### DEMAND

The demand shall be the kilowatts derived from the Company's demand meter for the fifteen minute period of customer's greatest are during the month, as determined by the Company, adjusted for power factor, as provided herein. At the Company's option, a demand meter may not be installed if the nature of the load clearly indicates the load will have a constant demand, in which case the demand will be the calculated demand. A demand meter may be installed on a single phase account when consumption equals or exceeds 1200 kilowatt hours per month for four consecutive months or 2400 kilowatt hours for two consecutive bi-monthly billing periods.


