 11

20. POINT OF DELIVERY

The point of delivery is the point designated by the Cooperative on member's premises where current is to be delivered to building or premises namely the service head. All wiring and equipment beyond this point of delivery shall be supplied and maintained by the member. The member will, however, notify the Cooperative of any proposed changes in his equipment or wiring which will materially increase the load so that the Cooperative may check its equipment to make certain it will accomodate the consumer's load requirements.

INSPECTIONS

The Cooperative shall have the right, but shall not be obligated to inspect any installation before electricity is introduced, or at any time later, and reserves the right to reject any wiring or appliances not in accordance with the National Electric Code or other governing bodies, but such inspection or failure to inspect or reject shall not render the Cooperative liable or responsible for any loss or damage resulting from defects in the installation, wiring, or appliances, or from violation of the Cooperative's rules, or from accidents which may occur upon consumer's premises.

A. FARM, HOME AND SMALL COMMERCIAL, CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY HALLS

Each month a bill, for the previous month's service will be mailed to the consumer showing all charges according to rate schedules approved by the Public Service Commission of Kentucky. All bills to be mailed to the consumers in time to reach them by the 20th of the month. On this date, the member shall read his or her meter and place the reading in the space provided on the bill. This part of the bill to be returned to the Cooperative by the last day of the month. Five per-cent (5%) penalty will be added after the last day of the month. Failure to pay will result in the issuance of a disconnect work order after a proper written notice has been mailed and ten (10) days has elapsed.

B. LARGE POWER AND INDUSTRIAL (SCHOOLS WITH 3 Ø POWER)

Cooperative Employees read the meters on the 20th of each month. Bills for that period are mailed by the 25th and the consumer has until the 5th of the following month to pay the bill.

24. BUDGET BILLING

A budget plan is available.

First: The account must be paid up to date, with no balances, when the budget plan is put into effect.

The first Budget payment will be made with the July billing.

Second: The annual estimated cost of heat and utilities and monthly payments may change from year to year due to conditions of weather and adding of more appliances, and a change in the rates of the Cooperative.

Third: The member shall read the meter on the 20th of each month, and report the reading each month when payment is made.

All bills are to be paid by the last day of the month, and bills

not not paid by the 9th day of the following month will have a 5% late charge added.

Fourth: Full settlement of the bill must be made each year with payment of the July bill, or the Budget privileges will be cancelled, and the account will be treated as a delinquent account.

Fifth: This budget plan is for the convenience of the member, but failing to abide with the above rules the member will lose the privilage of the budget plan.

25. PARTIAL PAYMENT PLAN

Consumers who are unable to pay their bills must come to the office and make arrangements for partial payments.

26. DEPOSITS

807 KAR-50:D15- Sect 7

A utility may require from any customer or applicant for service a minimum cash deposit or other guaranty to secure payment of bills of an amount not to exceed two- twelfths (2/12) of the estimated annual bill of such customer or applicant, where bills are rendered monthly.

(2) The utility shall issue to every customer from whom a deposit is received a certificate of deposit, showing the name of the customer, location of initial premises occupied, date and amount of the deposit.

27. CHECKS RETURNED

A \$5.00 service charge shall be added to all returned unhonored checks.

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
