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SECTION II — SUPPLYING AND TAKING OF SERVICE (Cont'd)

8. Information Relative to Service.

Information relative to the service that will be supplied at a given location should be obtained from Company. Company will not be responsible for mistakes of any kind resulting from information given orally or over the telephone. Such information must be confirmed in writing.

9. Continuity of Service.

The Company shall make reasonable provision to supply satisfactory and continuous service, but does not guarantee a constant or uninterrupted supply of gas and shall not be liable for any damage or claim of damage attributable to any interruption caused by unavoidable accident or casualty, extraordinary action of the elements, action of any governmental authority, litigation, or by any cause which the Company could not have reasonably foreseen and made provision against.

10. Suspension of Service for Repairs and Changes.

When necessary to make repairs to or changes in Company's plant, transmission or distribution system, or other property, Company may, without incurring any liability therefor, suspend service for such periods as may be reasonably necessary, and in such manner as not to inconvenience Customer unnecessarily.

11. Use of Service.

(a) Service is supplied directly to Customer through Company's own meter and is to be used by Customer only for the purposes specified in and in accordance with the provisions of the Service Agreement and applicable Rate Schedule. Service is for Customer's use only and under no circumstances may Customer or Customer's agent or any other individual, association or corporation install meters for the purpose of reselling or otherwise disposing of service supplied Customer.

(b) Customer will not install pipes under a street, alley, lane, court or avenue or other public or private space in order to obtain service for adjacent property through one meter even though such adjacent property be owned by Customer. Consent may be given when such adjacent properties are operated as one integral unit under the same name and for carrying on parts of the same business.

(c) In case of unauthorized remetering, sale, extension or other disposition of service, Company may immediately discontinue the supplying of service to Customer until such unauthorized act is discontinued and full payment is made for all service supplied or used, billed on proper classification and Rate Schedule, and reimbursement in full made to Company for all extra expenses incurred, including expenses for clerical work, testing and inspections.

12. Customer's Responsibility.

Customer assumes all responsibility on Customer's side of the point of delivery (outlet side of Company's pipe where connected to the curb valve) for the service supplied or taken, as well as for the installation, appliances and apparatus used in connection therewith, and will save Company harmless from and against all claims for injury or damage to persons or property occasioned by or in any way resulting from such service or the use thereof on Customer's side of the point of delivery.

13. Right-of-Way.

Customer, without reimbursement, will make or procure conveyance to Company of right-of-way satisfactory to it across the property owned or controlled by Customer for Company's mains or extensions thereof necessary or incidental to the supplying of service to Customer.

14. Access to Premises.

The properly authorized agents of the Company shall at all reasonable hours have free access to the premises for the purpose of inspecting the Customer's installation and of examining, repairing or removing the Company's meters, or other property, reading of meters and all other purposes incident to the supplying of service, and for such purpose the Customer authorizes and requests his landlord, if any, to permit such access to the premises.

SECTION III — CUSTOMER'S INSTALLATION

15. Nature and Use of Installation.

All equipment in the premises or connecting the premises with Company's service, furnished by the Customer, shall be suitable for the purposes thereof, and shall be maintained by Customer at all times in conformity with the safety requirements of the accredited agency having jurisdiction and with the rules, regulations and requirements of Company in force from time to time.

16. Materials—Fittings—Tests.

The piping and fittings for the distribution of gas after it has passed the meter, may be installed by any competent gas fitter employed by the customer or proprietor of the premises, subject, however, to the inspection and approval of the Company which requires an inspection and test of all such piping.

An application for inspection and test must be made to the Company when the piping work has been completed, but prior to its concealment by plastering, flooring or other material.

17. Construction.

All piping shall be installed in accordance with applicable building codes and the rules and regulations of the Company.

SECTION III — CUSTOMER'S INSTALLATION (Cont'd)

18. Changes in Installations.

As Company's facilities used in supplying service to Customer have a limited capacity, Customer should give notice to Company, and obtain Company's consent, before making any material changes or increases in his installation. Company as promptly as possible after receipt of such notice will give its written approval to the proposed change or increase, or will advise Customer upon what conditions service can be supplied for such change or increase.

