**RE: Withdrawal from Wireline Consumer Long Distance Market**

Dear Mr. Derouen:

Sprint Communications Company L.P. (“Sprint”) hereby notifies the Kentucky Public Service Commission of its intention to discontinue its provision of wireline consumer long-distance services and associated features. The specific Sprint wireline consumer long-distance services and associated features being discontinued are Message Telecommunications Service (*i.e.*, 1+ long distance) (“MTS”), FÖNCARD, Directory Assistance, and Operator Service (collectively, the “Sprint Services”),<sup>1</sup> as well as all consumer pricing plans associated with the Sprint Services.<sup>2</sup>

In response to changing market conditions, Sprint has decided to terminate its provision of the Sprint Services. At this time, Sprint plans to discontinue its provision of the Sprint

<sup>2</sup> Sprint is the Telecommunications Relay Service (“TRS”) contractor in some jurisdictions. Under this arrangement, Sprint offers Sprint Casual Caller TRS interexchange service to TRS users that are not PICed to a carrier. Sprint is not seeking to discontinue Casual Caller service to TRS system users; rather, Sprint will continue to provide Casual Caller service to TRS system users in states where Sprint is the TRS service provider.

Services to its remaining customers effective September 19, 2015, or as soon thereafter as the necessary regulatory approvals are obtained. The proposed discontinuance will not result in material harm to the affected customers because they easily can obtain alternative services from other wireline interexchange carriers. Customers also may purchase substitute long-distance services and features from wireless carriers such as Sprint or from a host of other alternative providers such as interconnected voice over Internet protocol providers.

Sprint provides the following information as a courtesy to the Commission:

1. Name and Address of Carrier: Sprint Communications Company L.P. is located at 6200 Sprint Parkway, Overland Park, Kansas 66251.
2. Date of Planned Service Discontinuance: Sprint plans to discontinue its provision of the Sprint Services described above effective September 19, 2015, or as soon thereafter as approval in this case can be obtained.
3. Points of Geographic Areas of Service Affected: Sprint proposes to discontinue the provision of the Sprint Services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.<sup>3</sup>
4. Brief Description of Type of Service Affected: The Sprint Services affected by this discontinuance include all MTS, operator, FÖNCARD, and Directory Assistance services and features provided to Sprint consumers, with the exception of Casual Caller services provided to TRS users in states where Sprint holds the TRS service provider contract.<sup>4</sup>
5. Brief Description of the Dates and Methods of Notice to All Affected Customers: Sprint provided written notice, by first class mail, to its affected subscribers between June 15, 2015 and June 19, 2015. A sample copy of the notice letter provided to customers is attached hereto as Attachment A. Sprint also provided notice to the Federal Communications Commission of its intentions, and, pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, provided a copy of that notice to the governors and state commissions in each of states and territories. A copy of that notice is being sent to this Commission under separate cover.
6. Brief Description of Number of Customers Affected: The most recent information available to Sprint is that Sprint has 1,301 residential customers who are presubscribed to Sprint for the Sprint Services in Kentucky.<sup>5</sup>

The public convenience and necessity will not be adversely affected by the discontinuance of the Sprint Services and features in question. All customers have been



**IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING DISCONTINUANCE OF  
SPRINT WIRELINE CONSUMER LONG DISTANCE SERVICES**

**Account Number:**

On September 15, 2015, or as soon thereafter as the necessary regulatory approvals can be obtained, Sprint Communications Company L.P. ("Sprint") will no longer provide Sprint wireline consumer long distance services and associated features in the each of the 50 United States, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The specific Sprint wireline consumer long distance services and associated features being discontinued include all domestic and international 1+ dialing from pre-subscribed accounts and casual caller accounts, as well as Operator Services, Directory Assistance, Directory Assistance Calling, FÖNCARD, 9-1-1 Telecommunications Services and all consumer pricing plans associated with the services listed above.

Due to changing market conditions, Sprint has determined that it should discontinue the Sprint wireline consumer long distance services and associated features described above. This discontinuance impacts all of your Sprint 1+ dialed calls. If you choose to have a pre-subscribed long distance carrier, you will need to transition your service by September 15, 2015. **In order to do so, you will need to choose another long distance service provider.** Note that a new service provider may require approximately two weeks to provision service to you. As a result, we strongly recommend that you select a provider ***no later than*** August 15, 2015. If you are not certain of your options for obtaining replacement pre-subscribed long distance service, **you should contact your local telephone service provider and ask which carriers are accepting pre-subscribed customers.** Sprint will no longer carry any consumer wireline long-distance calls (both interstate and intrastate) after September 15, 2015. This discontinuance does not impact any Sprint wireless services that you have.

Sprint has notified the Federal Communications Commission of its proposed discontinuance of service. The FCC will normally authorize this proposed discontinuance of service (or reduction or impairment) unless it is shown that customers would be unable to receive service or a reasonable substitute from another carrier or that the public convenience and necessity is otherwise adversely affected. If you wish to object, you should file your comments as soon as possible, but no later than 15 days after the Commission releases public notice of the proposed discontinuance. You may file your comments electronically through the FCC's Electronic Comment Filing System using the docket number established in the Commission's public notice for this proceeding, or you may address them to the Federal Communications Commission, Wireline Competition Bureau, Competition Policy

We encourage you to select a new long distance provider, by contacting your local telephone company, as soon as possible. Sprint does not have the ability to select another provider for you.
