Dear Senator Quinlan:

On September 25, 1979, the United States District Court for the western district of Kentucky ruled that the Kentucky Public Service Commission had no authority to regulate the rates of electric utilities in Kentucky that buy their power from the Tennessee Valley Authority. The court's ruling was based upon the fact that Congress gave TVA the power to set the retail rate for all customers who purchase electricity from TVA under a wholesale contract. The power of the federal government to set the retail rate for these utilities takes precedence over the power of the state to likewise set the rate. Accordingly, since 1979 the PSC has not exercised any jurisdiction over the retail rates of the following utilities operating in Kentucky: Hickman-Fulton RECC, Pennyrile RECC, Warren RECC, West Kentucky RECC, Tri-County Electric Membership Corporation, and Jellico Electric Company.

In January of this year, the PSC received correspondence from stating that it was TVA's belief that the principle enunciated in the 1979 federal court decision would apply to service as well as rates. TVA thus contends that none of its wholesale customers operating in Kentucky are subject to any of the PSC's regulations governing the provision of electrical service to customers. The PSC has considered this matter and it is our conclusion that TVA is right on this point and that federal rather than state law governs the service as well as the rates of all TVA-supplied utilities. Since construction projects by utilities are also related to the rates and service of the utilities, the PSC believes it cannot legally certificate construction projects for these utilities. Accordingly, the PSC wishes to inform your committee that our agency will no longer or construction rates, service, the aforementioned six utilities operating in Kentucky which purchase their electricity from the TVA.

The annual investment charge shall be 12 percent of the installed cost to Distributor's electric system of the facilities devoted to street and park lighting service specified in this Part A. Such installed cost shall be recomputed on July 1 of each year, or more often if substantial changes in the facilities are made. Each month, one-twelfth of the then total annual investment charge shall be billed to the customer. Electric service for subdivisions in resort areas:

The Developer shall furnish a plat to the Cooperative on which right-of-way easement is dedicated for the installation, operation, and maintenance of electric facilities. The approved plat shall then be recorded by the Developer with the County Court Clerk with a copy of the recorded plat being furnished the Cooperative.

For each subdivision or section thereof to be provided with electric facilities, the Cooperative shall design and stake the lines in such a manner as to most economically serve the development. The Developer shall pay the estimated cost of primary extensions to be constructed.

Service connections to primary extensions shall be made for residences of permanent construction upon application for membership in the Cooperative.

For a period of ten years after completion date of the extension, the Cooperative shall make a refund to the Developer for each lot of the subdivision on which service to a permanent residence has been connected. The amount of kefund per service connected shall be the amount contributed by the Developer for the primary extension divided by the total lots to be served from the extension. The Cooperative shall make refunds only during the nonths of January and February of each year of the refund period provided the Developer has given written notification of the refund due. After the end of the ten-year period, no refund shall be made.

The Cooperative shall own and maintain all electric distribution facilities which it installs in the subdivision and shall have the right and privilege to extend from these facilities to serve other consumers beyond the boundary of the subdivision.

- (1) All extensions of up to 150 feet from the nearest facility shall be made without charge.
- (2) Extensions greater than 150 feet from the nearest facility and up to 300 feet shall be made provided the customer shall pay the utility a "customer advance for construction" of fifty (\$50) dollars in addition to any other charges required by the utility for all customers. This advance shall be refunded at the end of one (1) year if the service to the mobile home continues for that length of time.
- (3) For extensions greater than 300 feet and less than 1,000 feet from the nearest facility, the utility may charge an advance equal to the reasonable costs incurred by it for that portion of the service beyond 300 feet, plus fifty (\$50) dollars.
 - (a) This advance shall be refunded to the customer over a four (4) year period in equal amounts for each year the service is continued.
 - (b) If the service is discontinued for a period of sixty (60) days, or should the mobile home be removed and another not take its place within sixty (60) days, or be replaced by a permanent structure, the remainder of the advance shall be forfeited.
- (4) When an extension of the utility's line to serve an applicant or group of applicant: amounts to more than 1,000 feet per customer, the utility will require the total cost of the excessive footage over 1,000 feet per customer to be deposited with the utility by the appli cant or applicants, based on the average estimated cost per foot of the total extension.

Each customer receiving service under such extension will be reimbursed under the following plan: Each year for a period of not less than ten (10) years, which for the purpose of this rule shall be the refund period, the utility shall refund to the customer or customers who paid for the excessive footage the cost of 1,000 feet of the extension in place for each additional customer connected during the year whose service line is directly connected to the extension installed and not to extensions or laterals therefrom, but in no case shall the total amount refunded exceed the amount paid the utility. After the end of the refund period no refund will be required to be made.

West Kentucky Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation recently constructed thirty-five underground services in a subdivision that contains approximately fifty lots. The total cost for the residential services as constructed was \$16,900.96.

WKRECC has a continuing construction contract with Griffin Electric Company, Owensboro, Kentucky, and based on their contract for the same period as the above construction, overhead line to serve these thirty-five houses would have been \$9,963.16.

Attached is a list of the units and the installation cost that would have been used for overhead construction.

The subdivider was charged \$100 per lot for underground service to offset the difference in cost. The \$100 is based on 100-foot frontage.

In this particular subdivision the subdivider will pay this Cooperative \$5,000.

The difference in the cost of the overhead and underground is \$6,937.80.

In the attached tariff, we have asked \$1.50 per foot on primary line rather than the \$1.00 per front footage. It has been the policy of the Cooperative for the subdivider to build the service line, but no reimbursement was made from the \$100 per lot.