SECTION IV — COMPANY'S INSTALLATION

19. Installation and Maintenance.

Except as otherwise provided in these Service Regulations, in Service Agreements or Rate Schedules, Company will install and maintain its lines and equipment on its side of the point of delivery, but shall not be required to install or maintain any lines or equipment, except meters and service regulators on Customer's side of the point of delivery without cost to Customer. Only Company's agents are authorized to connect Company's service to Customer's service piping.

20. Gas Service Piping.

The gas service pipe shall be installed by the Company from the Company's main in the street to the curb line at its own expense and from the curb line to the meter, including curb box and valve, at the Customer's expense, subject to the Company's rules, regulations and existing prices, upon execution of an application and provided that an adequate distribution main exists in front of the Customer's building. The service piping from the curb to the meter, including street box and valve, installed at the expense of the Customer, shall be maintained at the expense of the Customer. No connections or work of any kind shall be done on a gas main or service piping up to the outlet of the meter by anyone who is not an authorized employee of the Company. However, if gas is leaking from any part of the gas supply system, a fitter not in the employ of the Company may make necessary temporary repairs and notify the Company of the condition.

Only one gas service will be installed in any building, or individual dwelling, regardless of the number of customers.

The service pipe will be laid on a direct straight line, whenever possible, from the street main to the meter location approved by the Company. Should the distance between the curb and the Customer's building be in excess of 150 feet or involved other special conditions, a suitable meter location, approved by the Company, will be selected.

Service pipe will not be laid in ditches that are occupied by other utilities. A minimum of three feet will be allowed between gas service pipe and other utilities.

Service piping will end at the inlet connection of the meter which will be set at the point and entry of the service. If it is necessary to extend the service pipe beyond the point of entry, such exposed service piping in the building under flooring, through walls, coal bins, etc., shall be properly protected and the expense thereof borne by the customer.

Branch services will not be run. In case of more than one building on a lot, a separate service will be run direct from the main to each building except in cases where the building nearest the Company's main extends the full width of the lot. In such cases the meter will be placed on the service in the nearest building and the customer must make his own extension to the other building.

21. Company's Property and Protection Thereof.

All meters and equipment furnished by and at the expense of Company, which may at any time be in said premises, shall, unless otherwise expressly provided herein, be and remain the property of Company, and Customer shall protect such property from loss or damage, and no one who is not an agent of Company shall be permitted to remove or handle same.

SECTION V — METERING

22. Installation of Meters.

Gas will be measured by a meter or meters to be installed by Company upon Customer's premises at a point most convenient for Company's service, and upon the registration of said meters all bills will be calculated.

23. Meter Tests.

All meter tests shall be made in accordance with rules issued by the Public Service Commission of Kentucky.

SECTION VI — BILLING AND PAYMENT

24. Billing Periods — Time and Place for Payment of Bills.

Bills ordinarily are rendered regularly at monthly intervals, but may be rendered more or less frequently at Company's option. Non-receipt of bills by Customer does not release or diminish the obligation of Customer with respect to payment thereof.

The word "month" as to any Customer shall mean the period of approximately thirty days between meter readings, as fixed and made by Company. Meters are ordinarily read at monthly intervals but may be read more or less frequently at Company's option. Company shall have the right to establish billing districts for the purpose of reading meters and rendering bills to customers at various dates. A change or revision of any Rate Schedule shall be applicable to all bills on which the initial monthly meter reading is taken on or after the effective date of such change or revision, except as otherwise ordered by The Public Service Commission of Kentucky.


Bills are due on the date indicated thereon as being the last date for payment of the net amount, and bills are payable only at the Company's offices or authorized agencies for collection. If a partial payment is made, the amount will be applied to items of indebtedness in the same order as they have accrued.

SECTION VI — BILLING (Cont'd)

The Company may issue interim bills based on average normal usage instead of determining actual usage by reading the meter. Interim bills may also be used when access to Company's meter cannot be obtained or emergency conditions exist.

Interim bills will be considered payable by the due date and if not then paid will be handled in the same manner as all other bills; provided however, partial payment of at least one-half of the interim bill, in addition to full payment of any unpaid service charges previously billed and other billed items, will avoid the delayed payment charge on the interim bill.

