Mr. Hinton,

With regard to the discrepancy between the 20 percent (to \$3.97) versus the request for an increase of 15 percent (to \$3.81), we discussed the matter with the two Districts and decided to go with a lower increase. With regard to whether the Central City retail customers will have an increase of 15 percent the same as the wholesale customers. This will be done thru Ordinance (which is completed but not adopted until the second reading which will take place on the 2nd Wednesday in August prior to the proposed increases). I can send a copy of the proposed ordinance if you need it or I can send the adopted ordinance after the 2nd Wednesday in August or both if you need them. If there are any other items that you need or questions that you have, please contact me. Thanks for your assistance with this matter.

- Explain the discrepancy between the "Central City Water Rate Analysis" showing an increase of 20 percent (to \$3.97) to the tariff and notice showing an increase of 15 percent (to \$3.81). Did Central City just decide to go with a lower increase?
- Explain whether the rates charged to Central City's retail customers will also be increased by the same percentage (15%) the wholesale rates are proposed to increase.
