# Church is a high school pep rally

Way back in the day, way back before high school basketball had a three-point shot, way back when I was in high school my high school had an outstanding basketball team. We were a large school playing the best schools in the state of Ohio.

In my junior year we went to the final four losing in the first round to the defending at state champions.

My senior year was full of anticipation. Everyone expected the team to do better, not just the final four, but a state championship! If my memory serves me correctly, we had only lost one game all season. Our first game of sectionals was against a team that had only won one game all season. Well, our championship run ended the first game of sectionals as we were at the wrong end of a massive upset.

During those days, it seemed like we had a pep rally every Friday.

As a minister, I have chosen to be in church a lot. The adage, "Once a week and twice on Sunday" is literally my minimum church schedule.

In my lifetime, I have experienced a lot of church services and a lot of high school pep rallies. Over the years, many church services have evolved into by all appearances, nothing more than a high school pep rally.

As you enter and throughout the ceremony the band (aka the worship team) plays blood pumping music.

Cheerleaders (aka worship leaders and/or dancing praise teams) perform acrobatic dancing moves to the crowd's delight. At some point, the cheerleaders will get the crowd involved. In high school, this is usually something like - give me a T, give me

an E, give me an A, give me an M, what do you got? TEAM! In the church, it results in singing, lifted hands, clapping and swaying back and forth.

When the coach (aka the Pastor) approaches the microphone, he will praise each player on the team, tell the crowd of the struggles of basketball, and proclaim that our team can overcome any obstacle and return victorious.

Sermons in the church go like this - Start out with praise, either to the Lord or individuals, or both. Talk about difficulties, get the people to think you understand their problems. Mention that Christ gives victory, and we can overcome all obstacles.

When the coach is done speaking, the band erupts into the school's fight song, and everyone files

out with a new level of excitement that will usually disappear somewhere on the trip home.

Thousands of church services are spitting images of a pep rally. The music gets everyone excited; a speaker will get people thinking good about themselves with some praise to them and the Lord. The excitement reaches a crescendo as the Pastor proclaims victory in Jesus, walks off stage, and the worship team breaks out into toe tapping sounds of praise. A level of excitement is within the people that dissipates long before the next church service.

Before accusations come in that I do not have to music, let me say this - music is a vital part of worship. I wish every church had every musical instrument ever created at their disposal for every service.

A problem with many churches today is the be-

lief that worship consists of only (or a vast amount of) music. Singing to God is worship, but not all worship is music. Reading our Bibles, telling someone about Christ, prayer, helping someone in need, shedding a tear for the lost, obedience to God's Word, and many other things are all worship. Much of worship is not done in a church, it is done in our homes, at work, wherever we may be. Worship is something that should be a constant in a Christian's life, not just when the praise and worship team starts strumming the bass guitar.

Pep rally sermons are also a problem. Yes, people do need a boost from time to time, but preachers do need to stomp on people's toes occasionally as well.

Paul tells Timothy preaching should be "to the subverting of the hearers" (2 Timothy 2:14). Sub-

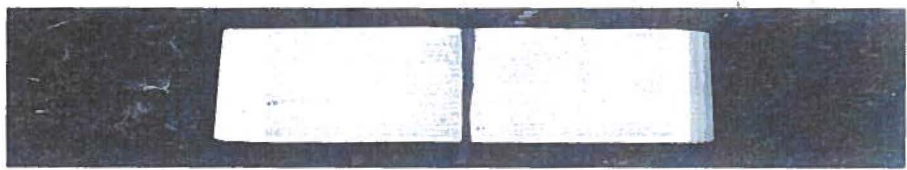
verting means to overturn or overthrow. Think of this: the Apostle is telling the young preacher that his sermons should change people, make a difference in who they are. Hearing "God loves you, have a victorious work!" Sunday after Sunday does not do that. Within a few hours, the excitement of the pep rally has worn off. The words of the coach (aka Pastor) has riled up the emotions, but left no lasting effect.

The high school pep rally and church service appear to be identical, only the topic has changed from basketball to Jesus.

# Will the rapture be that big of an event?

The rapture, as Christians call it, is the Biblical prophecy of Jesus appearing in the sky and calling all the real Christians home to heaven. Those Christians who have passed away since Christ's resurrection will also be resurrected and acquire their eternal bodies. Those Christians who are alive when the rapture comes will appear, to those left behind on earth, to vanish into thin air, as they are taken up (raptured) off by Christ. The living Christians will also receive their resurrected bodies at this time. It all sounds like a lot, but from finish to end will take the wink of an eye.

Many Bible verses describe, or at least allude to, this future event. The two most recognized passages are 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18, Preacher's Point

"For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God; and the dead in Christ shall rise

first. Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air; and so shall we ever be with the Lord. Wherefore comfort one another with these words," and 1 Corinthians 15:52. "In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump; for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed."