The company will continue monthly meter reading upon a Customer's request.

25. Charge for Restoring Service for Non-Payment of Bill and Unlawful Use of Service.

- (C) Company may charge and collect in advance the sum of three dollars (\$3.00) for reconnecting a Customer's service after service is disconnected because of non-payment of bill when due. In case service is discontinued because of fraudulent use thereof Company may charge and collect the sum of three dollars (\$3.00) and in addition thereto the expenses incurred by Company by reason of such fraudulent use, together with an estimated bill for gas used before the service is reconnected. If both gas and electric services are reconnected at one time the total charge shall be four dollars (\$4.00).

26. Temporary Discontinuance of Service.

- (C) If any residential customer, because of absence or otherwise, shall notify Company in writing to discontinue service, Company will make no minimum charge for any full meter reading period during the period of discontinuance; provided, however, that Company may charge and collect the sum of three dollars (\$3.00) prior to reconnecting a service which was discontinued at Customer's request within the preceding twelve months.

SECTION VII — DEPOSITS

27. Deposits.

Company maintains the right at any time to require Customer to make a reasonable deposit in advance to secure the prompt payment of bills, as provided by law.

SECTION VIII — APPLICATION

28. Application of Service Regulations and Rate Schedules.

All Service Agreements at present in effect or that may be entered into in the future are made expressly subject to these Service Regulations and any modifications hereof that may be lawfully made, and subject to all applicable existing Rate Schedules and any lawfully made changes therein, substitutions therefor or additions thereto.

29. Agents Cannot Modify Agreement.

No agent has the right to amend, modify or alter the application rates, terms, conditions, rules or regulations as filed with the Public Service Commission of Kentucky, or to make any promise or representation not contained in the Company's schedules, supplements thereto and revisions thereof, lawfully filed with said commission.

SECTION IX—GAS SPACE HEATING REGULATIONS

30. Gas Space Heating Regulations.

a. The Company shall not be required to supply gas for new or additional space heating equipment installed from and after the effective date hereof unless the consumer present or prospective, makes written application to the Company for such supply at a specific address and receives written approval from the Company therefor. An approval for the use of gas for space heating is not transferable from one premises to another except by written approval from the Company.

b. If any consumer fails to install gas-fired space heating equipment pursuant to said approval within one year from the date of issuance thereof or fails to demonstrate to the Company's satisfaction before the expiration of said period that he intends to avail himself of the use of such gas under such approval with due diligence, the Company may cancel, nullify and void such approval.

c. The Company need not issue an approval for the utilization of gas for space heating purposes in a commercial or industrial building for new or additional heating equipment having a total rated input capacity in excess of 1,000,000 Btu per hour, unless the applicant shall install standby facilities having a capacity satisfactory to the Company and shall agree in writing with the Company to use such standby facilities and discontinue the use of gas for space heating when and for such periods of time as the Company may request. In the event the use of gas for space heating by such consumer is not promptly discontinued at the request of the Company, the latter, upon discovery thereof, is authorized to discontinue all gas service to such consumer until such time as the gas space heating equipment has been disconnected. Where such action is necessary on the part of the Company, it may cancel, nullify and void such approval.

d. Should any consumer fail to comply with these gas space heating regulations, the Company, upon discovery thereof, and after giving ten days' notice to such consumer, is authorized to disconnect his gas service until such time as these regulations are complied with.

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SECTION VI — BILLING (Cont'd)

The Company may issue interim bills based on average normal usage instead of determining actual usage by reading the meter. Interim bills may also be used when access to Company's meter cannot be obtained or emergency conditions exist.

Interim bills will be considered payable by the due date and if not then paid will be handled in the same manner as all other bills; provided however, partial payment of at least one-half of the interim bill, in addition to full payment of any unpaid service charges previously billed and other billed items, will avoid the delayed payment charge on the interim bill.

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29. Agents Cannot Modify Agreement.

No agent has the right to amend, modify or alter the application rates, terms, conditions, rules or regulations as filed with the Public Service Commission of Kentucky, or to make any promise or representation not contained in the Company's schedules, supplements thereto and revisions thereof, lawfully filed with said commission.

