Re: Merger of Centennial Communications, Corp. into AT&T Corp.

Dear Mr. Derouen:

Consistent with prior Orders of the Commission, this letter is to notify the Kentucky Public Service Commission that on or about December 31, 2015, Centennial Communications Corp. ("Centennial") will be merged into AT&T Corp. Centennial has no Kentucky operations or customers. Following the transaction, AT&T Corp. will be the surviving entity. This is entirely an internal corporate reorganization, and it will have no impact on customers' rates, terms, or conditions of service.

AT&T Corp. is authorized by the Commission to operate as a CLEC and an IXC. AT&T Corp.'s principal place of business is located at One AT&T Way, Bedminster, New Jersey 07921. AT&T Corp. is organized under the laws of the state of New York and is a wholly owned subsidiary of AT&T Inc.

Centennial is a holding company organized under the laws of the state of Delaware. Centennial's principal place of business is located at 1025 Lenox Park Boulevard, NE, Atlanta, Georgia 30319. Centennial is a wholly owned subsidiary of AT&T Inc. Centennial has no Kentucky operations. This transaction will be effective on December 31, 2015. On January 1, 2016, Centennial will merge into AT&T Corp.

The transaction is part of an internal reorganization intended to simplify the corporate structures within the AT&T family of companies. There will be no change in the ultimate ownership of the merged companies, which will remain with AT&T Inc. Moreover, the reorganization will have no impact on customers' rates, terms, or conditions of service.