The rapture has been portrayed in books and movies, preached about from pulpits, and written about in newspapers.

The consensus is the rapture will plunge the world into utter chaos as those left behind deal with this catastrophic event. Hundreds of millions of people vanish over the planet in less than a second, some will be in bed, some eating lunch, others will be sitting down to relax at the end of a workday. Millions of traffic accidents because of cars left with no drivers. Plane crashes all over the planet because aircraft suddenly become pilotless. Fires break out as planes crash into residential areas — more house fires start when cooking pots are left unattended because homes are void of inhabitants. The ensuing chaos rages out of control as many emergency personnel is no longer with us.

Have in the streets, terror in homes as loved ones have vanished, confusion in every corner of the globe as people look for answers. Does a nation have a new superweapon? Have the extraterrestrials decided to start harvesting humanity? Is what is going on man made or coming from God? Does God even exist? If He does, what is He doing? Why would God do this? When the rapture comes will it be this chaotic or will it be nearly unnoticed?

Consider these passages: In the Sermon on the Mount, talking about salvation, Jesus says, "few there be that find it" (Matthew 7:14).

Jesus later asked the question, "Laid, are there few that be saved?"

His response, "Strive to enter in at the strait gate; for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in and shall not be able" (Luke 13:24-24).

Even though the number of the people of Israel will be as the sand of the sea, only a remnant will be saved (Romans 9:27).

Christ, in talking about God avenging His children, asks if He will find any faith at all when He returns, Luke 18:7-8, "And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them? I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?"

Hundreds of millions raptured out? Maybe only millions? Dare we even consider that it may be less?

What I am trying to get people to consider is — will there be so many people raptured off this planet to cause the ensuing chaos we expect?

The fewer people that leave, the less chaos the event will cause.

Depending on the source, the estimated number of Christians in the world is between two and five billion. Christ did say there would be some tares among the wheat (Matthew 13:21-30, 36-43). Therefore, we know not ex-

actly how many people will be raptured. The Bible also mentions that there will be people who, from all outward appearances, belong to God. Still, the truth is God "never knows" them (Matthew 7:21-23).

In describing the condition of the church when the rapture occurs, Jesus finds an organization that — because of apathy, makes God sick to His stomach. He also sees a church relying on wealth and is arrogant. If that is not enough, Christ is located on the outside pleading to be let in (Revelation 3:14-22).

When it comes to our current lives, maybe Christians should consider some soul-searching in light of Jesus' question "Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?"

## Kentucky House, Senate recognize Sunrise for 150 years of service

FRANKFORT (KT) — Sunrise Children's Services continues to receive accolades as they celebrate their 150th anniversary.

The organization was recognized on the floors of the Kentucky House and Senate this week. Sunrise provides services for abused and neglected children and at-risk families, currently caring for 1,000 children in state care.

Rep. David Meade, R-Lynch, introduced the citation in the House. "They have done great things for children in our foster

care system in Kentucky," he said.

Sen. Whitney Westfield, R-Crofton, called for the resolution in the Senate. He reflected on the impact Sunrise has made in the lives of so many children and families during the past 150 years. "I think about each child's life they've made a difference in and each family they've touched," he said. "The difference they've made in those lives is incalculable."

"This is important because it says the state needs and recognizes faith-based organizations like Sunrise to work with Kentucky's most vulnerable children," said

Dale Suttles, president of Sunrise.

"It says that the state recognizes the hard work of dedicated staff that work long hours for little pay and their efforts are greatly appreciated."

A portion of the Sunrises work is financially supported by the Kentucky Baptist Convention. Todd Gray, KBC executive director and trustee said, "Kentucky Baptist churches that fund ministry and missions through the Co-operators Program are collectively grateful that a portion of those funds go to help children move from a place of harm to a place of safety where they can receive

gospel care and have a shot at a great life."

Suttles echoes the importance of the partnership with the commonwealth.

"We are grateful and thankful to partner with the Cabinet for Children and Families. The employees within the cabinet have such a difficult job and it really never ends."

He says they see trying to help carry the burden of state workers as a part of their work. "We are grateful that the ministries of Sunrise can help ease the burden on these extremely dedicated state employees."

The organization was found-

ed on June 30, 1897 by a group of ladies from Walnut Street Baptist Church in Louisville to care for children suffering dire consequences following the U.S. Civil War.

"We are simply thankful to serve, to help children be loved and to learn to love. To make a difference and in some cases, be the difference. Being able to partner to serve Kentucky's most vulnerable to us is absolutely the highest of calling," Suttles said. "This is where I could have us, and we would not have it any other way. We can't wait to see what happens in our next 150 years."