SECTION IX—GAS SPACE HEATING REGULATIONS


30. Gas Space Heating Regulations.

a. The Company shall not be required to supply gas for new or additional space heating equipment installed from and after the effective date hereof unless the consumer present or prospective, makes written application to the Company for such supply at a specific address and receives written approval from the Company therefor. An approval for the use of gas for space heating is not transferable from one premises to another except by written approval from the Company.

b. If any consumer fails to install gas-fired space heating equipment pursuant to said approval within one year from the date of issuance thereof or fails to demonstrate to the Company's satisfaction before the expiration of said period that he intends to avail himself of the use of such gas under such approval with due diligence, the Company may cancel, nullify and void such approval.

c. The Company need not issue an approval for the utilization of gas for space heating purposes in a commercial or industrial building for new or additional heating equipment having a total rated input capacity in excess of 1,000,000 Btu per hour, unless the applicant shall install standby facilities having a capacity satisfactory to the Company and shall agree in writing with the Company to use such standby facilities and discontinue the use of gas for space heating when and for such periods of time as the Company may request. In the event the use of gas for space heating by such consumer is not promptly discontinued at the request of the Company, the latter, upon discovery thereof, is authorized to discontinue all gas service to such consumer until such time as the gas space heating equipment has been disconnected. Where such action is necessary on the part of the Company, it may cancel, nullify and void such approval.

d. Should any consumer fail to comply with these gas space heating regulations, the Company, upon discovery thereof, and after giving ten days' notice to such consumer, is authorized to disconnect his gas service until such time as these regulations are complied with.

- (4) Calculate the Firm Use Refunding Rate per Mcf as follows:
- (a) deduct from the total refund dollars received by Company the total refund due the off peak customers as calculated in (3) (b) above to determine the portion of the refund applicable to firm sales. A. Change in Rate

Whenever a change occurs in the rates of a major supplier of the Company, the Company shall submit to the Public Service Commission of Kentucky, as soon as practicable, an Application setting forth the change in cost of gas per Mcf of the Company's gas sales which shall be determined as follows:

- (1) The effect per Mcf sales of a change in cost of gas shall be determined by:
 - (a) the application of the currently effective tariffs to:
 - (i) the Company's most recent billing demands, applicable to each such respective tariff, and
 - (ii) the average monthly volume of gas purchased, applicable to each such respective tariff, by the Company during the most recently available 12 month period after the deduction of off-peak gas sales including unaccounted for gas in proportion to total sales.
 - (b) reduce the total average monthly cost, as determined in (a) above, by the average monthly cost of firm gas sold to The Cincinnati Gas & Electric Company under The Union Light, Heat and Power Company's Tariff X-5.
 - (c) dividing the average monthly cost of gas calculated in (a) and (b) above by the average monthly volume of gas sales during the twelve month period after the deduction of off-peak sales and sales under other special contracts, comparing the resulting quotient to the pro forma average cost per Mcf of firm gas sales as of the effective date of these proposed rates. The difference so derived to the nearest 0.1 cent shall represent the effect of change(s) in gas cost per Mcf of sales. The pro forma average cost of firm gas and off-peak gas, as of August 13, 1973, calculated in accordance with (a), (b) and (c) herein has been determined to be 63.81¢ per Mcf and 33.93¢ per Mcf, respectively.
- (2) The rates as stated in the applicable rate sheets shall be decreased or increased, with gas delivered to customers on and after the effective date of a change in city gate tariffs, by application of a Gas Cost Adjustment for the combined decrease or increase in cost of gas as determined in (1) above and approved by the Commission. When meter readings are not available the gas volume for the meter reading period will be prorated by the number of days in the period.

