SECTION 1: Definition of Terms

BDP: Used throughout this tariff to mean Business Discount Plan, Inc. unless clearly indicated otherwise by the text.

Company: Whenever used in this tariff, "Company" refers to BDP unless otherwise specified or clearly indicated by the context.

Customer: Any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity responsible for payment of telecommunications services and for complying with the terms and conditions of the Company's tariff.

Special Access Origination: Where originating access between the customer and the interexchange carrier is provided on dedicated circuits.

Switched Access Origination: Where originating access between the customer and the interexchange carrier is provided on local exchange company Feature Group circuits.

SECTION 2: Rules and Regulations

2.1 Undertaking of Company

PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION OF KENTUCKY

BDP's services and facilities are furnished for a two point telecommunications service. For the Company's headquarters are in Long Beach, California. BDP's service calls must be dialed and completed without the assistance of a Company operator.

2.2 Limitations

PURSUANT TO 807 KAR 50:1.

- 2.2.1 Service is offered subject to the availability of the necessary facilities or equipment, or both facilities and equipment, and subject to the provisions of this pariff.
- 2.2.2 BDP reserves the right to discontinue service when necessitated by conditions beyond its control, or when the Customer is using the service in violation of provisions of this tariff, or in violation of the law.
- 2.2.3 The Company does not undertake to transmit messages, but offers the use of its facilities when available, and will not be liable for errors in transmission or for failure to establish connection.
- 2.2.4 The Company offers intrastate and intraLATA interexchange service in combination with interstate long distance service. This tariff applies only to intrastate usage in the Commonwealth of Kentucky; the Company's FCC Tariff No. 1 on file with the Federal Communications Commission in Washington, D.C. governs interstate service provided by BDP.

2.3 Use

Services provided under this tariff may be used by the Customer for any lawful telecommunications purpose for which the service is technically suited.

2.4 Liability

- 2.4.1 The Company shall not be liable for claim or loss, expense or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage), for any interruption, delay, error, omission, or defect in any service, facility or transmission provided under this tariff, if caused by any person or entity other than the Company, by any malfunction of any service or facility provided by any other carrier, by an act of God, fire, war, civil disturbance, or act of government, or by any other cause beyond the Company's direct control.
- 2.4.2 The Company shall not be liable for, and shall be fully indemnified and held harmless by the Customer against any claim or loss, expense, or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage) for defamation, libel, slander, invasion, infringement of copyright or patent, unauthorized use of any trademark, tradename, or service mark, unfair competition, interference with or misappropriation or violation of any contract, proprietary or creative right, or any other injury to any person, property or entity arising out of the material, data, information, or other content revealed to, transmitted, or used by the Company under this tariff; or for any act or omission of the Customer; or for any personal injury or death of any person caused directly or indirectly by the installation, maintenance, location, condition, operation, failure, presence, use or removal of equipment or wiring provided by the Company, if not directly caused by negligence of the Company.

2.4 Liability (continued)

- 2.4.3 No agent or employee of any other carrier shall be deemed to be an agent or employee of the Company.
- 2.4.4 The Company shall not be liable for any defacement of or damages to the premises of a Customer resulting from the furnishing of service which is not the direct result of the Company's negligence.
- 2.4.5 The Company's liability, if any, for its willful misconduct is not limited by this tariff. With respect to any other claim or suit, by a Customer or by any others, for damages associated with the installation, provision, termination, maintenance, repair or restoration of interstate long distance service, the Company's liability, if any, shall not exceed an amount equal to the initial period charge provided for under this tariff for the call for the period during which the call was affected.

2.5 Terminal Equipment

The Company's facilities and service may be used with or terminated in terminal equipment or communications systems such as a PBX, key system, single line telephone or pay telephone. Such terminal equipment shall be furnished and maintained at the expense of the Customer, except as otherwise provided. The Customer is responsible for all costs at his or her premises, including personnel, wiring, electrical power, and the like, incurred in the use of the Company's service. When such terminal equipment is used, the equipment shall comply with the generally accepted minimum protective criteria standards of the telecommunications industry.

2.6 Payment for Service

- 2.6.1 The Customer is responsible for payment of all charges for service furnished to the Customer.
- 2.6.2 Notice of dispute must be received by BDP in writing within 30 days after the billing invoice is issued, or the invoice shall be considered correct and binding upon the Customer.

2.7 Taxes

All applicable taxes, fees, charges, exactions, or the like which must be paid to any governmental authority; state, local, municipal, or otherwise, for the provision of telecommunications services and which, pursuant to the rules and regulations governing such applicable taxes, fees, charges, exactions or the like, may be charged directly to the Customer will be separately stated on customer's bill and collected from the Customer.

SECTION 3: Description of Service

3.1 Product Description

BDP is a resale common carrier providing intrastate long distance telephone service to Customers for their direct transmission and reception of voice, data, and other types of communications.

- 3.1.1 Each Customer is charged individually for each call placed through the Carrier.
- 3.1.2 Each Customer is also charged a monthly access fee.
- 3.1.3 BDP offers several different rate plans. See Section 4: Rates.
- 3.1.4 Rates vary by calling plan, mileage bands, time of day, and call duration.
- 3.1.5 Minimum monthly commitment levels under the applicant's rate plan apply to combined intrastate and interstate usage.

3.2 Timing of Calls

Long distance usage charges are based on the actual usage of BDP's network. Chargeable time begins when a connection is established between the calling station and the called station and ends when the network connection is released. BDP will determine call commencement and completion by signal from the local telephone company.

- 3.2.1 Minimum billed call duration and billing increments differ between rate plans.
- 3.2.2 Usage is measured and rounded up to the next billing increment.
- 3.2.3 There is no billing applied for incomplete calls.

3.3 Rate Periods