B. Refund Adjustment

When accumulated refunds received by the Company from its gas suppliers are sufficient to indicate that a change in Refunding Rate per Mcf will occur, the Company will:

- (1) Summarize the demand, commodity and interest received portions of the refund amounts. Should a refund amount be received by the Company with undesignated dollars, such amount shall be treated as a commodity portion.
- (2) Allocate the interest as between commodity and demand on the basis of the demand and/or commodity portion of dollars received.
- (3) Calculate the Off-Peak Refunding Rate per Mcf as follows:
 - (a) divide the commodity portion (including allocated interest received) by the total Mcf of gas sales for the prior 12-month period. The resulting quotient, rounded to the nearest one-tenth cent, shall represent the Off-Peak Refunding Rate per Mcf.

GAS COST ADJUSTMENT
APPLICABLE TO ALL FIRM SALES

A. Change in Rate

At the end of each calendar quarter or whenever a change occurs after the effective date of these proposed rates in city gate tariff rates put into effect by a major supplier the Company, as soon as practical, shall submit to the Public Service Commission of Kentucky a report setting forth the change in cost of gas, per Mcf of Company wide firm gas sales, which shall be determined as follows:

- (1) The effect per Mcf sales of a change in cost of gas shall be determined by:
 - (a) the application of the currently effective tariffs to:
 - (i) the Company's most recent billing demands, applicable to each such respective tariff, and
 - (ii) the average monthly volume of gas purchased, applicable to each such respective tariff, by the Company during the most recently available 12 month period after the deduction of off-peak gas sales including unaccounted for gas in proportion to total sales.
 - (b) adding the average monthly cost of propane or other feed stock used in the production of gas during the most recently available 12 month period as recorded on the Company's books in FPC account #728, less the calculated amount used in production of gas for sale to off peak and other special contract customers, to the cost of gas as determined in (a) above.
 - (c) reduce the total average monthly cost, as determined in (a) and (b) above, by the average monthly cost of firm gas sold to The Cincinnati Gas & Electric Company under The Union Light, Heat and Power Company's Tariff X-5.
 - (d) dividing the average monthly cost of gas calculated in (a), (b) and (c) above by the average monthly volume of gas sales during the twelve month period after the deduction of off peak sales and sales under other special contracts, comparing the resulting quotient to the pro forma average cost per Mcf of firm gas sales of the effective date of these proposed rates. The difference so derived to the nearest 0.1 cent shall represent the effect of change(s) in gas cost per Mcf of sales. The pro forma average cost of gas as of the effective date of these proposed rates calculated in accordance with (a), (b) and (c) herein has been determined to be 62.39¢ per Mcf.
- (2) The rates as stated in the applicable rate sheets shall be decreased or increased, effective with final meter readings taken fifteen days following the end of the calendar quarter or with gas delivered to customers on and after the effective date of a change in city gate tariffs, by application of a Gas Cost Adjustment for the combined decrease or increase in cost of gas as determined in (1) above. When meter readings are not available the gas volume for the meter reading period will be prorated by the number of days in the period.

B. Refund Adjustment

When accumulated refunds received by the Company from its gas suppliers are sufficient to indicate that a change in Refunding Rate per Mcf will occur, the Company will:

- (1) Summarize the demand, commodity and interest received portions of the refund amounts. Should a refund amount be received by the Company with undesignated dollars, such amount shall be treated as a commodity portion.
- (2) Allocate the interest as between commodity and demand on the basis of the demand and/or commodity portion of dollars received.
- (3) Calculate the Off-Peak Refunding Rate per Mcf as follows:
 - (a) divide the commodity portion (including allocated interest received) by the total Mcf of gas sales for the prior 12-month period. The resulting quotient, rounded to the nearest one-tenth cent, shall represent the Off-Peak Refunding Rate per Mcf.

- (b) calculate the total refund for off-peak customers by multiplying the Off-Peak Refunding Rate per Mcf times the total prior 12-month period Mcf off-peak sales.
- (4) Calculate the Firm Use Refunding Rate per Mcf as follows:
- (a) deduct from the total refund dollars received by Company the total refund due the off-peak customers as calculated in (3) (b) above to determine the portion of the refunds applicable to firm sales. Divide the firm sales portion (including allocated interest received and any amounts carried forward from prior refunds) by the total Mcf of gas sales, less sales to off-peak and other special contract customers, for the prior 12-month period. The resulting quotient, rounded to the nearest one-tenth cent, shall represent the Firm Use Refunding Rate per Mcf.
- (b) reduce the rate as stated in the applicable rate sheets by subtracting the Firm Refunding Rate per Mcf from the Gas Cost Adjustment per Mcf to develop a Net Rate Adjustment per Mcf to be applied to firm gas sales until the total net refund determined above, less the amount applicable to interdepartmental sales, has been substantially distributed. The refund amount applicable to interdepartmental sales shall be determined by application of the Firm Refunding Rate per Mcf to the interdepartmental sales volume for the prior 12 month period.
- (c) amounts not distributed or amounts over distributed under (b) above, due to the impracticability of distributing the exact amount of the total net refund available, shall be carried forward and added to, if under distributed, or subtracted from, if over distributed, future refunds and distributed as provided in (4) (a) and (b) above.
- (d) Company may use its discretion in determining whether to initiate a new effective Refunding Rate or to extend the refund period at current rates where the Refunding Rate determined in (4) (a) above is less than 0.1¢ per Mcf or where a short term variation in the Net Rate Adjustment per Mcf can be avoided in consideration of a recent or impending change either in the Gas Cost Adjustment or Refunding Rate.
- (5) Credit interest as directed by the Commission, on any unrefunded balance retained longer than four (4) months from the beginning of the refund period and include such interest in the amount to be refunded.

C. Major Supplier Defined

For the purposes of this Gas Cost Adjustment, a major supplier shall include all historic gas sources and that source of non-historic supply from Columbia LNG Corporation, known as the Green Springs Reforming Plant (SPQ Gas); however, non-historic sources, without further authorization, shall be limited to said SPQ Gas.



C. Major Supplier Defined

For the purposes of this Gas Cost Adjustment a major supplier is any supplier from which Company purchased natural gas under a contract demand in excess of nine thousand (9,000) Mcf per day.



REFUND ADJUSTMENT

APPLICABILITY

Applicable to Rate G-1 and Rate G-2 of this tariff. When accumulated refunds received by the Company from Gas Suppliers are sufficient to indicate a change in Refunding Rate per MCF, the Company will divide the applicable MCF firm gas sales to all customers billed under the Purchased Gas Adjustment of Rates G-1 and G-2 during the corresponding 6 months of the prior year into the total accumulated refund determined above and reduce the rates as stated in the tariff sheets of P.S.C. Ky. No. 2 for Rates G-1 and G-2 by subtracting the Refunding Rate per MCF from the Purchase Gas Adjustment per MCF to develop a Net Rate Adjustment per MCF for approximately the next succeeding 6 months until the total accumulated refunds determined above have been substantially distributed.

Amounts not distributed or amounts over distributed, due to impracticability of distributing the exact amount of the total accumulated refund available shall be carried forward and added to, if under distributed, or subtracted from, if over distributed, future refunds as determined above and distributed as provided above.

Company may at its discretion extend the refund period at current rates to expedite refunding of smaller amounts of additional refunds received.

Company shall credit 6% interest on any unrefunded balance retained longer than four (4) months from the beginning of the refund period and included such interest in the amount to be distributed.

NET MONTHLY BILL

Computed in accordance with the provisions of applicable Rate G-1 or Rate G-2 except, on bills rendered on or after the effective date of this rate sheet and on subsequent bills for approximately the next six months, the present Purchased Gas Adjustment of Plus 0.22¢ per MCF shall be temporarily offset by the Refund Rate of Minus 0.13¢ per MCF to establish a Net Rate Adjustment of Plus 0.09¢ per MCF until accumulated refunds have been distributed as provided above, and thereafter billing shall revert again to the Purchased Gas Adjustment of Plus 0.22¢ per MCF, unless modified by another Refund Adjustment.



General Rules and Regulations—Continued

16. Meter Reading and Billing.

The word "month" as to any customer shall mean the period of approximately thirty days between meter readings, as fixed and made by the Company. The Company shall have the right to establish billing districts for the purpose of reading meters and rendering bills to customers at various dates. A change or revision of any rate schedule shall be applicable to all bills on which the initial monthly meter reading was taken on and after the effective date of such change or revision.

17. Deposit.

20. Assignment.

21. Main Extensions.
